FOOTBALL REPORT

To date, 195 players have registered across all grades. This includes 26 girls, mostly thanks to Cameron and Jodie Reid.

After last week's win against the Lions, our A Grade are now in top position but if they wish to have a home final, they need to win the last two games against Central Augusta and Ports who have already proven they will not be pushovers. Best players as per Sporting Pulse this year include Kriston Thompson, Matt Downey, Darcy Kildea, Billy-Jo Russell, Gary Warren, Caleb Ritter, Lawrence Bradley-Brown and Craig Shirley. Clayton Milera has kicked 12 goals.

The B Grade lost their first game of the season last week, but still retain top position and should finish in the top two if they continue their form. The best performers so far include Dylan Barnett, Byron Taylor, Jake Collins and Stuart Beaton, who has also kicked 13 goals, providing someone to aim for in the forward line.

The Under 18s are in 4th position, two games ahead of bottom team West Augusta, and should feature in the finals. With just a small amount of improvement, they will be competitive in the finals; with several players being promoted to the A Grade recently providing opportunities for others to perform. Best players this year include Lenny Hoffman, Ethan Gade, Rex Waterworth and Ethan Reid; with William Newberry the shining light up forward with 9 goals.

The Under 15s will play in the finals with Props/Lions unable to field a team and although only winning one game from the first five, they have shown improvement each week. Those to perform well this season include Tyson Darley, Hudson Brazell, Maci Wilsdon and Beau Renshaw; with Tyson Darley leading the way with 10 goals so far.

The Under 13s have won four from the first seven games and are currently in second position on the ladder. Those to perform so far include Ethan Maloney, Ronan Coombe, Lewis Renshaw, Nate Munzer, Whalley Yates and Amelia De Bortoli; with Coheyn Patrick leading the way with 6 goals.

The Under 11s have a competitive team this year with best players including Zech Amos, Nate Lukich, Leo McInnis, James Heritage, Eddy Heron, Tait Digance and Addyson DiPaolo - a few well known Southie names there to continue the tradition. Leo McInnis is having a great season with 11 goals as well.

The Under 9s are enjoying an enjoyable season so far with coaches impressed with their improvement so far in the 3-team competition.

SGL NEWS

Please note some of the information below is yet to be ratified by the SGL Board.

- **FIRST AND SECOND SEMI FINALS**
Saturday 12th September /
Sunday 13th September
PRELIMINARY FINAL
Saturday 19th September
GRAND FINAL
Saturday 26th September - in Port Pirie if a Pirie side is in it or in Port Augusta if two Port Augusta sides play off
- COVID-19 restrictions increase markedly with crowds from 100 to 5000
- First three finals probably limited to 1000 crowd (+ players etc), paying at the gate as normal
- Grand Final probably limited to 1000 crowd (+ players etc), pre-sold through the clubs
- Clubs requested to gather names / phone numbers / number of tickets required for Grand Final over next few weeks* and to let SGL know how many tickets required by Sunday 6th September. Clubs may NOT get all requested tickets. In either case the 1000 figure means 1500 will miss out (based on 2019 attendance).
- Suggestion to play U15 / U18 / B Grade Grand Finals on Pirie West or ETSA Ovals at normal times which allows for a walk up crowd of up to 1000 to buy tickets at the gate. This is followed by the pre-sold A Grade Grand Final on Memorial or Central Ovals which allows a second crowd of up to 1000. People who want to attend both will have to buy two separate tickets. We have requested that B Grade be played at Memorial / Central Oval as the normal A Grade curtain raiser.

*Keep your eyes out for when we start to pre-sell Grand Final tickets

IMPORTANT

COVID-19 Update

Many of our members, players and supporters may not be aware of the hard work being done "behind the scenes" by staff and volunteers to ensure South Augusta Football Club is compliant with the ever-changing restrictions and requirements imposed by our State and Federal Governments, to ultimately keep EVERYONE safe and COVID-free.

The Management Committee has met several times in recent months and have faced some difficult decisions and matters relating to COVID-19 that have greatly impacted OUR club.

It is therefore somewhat disappointing to have issues relating to non-compliance of restrictions being brought to the attention of the Committee, and it is necessary for this timely reminder to be issued to ALL:

- Our Club can have penalties imposed, including loss of licence for non-adherence to these restrictions

- On Game Day, ONLY those listed on the team sheet may enter the change rooms

GAZZ'S GOSSIP

This month Gary Kittel covers the Kohler family and their role in the club, with Ray playing a role in the 1960 B Grade premiership that will be honoured this weekend. Ray Kohler played over 100 senior games between 1956 and 1969, playing in the 1960, 1961 and 1962 B Grade premierships.

Ray's father Norm Kohler played for South Augusta in the 1940's and Ray's brother Geoff Kohler played in the seconds in the 1960s. Geoff is heavily involved with the RSL and can often be heard saying the "Ode of Remembrance" at the funerals of veterans. Norm Kohler's wife Carrie Kohler also served on the South Augusta Ladies' Committee for several years.



Norm was a local builder; Ray served his apprenticeship with Norm; and Geoff owned Woodforde Motors which was a service station on what was previously the main road through Port Augusta, on Stirling Road (not far from where Spencer Marine is now).

