Congratulations to Ray Hanrahan and Robert Bowman who were inducted into the Port Augusta hall of Fame recently.

Ray Hanrahan played 181 games for the club with 167 goals, 51 games for West Torrens, played in the 1964 South A Grade premiership in the forward line finishing his career in the backlines. Ray Played in the 1967 A Grade losing Grand Final side, in 1973 he was the clubs Vice captain and Fairest and Best and in 1974 and he was Captain and made the Port Augusta Team of the year. In 1976 he was Seconds coach and in 1979 he was Senior colt's coach and league selector. In 1977 Ray coached Murraytown and they won their first premiership for 40 years and in 1978 they were runner-ups up and he wasn't appointed the next year, hard taskmasters. In 1985, 86 and 87 he was South Under 16s Coach and in 2003 he was appointed to the Port Augusta premiership.

Robert Bowman commenced his junior football with the club in 1965 and then started senior football in 1960. He played senior football until 1971 where he had amassed nearly 200 Senior games. He represented Port Augusta many times between 1966 and 1970 in both attack and defence. He was coach of the Under 15s side in 1965 and 1966 and coached the seconds in 1969 and 1970. Robert was on the Management Committee prior to 1972 when he became Assistant Secretary until 1978. He rejoined the Management Committee from 1983 to 1987. Robert has been on various committees since 2003 in a consultancy role and was Chairman of the Club centenary Committee from 2012 to 2014. Robert has given nearly 60 years of service to the club and he has joined his Father Harold into the Port Augusta Hall of Fame.
