

CRAIG RITTER HONOURED (Courtesy of Transcontanentil Newspaper)

South Augusta stalwart Craig Ritter has been honoured for his long-serving dedication to junior football and his impressive track record.

Ritter's decorated coaching career was celebrated at the 2018 SANFL Coaching Awards at Adelaide Oval, earning the SANFL Service to Coaching Award.

The nine-time junior premiership-winning coach said the accolade came as a complete surprise.

"I love football and to be able to teach kids how to play the greatest game in the world, well that was all part of the long-term commitment," Ritter said about his two decades of coaching.

"I got roped into it by the club one night and then my boys started playing, so I continued on with them."

The one-club man first pulled on the red and white at the age of eight, beginning a lifelong devotion to the Bulldogs.

Ritter's coaching career commenced in 1996 with South Augusta's under 11 side, with whom he won his first flag two seasons later.

Fast forward to 2016, Ritter decided to retire from coaching with multiple premiership medals in U11, U13 and U15 to his name, while also having coached at U9 and U18 level.

Since then, he has been working as the club's Coaching Coordinator and the Seconds Team Manager. Ritter played a role in mentoring Seconds player-coach Marcus Gill, who was named the 2018 SGL Senior Coach of the Year after leading his team to premiership glory.

But when asked about the highlights of his coaching career, one memory stood out above the rest. In 2006, Ritter's undefeated premiership-winning U11 side featured both of his sons, Caleb and Trent.

Caleb is now South Augusta's club captain, while Trent is a key player for the Seconds.

"That was my best Grand Final. It was pretty special," Ritter said. "The boys went through undefeated and it was just a feather in our caps that both my sons were able to play in that premiership side."

Many of Ritter's junior players have gone on to become star footballers, including Madigan Medallist Aziel Stuart, and North Adelaide premiership winner and AFL Draft prospect Connor Rozee. He said one of the greatest joys about coaching juniors is watching young kids develop into quality

players.

In addition to his coaching commitments, Ritter took charge of the Colts' fundraising hot dog trailer, while also organising Grand Final banners.

Ritter thanked the South Augusta Football Club and his wife, Jackie, for nominating him for the award.

BLAST FROM THE PAST -REG RICHARDS



Travelling in the Flinders Ranges with a trainer last week and he said to me "last time I came to Port Augusta I came with my dad and we stayed with Reg Richards and tried to get him back to play for West Adelaide in 1962. Who is this Reg Richards I thought and asked around? Reg came to South Augusta from South Adelaide in 1962, working at ETSA after playing with the league team in Adelaide, he was a champion player in Adelaide, one of the youngest to play league. During his time at South Augusta in 1962 and 63 he won two A Grade Fairest and Best in the football, Coached the B Grade Football team to a Premiership in 1962 and captained the A Grade Cricket side in their first year when they won the Premiership and he took 5/51 in the Grand Final. Billy Baker says the champion player played at Centre half forward .Not a bad performance in 2 years at the club. Reg left for Adelaide in 1964 and missed out on the famous 1964 premiership but he certainly left an impression at the club and didn't go back to South Adelaide or West Adelaide, he played metropolitan football for his remaining years as he had had enough of the training required at league level.

In the A Grade final West were dismissed for 126 after a great bowling exhibition by South's, Dean Barry 4/49, Kym Mickan 3/27, Luke Snowden 2/13, Rodney Hodgson 0/9 and Graham woods 0/22. Unfortunately South batting collapsed when it came their turn to bat with them only making 72 and the pressure of the final got the better of them. Derek Edmead 16, David Shillabeer 1, Glen Flatman 11, Robert Rozee 0, Kym Mickan 26, to be our best performer on the day, Dean Barry 1, Luke Snowden 7, Graham Woods 2, Rodney Hodgson 1, best bowlers for West were Kevin McSporran 4/32, Greg McSporran 3/11 and Warren Johnson 2/28.

The Association President was Bruce Curtis and Dean Barry won the Association Bowling average with 27 wickets at 9.5 runs per wicket.

Kevin McSporran won the Association Batting Aggregate, Mick Foote the batting average and in the Bowling aggregate Barry Rimmer and Wayne Burton tied for the trophy.
