ADDITIONAL UPDATE FROM SANFL

As many of you would have seen, young South Australian footballer Tai Martin-Page was involved in an on-field incident playing for the Darwin Buffalos in the NTFL. The incident left Tai with two dislocated vertebrae which resulted in the loss of feeling from the chest down. Tai has been transferred to the spinal rehabilitation unit from the ICU after undergoing surgery at Royal Perth Hospital. It is difficult to predict when a final prognosis on his condition will be known, but regardless there is expected to be a long road ahead. Tai grew up at Laura in the Mid North and plays with the Southern Flinders Club. Tai also represented our Northern Zone at 2017 State Country Championships.

A Go Fund Me page has been set up by Tai's family to help raise funds for medical treatment and to support with travel and accommodation costs. Fundraising is well on the way to the target of \$100,000.
