## Football Report

Since preseason-proper began on January 14th both numbers on the track and the standard of training has continued to be very positive. The weather has been unusually kind to us so far and there is a real positive vibe among the group. The main emphasis has been short skill-focussed drills and intense circuit work based on game-like fitness elements - no road runs. Dex and I decided to slot an extra session into early preseason this year also, with Jake and Daniel Collins taking a "core strength" workout with the intention of minimising the risk of soft tissue injuries in the months ahead. They put a lot of thought into these sessions, it was well supported and we'd like to thank them for agreeing to run it.

There is no doubt a stronger determination among the continuing players after last years disappointing finals campaign and the addition of a number of new faces has further freshened the atmosphere. I wouldn't call James Boles a new face (in terms of youthfulness) but he is one of our non-playing recruits and has been helping out with training and the players respond to his unique methods well. Aaron "Debo" Daley has offered to help out Walshy and his team of trainers this year. He is a good bloke, a New South Welshman working in town and has a background in rugby league as a player and a trainer. Since meeting him at the Pastoral and subsequently recruiting him to the club I hope Leanne sees the benefits of such fact finding missions!



In terms of the people who get the job done on the field, the players, we feel fortunate to be able to welcome a number of new players, returning players and Colts graduates to the Senior List. While we look likely to lose about 10 players from last years overall list, (7 of whom played some A grade football), we have gained players who will add depth and balance to both squads and slot into the Club culture positively - a crucial aspect when recruiting. I hope to be able to write a short football bio on all the new players in the next additions of the newsletter when clearances etc have been ratified and they have become official Bulldogs.



Over February 21st/22nd about 25 players took part in this year's preseason camp at Melrose. It was a no frills camp with our accommodation being in swags on a showground shed floor but there weren't too many complaints. Split into 3 teams they competed wholeheartedly in the rigorous sessions in the heat.
