In the Under 18s, players to impress have been Harry Holland, Dareyan Solomon, Daniel Taylor, Trent Ritter and Dylan Testro who have featured the most in the best players.



Congratulation to a few of the players that have achieved game milestones in the last few weeks including Simon Brusnahan (pictured) who played 150 A grade and Club games recently together with Sam Maule 50 club games and Scott Kroemer 50 club games. Simon Brusnahan played A Grade at the age of 15 and with a setback of a knee reconstruction missing around 1-2 seasons he has been able to play in both the 2006 and 2012 A Grade premierships with distinction. Simon generally plays at fullback and enjoys the challenge of the best opposition goal kickers each week. Well done Simon.

Other milestones worth noting have been Jak Kerin's 50 A grade matches and after a stint in Canberra and NSW he now has a fulltime job at Alinta energy and will be a regular on the field this season and in the future if all goes well.

Other include Tyson Black, closing in on 100 club about round 8, Tom Bolitho 50 B

about round 7 and Liam Dodd 50 B about round 12.

Looks as though Alan Margatich may have retired this year although we always hold up hope that the champion ruckman may make a return. Alan played senior football for the club from 1998 to 2014 and played in the 2000 and 2012 A Grade premiership as ruckman which in itself is a great achievement with the time period between success. Other than playing for South's he played for Christian Brothers Old Scholars in Adelaide and it was great to get him back at the club through employment. Alan was high up in the Madigan Medal votes in 2012 and won the Fairest and Best that year in 2012 plus in 2001. A leader and tireless worker on the field with high standards and if he has retired we wish him best for the future.

PLAYER MEDICAL FORMS

All SAFC players should have been issued with a 2015 Medical Form that included questions regarding personal Ambulance Cover. Sixty three forms have been returned to date leaving another fifty or so to come back. Sixteen of them <u>DO NOT</u> have ambulance cover. As explained on the form ambulance cover is \$76 for singles* and \$151 for families* (as at 21/1/15). A trip from Central Oval to the PA Hospital could cost a lot more than that. Thus SAFC encourages all players to be covered and <u>WILL CALL AN AMBULANCE IF CONSIDERED NECESSARY FOR PLAYER SAFETY, EVEN IF THAT PLAYER IS NOT COVERED. THE PLAYER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COST.</u> *see www.saambulance.com.au for up to date costs and application details.
