BY HIS own admission, Rostrevor College Year 10 student Gary Warren is a quiet Port Augusta boy who prefers to let his football do the talking.

And after just three First XVIII matches, the 16-year-old footballer's performances are speaking for themselves

Warren, who models his game on Hawthorn's indigenous star Cyril Rioli, has kicked 13 goals, including a sevengoal haul on debut against St Peters on June 5.

- "It was amazing, especially to kick seven goals at a high level like this," he said.
- ``I got a lot of the ball and the bloke I was playing on said I was too guick for him.''

Rostrevor's scouts identified Warren during last year's SANFL under-15 state championships following a handful of standout performances for North Adelaide's junior country side.

In January, he joined the school's Indigenous Sporting Academy, which gives sports scholarships to indigenous students from all over Australia so they can complete Year 12.

He lives on campus with his good mates, fellow Aboriginal First XVIII players Keiffen Turner and Jordan Wilson and dozens of other students.

- ``I've grown up here I'm not a little kid no more. I had to learn to wash dishes and clean my own room, pull all your clothes out for washing on Sundays.
- ``Studies are going good. It's still a little bit hard but I'm getting through them.''

Warren said leaving his large, tight-knit family was difficult.

But to help him cope with homesickness, his mum Marsha has come down to watch some of his North Adelaide under-16 games and his uncle Aaron made it to his First XVIII debut.

``I go up there (to Port Augusta, when I can). I go visit my aunties and play with my little brothers.

``I always get nervous when I go home because I can't wait to see my family.''

Warren said he hoped to make North Adelaide's under-18 side next year, push for state selection and make a name for himself at Rostrevor - on and off the field.

- ``I want to be a leader for my family.
- ``I want my younger brothers to do what I do go to school and get a good education. I want to make Year 12 and finish it ... and I want to try and make AFL. My family would be so proud of me.''
