towards the football trip at the end of the year they can be pleased with their efforts. Matt provided a great message to all the players present, consider the consequences and every player and supporter should be a leader in ensuring that drink driving does not occur within the club.

SAPOL's road safety program objectives are to Increase the knowledge and skills of all road users in road safety, Influence attitudes and change behaviours, Reduce the number and severity of road crashes, Create awareness of the 'Fatal Five', Speeding, Drink and Drug Driving, Distractions, Seatbelt, Dangerous Road Users and Reinforce positive attitudes towards road behaviour.

SAPOL acknowledges the main causes of crashes and highlights these within its road safety education presentations. These are stated as priorities for both SAPOL and MAC.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW



Two players who attended the South Augusta Adelaide reunion were George Kaisler (left) and Andy Coleman (right). George played for the club in 1976/1977 and was a Police officer in the town. Souths have never been able to secure too many Police officers and most are sign sealed and delivered before they even come to town, we hope to change that in the future and well done to these lads to make the move. George and along with other officers Don and Lachie Barrett have also played for the club over the years. George has now retired and after he left Port Augusta in 1977 played in other country leagues, later to umpire over 700 games

in the county including Whyalla and the Riverland and receiving merit wards along the way.

Andy Coleman to the right in the picture was a teacher who came to town and he won the Fairest and



best for the club in 1976 after a few years at the club from 1976-1978. Andy had previously played for South Adelaide and was a speedy wingman and on baller during his time at the club. He is now retired as well and lives in the Adelaide area. It was great to see them both there. Another couple who attended were Rex and Shirley Fountain, pictured here. Rex played for the club in 1962/63 after a stint in the South Adelaide reserves. Both have been avid and long suffering South Adelaide supporters all of their life. Rex's cousin Brian Fountain was a champion at Souths having won the fairest and best 3 times including 1949 and 1950 and a mail medal the club in 1953. Brian

tragically was hit by a car and died in the 1960's. It's great that the new honour board at the club goes back to when we started in 1912 so that we can honour this champion of the club.
