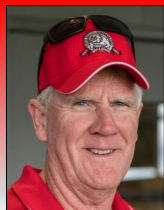

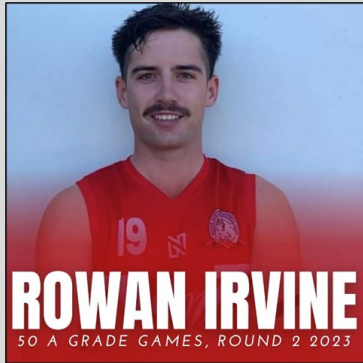

HONOURING ANZAC DAY

We honour those who fought and served in the armed forces in the World Wars together with peace keeping times.

William Arthur Anderson: Played for South Augusta 1919.

Frederick Albert Bartsch: Played for South Augusta 1919, Frederick enlisted on 27th July 1915, aged 21 and served as a Private in the 10th Battalion and was recommended for a Military Medal. During 3rd-4th September 1916, he worked continuously, keeping on when others were exhausted. He showed conspicuous courage and bravery. Not once, but repeatedly he attended to the wounded under heavy shellfire, and brought them safely out of it. His splendid example stimulated the other bearers and caused them to put forward fresh efforts, which finally resulted in the successful evacuation of all our wounded. He returned to Australia on 15th January 1919 and was awarded a Military Medal, 1914-15 Star, British War Medal and Victory Medal. Frederick played football at Souths on his return and died on 10th March 1951.



Thomas Robert Brennan: Played for South Augusta 1912 to 1913.

George Evan Morgan: Played for South Augusta 1925-1930.

Henry Jamer Everingham Parkinson: Played for South Augusta 1925.

Henry James Thomas Partridge: Played for South Augusta 1914 to 1916 and 1920.

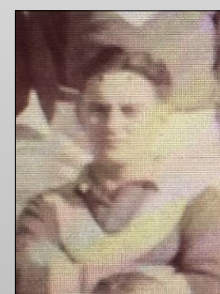
Edward Smoker: Played for South Augusta in 1930. Edward joined the Army as a Private from 1944 to 1946 when he enrolled in New Guinea.

Frank Woodforde: Played for South Augusta from the period 1941 to 1951. He served in the Armoured Regiment of the Army from August 1941 to March 1946 as a Private.

Eric Mortlock: Played for South Augusta from 1939 to 1941 and then enlisted in the Airforce from 1942 to 1945 as a leading Aircraftman.

Alec Merrill: Played for South Augusta in the period 1939 to 1947 and joined the Army from April 1944 to December 1946 as a Private.

Ken Higginson (pictured, right): Played for South Augusta from 1944 to 1955. During this time he was an Able Seaman on the HMS Lonsdale and was enlisted in the Navy from May 1945 to February 1947.



Maurie Hill: Played for South Augusta from 1950 to 1951.

Reg Flanagan: Played for South Augusta over the period 1934 to 1943.

Wayne Shepherd and Ray Kohler: Vietnam veterans include Wayne Shepherd (pictured, far left), who played in the 1972 B Grade Premiership playing for several years and then became a trainer and Ray Kohler (pictured, far right) who played for the club.

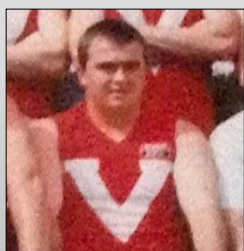


Cliff Grantham: Played for South Augusta from 1942 to 1949.



Harry Waterworth Senior: Harry and Colin Waterworth's father, Harry (pictured, left), who was a trainer at the club for several years was enlisted in the Navy in World War II, being involved with some close calls when he survived sinking ships that had been attacked.

Pat White: Father of past Catering Manager and Life Member Trevor White. Pat (pictured, right) was a Prisoner of War in World War II, working on the Burma Railway. Pat was a sponsor of the club for several years.



John Waterworth: John (pictured, left) played for Souths as a colt and many games in the seniors, playing in the 1995 B Grade Premiership. He joined the Airforce and served in Afghanistan for 6 months, and is currently still in service.

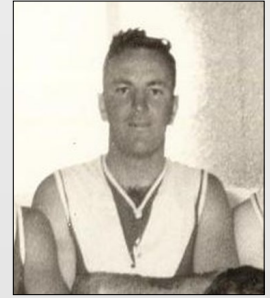

DRINKS VAN ON THE HILL PROJECT

The South Augusta Football Club plans to purchase a second-hand van (similar to that pictured below) to locate on the hill at Central Oval for use during the games. The van will allow spectators to purchase drinks at a better location, thus increasing revenue, with profits to go towards Football development. The project will also allow better access to people to refreshments at the local football.

The drinks van will also be used on big occasions such as Past Players and Officials Days, Family events during the year and can be loaned out to charity organisations.

The van will also provide an opportunity for spectators to meet on the hill, cheer on the team and be heard rather than behind the glass upstairs.

The Badcoe Medal is voted on by journalists and media personalities covering the match and is awarded to the player who best demonstrates the ANZAC spirit and qualities of skill, courage in adversity, self-sacrifice, teamwork and fair play during the game.

Major Peter Badcoe VC served in the Vietnam War and is the last South Australian to be awarded the Victoria Cross - the military's highest honour for bravery.

Connor had 32 possessions, seven marks and eight clearances to claim the win of the Peter Badcoe VC Medal with a total of 10 votes, followed by Dan Houston (9 votes) and forward Todd Marshall (5 votes).

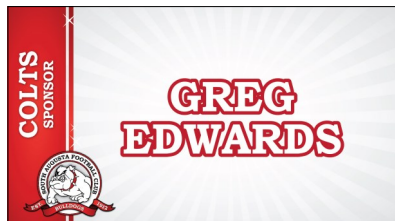
