

In John's book he did say Ron was a big man, that was not true, he was a rover & wingman and of slight build. The book also states he did go on to play for South Adelaide. Ron didn't settle in Adelaide though he did play a few league games. Dean also mentioned the story of his Dads playing days when his wife convinced her mother to come and watch Ron play as he was a good player, unfortunately that day Rons shorts were ripped off and her mother was disgusted at seeing Ron running around with no shorts.