Norm Kohler ended up a Commodore at the Port Augusta Yacht Club and Ray and Geoff were local champions at yachting, representing the State in the Lightweight Sharpies Australian Championships - a great sporting family involved with both football and yachting in the town.

Some of the older players commented "It wouldn't have happened in Reidy's day," referring to past South Augusta Coach John Reid, who did not take kindly to marriages during the footy season.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

- NEIL BROOK -

My first teaching appointment was at Port Augusta Central (1965 – 1968) where I met “Wiggy Mitchell”, one of the most dedicated and demanding teachers whom I had the pleasure of working with. Four very enjoyable years ensued.

As a sports enthusiast I did some research and found that South Augusta Football Club was highly regarded and thus decided to join them to further my football career. That was a decision that I have never regretted.

Prior to moving to the country I had played with South Adelaide in the colts and seconds, being lucky enough to play at state level in both junior and senior colts before being promoted to the seconds in my second year as a senior colt.

I quickly found myself playing alongside many talented and committed country players who made me feel very welcome from day one. Initially I was regarded as a utility player but over the time I played in a variety of positions. During those times there were many league players who were playing in the SGL. Trevor Searle, Ray Hanrahan, Micky Vanvacas, Dick Oakey and opposition players such as Jimmy Deane and Bob Hammond come to mind. The standard of play and players was very impressive.

Whilst we were regarded as a successful team we were unable to reach the pinnacle in any of the years with 1967 being the closest when won our way into the Grand Final only to lose by 8 points. In 1968 I was injured early in the season, having damaged a cruciate ligament necessitating a cartilage removal and that meant missing the rest of the season.

One of my greatest contributions to South Augusta was a phone call that I made to the club about some extremely talented footballers who I had played with and had moved from Bute to Port Augusta and the need for the club to sign them. They were the Lamshed boys who played in the 70's. Namely Trevor, Brenton and Rodney. Brenton won two Best and Fairests and being runner up in the other year losing by one vote to Andy Coleman. He also captained the team in two of those years. Rodney was one of the most determined footballers winning a Best and Fairest as well. They were a very talented football family whose skills and ability greatly enhanced South Augusta.

At the end of 1968 I transferred to Kadina Primary but lived nearby in the small rural township of Bute who played in the Yorke Peninsula League. I played ten seasons mainly at Centre Half-forward and Full Forward, kicking 879 goals whilst winning the Yorke Valley leading goalkicker on six occasions and kicking more than 100 goals in four consecutive years. During that time at Bute I played in 8 grand finals, winning in 1969, 1973 and again in 1978 when I was coaching.

Although Bute was a small town they were an extremely competitive team in a variety of sports. As well as playing football, I was a member of the local cricket team that played in nine grand finals winning six flags. This was and is an outstanding record for such a small rural community. During that time they were also successful in other sports as well.

My teaching career took me to Kadina, then Kulpara and Wirrabara as Principal before moving to Adelaide in 1984. I was appointed Executive Officer of SAPSASA, a position I held for almost 20 years before taking an early retirement package. I then became a playground consultant for 14 years. My sporting involvement is now the sedate sport of lawn bowls.

I look back on my years at South Augusta very fondly and wish the club continued success. It was a great time to be living and playing sport in such a supportive community. I would also wish those players that I had the pleasure of playing with all the best and would welcome any contact, should they find themselves in Adelaide wanting to catch up over a coffee.

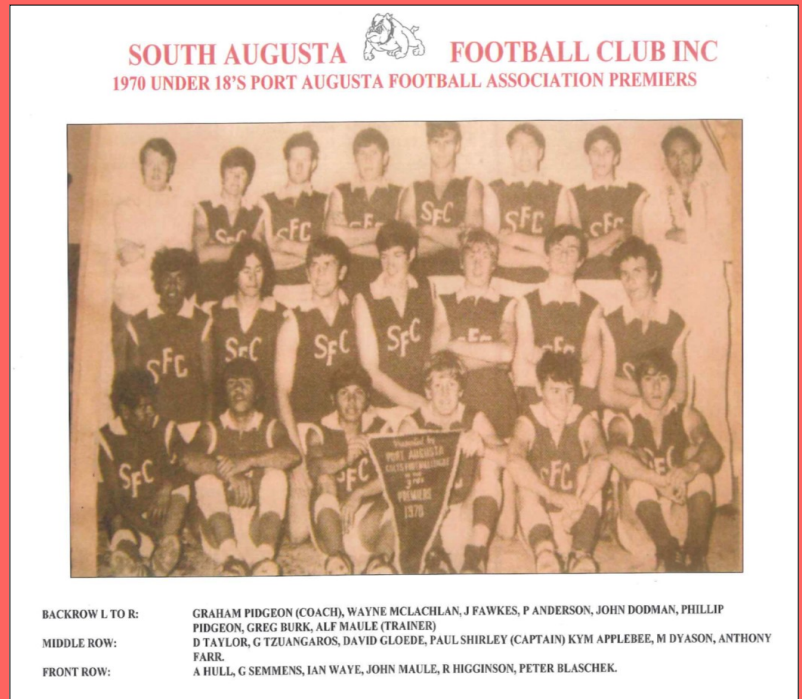
