Player from the Past

Name: Eamon Power, Address: PO Box 33, Strathalbyn, SA 5255, Phone number: 0409 363 844 I came to Port Augusta from Adelaide in early 1978, having grown up in Norwood. In Adelaide, I played Amateur League football with Old Ignatians (a founding member of the club), as well as Gaelic Football, representing SA several times.

I started in Pt Augusta as a youth worker, and, when that scheme folded later I 1978, got a couple of week's casual work with 5AU. 22 months later (I think they just forgot to tell me to go after 2 weeks!), I resigned and returned to teaching, my original career, in 1981, at Pt Augusta High School.

In my "lengthy" playing career with South Augusta, I actually played one match in the B Grade, the first round in my only season in 1978 (work got in the way in subsequent years). What happened was that I only arrived in Port Augusta in March that year, so missed a lot of the pre-season training. I trained with the Bs, then missed selection for the first round. I understood why, but I felt I was fit enough and perhaps good enough to make the side, so, after discussions with coach Dave Shillabeer and A Grade coach Pat Hynes, Dave said to bring along my gear to the match anyway (probably in case anyone couldn't make it on the day). When he announced in the changerooms that I was going to lead the rucks, I thought I'd made a big mistake in saying I was ready to

play! However, when I got out on the ground, I found that the opposition obviously had forgotten to bring any ruckmen, so I had a good day.

I came down to earth in a big way the next weekend, promoted to the A's and coming up against some real SGL ruckmen and followers. Keen to stay in the side, I turned myself into a Backman, and enjoyed the rest of the season, in particular partnering with Ian Rodgers across the last line of defence.

In 1982, my wife, Gaynor, and I travelled Europe for 11 months in a VW Kombi campervan. Returning to Australia, in January 1983 we moved to Macclesfield in the Adelaide Hills for a couple of years, before settling in Strathalbyn, where we've lived since 1985.

By that time, I'd retired from Aussie Rules, concentrating on Gaelic Football, but the lure of the leather and the smell of the liniment enticed me back in the late 1980s to the greatest game in the world when some locals in Strath, Victor Harbor and surrounding areas decided to form the South Coast Roosters (in the new SA Superules league), playing in the same guernseys as South Augusta - it was obviously fate! I finally retired from active service after I turned 50, having twice represented South Australia at national carnivals and suffered one snapped Achilles tendon. My football involvement these days is limited to watching the Crows, and occasional attendance at Norwood matches and Strathalbyn Roosters games (again, same guernsey!).

Regarding Chris Pelle, he and his wife, Carol, have been living in Strathalbyn for quite a number of years - Chris is teaching in the primary sector at the local Eastern Fleurieu School in the town. He and I meet each Sunday morning with another mate for breakfast at a local café. One thing Chris has over me is that he played in a premiership side for South Augusta (though I tell him it was my efforts in '78 that laid the foundations for the '83 win!).
