Anzac Day Tribute—Round One

"Lest We Forget"

The SGL has had many men and women who have served our country both recently and in the past. The ANZAC Day match pays tribute to the sacrifice of the servicemen and women of Australia and celebrates the ANZAC spirit. Whilst no comparison is made between war and football, the game provides a platform to highlight the spirit of ANZAC, with its human qualities of courage, mateship, and sacrifice – qualities that are a part of our sense of national identity. The qualities that encompass the ANZAC spirit include sportsmanship, courage, selfless acts and/or team orientated acts. These four key criteria have been chosen as a tribute to the men and women who fought to ensure we are able to lead the comfortable lifestyle we live today, and to give us an opportunity to learn about the ANZAC's dedication and how to use these qualities in our everyday lives. We honour the many players from South Augusta how have been involved in the armed services and wartime service. One of these players was Fred Bartsch.



Fred Albert Bartsch: Played for South Augusta 1919.

Frederick enlisted on 27th July 1915, aged 21 and served as a Private. He served in the 10th Battalion and was recommended for a Military Medal. His online profile described "During 3rd/4th September 1916, he worked continuously, keeping on when others were exhausted. He showed conspicuous courage and bravery. Not once, but repeatedly he attended to the wounded under heavy shellfire and brought them safely out of it. His splendid example stimulated the other bearers and caused them to put forward fresh efforts, which finally resulted in the successful evacuation of all our wounded." He returned to Australia on 15th January 1919 and was awarded a Military Medal, 1914-15 Star, British War Medal and Victory Medal.




FOOTY FLASHBACKS

Scott Harris played junior football for the club before progressing to senior football and playing 17 A Grade games and 113 B Grade games for a total of 130 senior games.

Scotty should have played more A Grade football as he had great skills as a left footer, he was fast and elusive and an accurate kick for goal. Scott mainly played in the forward lines on the flank or on the ball.

He is a member of the 1985 B Grade Premiership side that celebrates its 40th anniversary this year and he also played in the 1991 A grade Grand final team that lost to Centrals.

Scott now lives in Adelaide and works as a carer, a job he enjoys and plans to continue for a few more years.



WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

When Corey Enright called out of the blue in September, Jared Rivers knew he wanted back in.

Four years after his time at North Melbourne ended just six months in due to COVID-19 cuts, the 40-year-old was ready to return to the AFL.

St Kilda felt right. Rivers ended his playing career with Enright at Geelong, adding 44 appearances in the hoops to the 150 games he played for Melbourne.

After starting his coaching journey at Collingwood, the Kangaroos were the next step in his progression. The pandemic changed those plans. Rivers ended up coaching Collegians in the amateurs, leading them to the A-Grade Premiership in 2023, before stepping back from coaching to focus on his day job as an account manager at TAB Corp.

Now he has reunited with Enright and dual Brownlow Medallist Robert Harvey, who he worked closely with at the Magpies.

"The way it all finished at North, it just sat there for a long time," Rivers said. "If I was ever going to get back into it, now is the time to do it. I worked my way up at Collingwood from development to VFL coach, then the North role came up as backs coach, finally got the job I wanted. Then six months into a two-year deal it completely crashed due to Covid, which I didn't see coming.

It was a really big shock for my wife and I, with young kids at the time, it was a really tough time. I probably got the passion back for it when I was coaching at Collegians because you are so hands on. You get to really teach it and coach it the way you want to. To win the Premiership was really rewarding. I felt like I got that real drive back for coaching, which I didn't think I would after North. I just wanted to see how I would go and if I didn't love it, I would have moved on to the next chapter.

My wife has been really supportive. She works fulltime as well, which is a challenge with three young kids, but she knew I still had the passion for it."

Rivers oversees the defence at Moorabbin. "Coming in, I've definitely felt that collaboration focus," Rivers said. "It's probably one of Ross' big things: we just all want to be on the same page and understand what we're trying to do. With that, you need everyone to buy in and understand what your role is.

We've got a young group, so the education side of it with the playing group has been really consistent throughout the whole pre-season. We give the boys a lot, but they seem to let it sink in and take it day by day. I feel like everyone is in synch.

Clearly Ross gives you your role and wants you to execute."





Gazza's Gossip

This month's newsletter Gary Kittel focuses on two families the Fox family and the Masters family.

Masters Family

The Masters family have been associated with South's during the 40's, 50's and early 60's.

Ron Masters was a member of the 1947,1949- and 1950-seconds Premierships. Ron was named in the best players in 1947 scores being South 3 – 9 to Central 3-3. Ron played for South from 1947-1954. After Ron retired, he became a trainer for years.



Brian (Joe) Masters (pictured) played football for South's from 1950 to 1960. In 1958 South finished third in a three-team competition South, Central and West, Brian was named in the best players.

Brian was selected in the Port Augusta squad to play against Whyalla in the tied game Port Augusta 26-13 Whyalla 25-19, Brian missed out on the final selection.

Brian Masters retired in 1960 with a Seconds Premiership scores South 9 goals – 7 behinds Central 5 Goals – 3 Behinds. Brian applied for a clearance which South's refused, Brian for the love of the game became a goal umpire for many years. For years the Masters family was a dedicated and long serving contributor of the South Augusta for many years.

Fox Family

Brian Fox arrived in Port Augusta in 1963 to take over a local newsagent. Brian previously played for the Norwood Football club where he played under Jack Oatey he captained and coached Norwood's Seconds side.

Brian became Colts coach at Souths and coached the Port Augusta Colts combined team in the Spencer Gulf Football league winning the Premiership and 5AU shield. Teams included Port Augusta, Port Pirie, and Whyalla.



In 1964 Brian captained the Second's with South losing that game by 3 points it was South's only loss for that season. Much to Brian's disappointment, he had never played in a winning Premiership team.

David Fox: David came up in the junior teams and played for South's in 1979 before concentrating on golf where he became a professional golfer and a talented golfer for the Port Augusta Golf Club winning a number of championships.



Peter Fox: Peter (pictured) played for South's from 1979-1987 playing 86 A Grade games and 91 B Grade games for a total of 177 senior games. Peter played in 1981 Premiership and was included in the best players and he also played in several B Grade Premierships in the early 1980's.

Darren Fox: Darren the youngest of the Fox Family came up through the Juniors. Darren played for a short time before he devoted his time as a trainer in the early 1980s, being involved in A and B Grade Premierships.

In closing the South Augusta held the Fox Family in the highest regard at all levels in our great football club.


