I have to thank Messrs Keith Kelly and Gary Kernahan for developing this outstanding ability of mine, Keith for the encouragement and Gary for the 'catsquealers' and "headbonker" when I used to get tired.

I played football for 2 more years before the 'hamster' forced my retirement. In 1988 I decided to help a mate, by playing in the first side he coached. Like the Aldinga Sharks, we were hammered every week and we even had our plight shared on the SAFM radio over the time. I'm glad my mate decided to leave at the end of the year (or someone else decided) as it gave me a chance to play another year with some success.

In 1989 I went back to my old footy club Morphettville Park who won the A Grade final that year, unfortunately without me. The dreaded hamster took me half way through the season, and even 3 legged dogs were speeding pass me by then.



I look fondly at the great, fun times we had at Southy's and have thoroughly enjoyed the recent catch ups with the great people of the north.






#### Allan Cram in the middle in 1985 and now



# FLASHBACKS 1964- 50 YEARS AGO


This continues the segment on the players of the 1964 premiership side and this month we concentrate on the centreline

Geoff Fullerton- wing: Life member Geoff Fullerton played 137 league games for South's from 1961 to 1972 and was a regular in Port Augusta representative sides. Upon his retirement due to injuries he acted as runner and selector and also PAFL selector. Geoff has also been involved in the Racing industry for many years and ran a successful butcher shop.




Jimmy Anderson-Centre: Jimmy Anderson played in the Centre and was amongst the best players in the Grand Final. He was recruited from Darwin for the year and they even flew him back from Darwin for the big game. He played in the Darwin league from 1954 - 1971 and was a legend in that league. The following is a profile of his NT football history. "A player who epitomised the courage and strength associated with his club's logo through the 1950's and 60's was Darwin Buffalo Jimmy Anderson. He played in nine grand finals for the Buffs, winning three premierships in 1962/63, 1963/64 and 1967/68. A tough on-baller, Anderson won the club Best and Fairest three times in 1957/58, 1961/62 and 1963/64, was twice runner up in the Nichols Medal in 1961/62 and 1963/64 and finished third in 1957/58.

Represented the NT five times from 1966 to 1969 and also played 2 seasons for WAFL Club West Perth. He coached the Buffaloes in 1960/61 and Wanderers in 1971/72. He was also a Buffaloes Life Member and NTFL Player Life Member. A true NTFL star of yesteryear and a worthy inductee into the AFLNT Hall of Fame."



**Billy Baker- wing:** The speedy wingman played over 150 games for the club between 1959 to 1972 and is a life member. Bill is also a life member of the Cricket club having captained a Premiership in 3 grades A, B and C Grade. Bill has also served on the Committee for many years and has been a sponsor of the club over a long period.
