Football Committee Report

Hello everybody! Training has been going well, with good numbers having fronted, although for some it could be on a more regular basis so we (they) aren't caught short in the coming weeks. We have ramped up the ball work as we prepare for trial games. We have a trial game on March 28^{th} against Christian Brothers Old Collegians, a Div 4 team from Adelaide, and it will take place at ETSA Oval. 3pm starting time and we plan to put both and A grade and B grade team on the field. A fortnight later we travel to Kimba for another trial for both grades. (April 11). In addition, we plan to have a "scratch match" on Friday April 17^{th} . It would be great to see as many supporters as possible at these events as it does give the players a motivational boost and provides an opportunity to meet our new players. Speaking of which, here is some information about a number of those currently in the mix for initial A grade selection.

Simon "Chinny" George has come to the club from BMWFC and is a creative, skillful player who can play anywhere but most likely will feature on the ball and forward. He is well credentialed having won a North Adelaide U/19 Best and Fairest some years ago and a Northern Areas A grade Mail Medal also. His father Greg also played for South sometime last Century.

Tom Carling is another ex BMW player from Quorn. He actually began his A grade career at Quorn Wolves prior to playing for BMW. He is a smaller player who is quick on his feet and also in disposing of the ball. Tom is a midfielder who can play inside or outside and can give us some real spark going forward also.

Josh Green comes to us from Birdwood Football Club in the Adelaide Hills. He played regular A grade at Birdwood, playing a number of defensive roles, as well as on the wing. Daniel Roach works with our Major Sponsor All States Scaffolding and is a former A grade Captain at Plympton Football Club. He is a strongly built midfielder who we hope will win plenty of the ball. Another attribute of Roachy's is his voice and direction as well as other "team first" traits. He is a good bloke and is fitting in well.

Chris Johnston comes to us via Central Augusta and North Adelaide and is a very well balanced and skillful player who is quick across the grass. He may be limited in the games he can play for us this season due to recent work away but we are hoping to see him running around in the red and white asab.

Connor Harrison is a player who I see as a real dark horse. He hasn't been committed to football for the past few seasons but played A grade at Central Augusta before that. He is as fit as I have seen him and is super keen to play A grade for South Augusta this year. Connor is a mid-sized player who can probably play anywhere, other than key positions, and has good football smarts.

Ty Stringer is still a bit of an unknown still but played a handful of A grade games for South Whyalla last year and trains keenly. Like his father Freddy he is a strongly built player and has a raking left foot kick. He is currently going out with our team manager's daughter also.

Jack Magarey, the former club junior, has returned to the club after a number of years with St Ignatians in Adelaide. He is an unassuming type who has good hands and a reliable kick. We are keen to keep an eye on in coming trials to see if he is a contender for Round 1 A grade selection. The 14th April 2015 is being flagged as the possible date for this course - will be an evening course from 6:00pm - 9:00pm. Jordan Crabtree can bring the facilitator and course back to the region if the demand is there and clubs are willing to send representatives to attend the training.

The session is delivered is a 3 hour course and is <u>SPORT</u> specific. A lot of coaches/team managers within your club have probably completed mandated notification training through their employment but this course goes in to more sport situations, such as demonstrating techniques, picking up and dropping off children etc, and I would highly recommend ALL attending, especially your clubs Child Safe Officer.

It is also essential that <u>ALL</u> coaches and team managers have a current police check prior to coaching children within your clubs/associations.

I cannot stress enough the importance of your club being up to date and aware of your requirements to provide a child safe environment to your players, members and families and this is also a legal requirement for your club to operate.
