"The volunteers that are here at present time build on the legacy of the women and men that have gone before us so that we've got something to pass on to the next generation of volunteers," Mr Kerin said. "No club in country footy would exist without volunteers and we're 99.9 per cent volunteers, ranging from the president, down to the committees, coaches, parents, scorers, timekeepers and bar staff. "There's a little bit of downtime for some people during the summer time, but for some of the people it is a 12-month role here."

South Augusta is a pokies-free club, increasing the importance of fundraising. No club in country footy would exist without volunteers. - South Augusta Football Operations Manager Michael Kerin

Wendy Black, who has been involved with the club for 12 years, helped reinvent South's Ladies Committee 10 years ago, which organises fundraising events such as the annual Red and White Ball. Wendy said passion is the most important trait for a volunteer. "You make new friendships and you help support the club. You work as a team together," she said.

Ricky Gill first joined the Bulldogs about 40 years ago as a player, before becoming entrenched in the club when his sons began playing junior football. Ricky now spends about seven hours on weekends working as a timekeeper for the club, but would not have it any other way. "I do it because I love the atmosphere at the club and the friendships. It's an enjoyable job I think," he said.

- South were expected to field its strongest team for many seasons after picking up Ron Curyer from South Adelaide.
- Teams revert to names of West, South and Centrals but the Association rules that players would be zoned to even out competition. South are able to obtain its players from Conway town and the extension of Flinders Terrace.
- Players who represent Port Augusta in 1937 from South include Fred Copley, B McGuffie, Bert Lehman and Hube Zanker.
- South have 130 members for the year, a record and its financial position is sound.
- · Ladies committee: Mrs. G Scrivener, Mrs. H Corbett, I McCartney, HTM Luke.
- The club holds regular dance every Thursday evening at the Parish hall.
- All matches are at Central oval and the Ladies committee sells afternoon tea to raise money at matches. The South President is HT Luke.
