2016 SENIOR COACHES ANNOUNCED

The South Augusta Management Committee recently announced the appointment of James Boles as it's A grade coach in 2016. James who currently holds the record for the most A Grade games in the SGL at 411 games and won the Madigan medal in 1982 plus over 5 fairest and best's for his former club Willsden. James also had a short stint at North Adelaide where he performed well and he has previously coached at Central Augusta and Willsden. - From this point, we really took it one week at a time. This seemed to take some of the pressure off and was the beginning of our journey to glory. We didn't only win 5, we won all remaining games of the minor round
- Strangely, after having backs to the wall, game after game our team's confidence grew and we did believe that we were worthy finals contenders Central Augusta was clearly the best team during the full year's B grade competition and was absolute favourites.
- I am sure that many of the boys remember reading the Transcontinental, who stated that the game before the A Grade final would be a non-event, with Centrals tipped to annihilate Southies who were lucky to be in the Granny after just managing to stumble into the finals.
- As is often the case, as Underdogs, we didn't seem to feel the pressure of expectation and had gained a lot of
 confidence winning the past 8 games. Grand Final day was very warm day and Rod invited us for a walk down
 Redbanks and I do remember the calming effect that walking by the water had. Today was our Final goal and
 the purpose for all of the year's hard work.
- We had a great start to the game, and everyone that day would say that Peter "Boof" Rivers was our Lion of the game. He was tireless and fearless and protected all of players who were sometimes at the end of rough house tactics. More importantly, we played once again, as an even team, as we had done all year. The last 5 minutes were special as I saw the smiles of my team mates knowing that we were going to be victorious. We felt like walking off before the siren, but knew we had to play it out.
