"Cutting down the Districts and restructuring at any level would negatively impact participation of public and private school kids around the state and would ultimately see SAPSASA disintegrate," Mr Brook said. 

FOOTBALL REPORT

The A Grade currently sit in second place with eight wins, five losses and one draw. We are now in a good position to defend our Premiership and win an SGL record six A Grade Premierships in a row. Players mentioned in the Top 5 players in Sporting Pulse so far include Aziel Stuart 9 times, Kriston Thompson and Ethan Reid 8 times, Caleb Ritter 6 times and Darcy Kildea 5 times. Billy-Jo Russell has 26 goals after a great haul of 8 against Lions.

Kriston Thompson was selected in the State Country Championships Team at the recent carnival at Victor Harbor. He was awarded the Barry Robran Medal for Best Player from Northern Zone. Keep a look out for Kriston and other South players in the Madigan Medal count this weekend.

The B Grade are in third spot with nine wins and five losses. Players most mentioned in the best players include Mitchell French 7 times, Marcus Kerin and Brett Jones 6 times, and Byron Taylor 5 times. The most goals kicked are by Tyron Waye with 13, Brett Jones 12 and Connor McMillan and Cohen Bosence making contributions. They have a chance if they work well as a team in the finals and last week's win against Lions will provide some confidence.

The Under 18s are currently in fourth spot with six wins and eight losses. Last week's win against Lions has given them a chance for the final four. Players most mentioned in the Top 5 players include Micheal Collins 8 times, followed by Harry Bolitho and Hudson Brazell 7 times. William Newbery has kicked 39 goals followed by Lenny Hoffman with 16.

The Under 15s are sitting in fourth spot with five wins and nine losses. They will retain fourth spot and play in the finals. Players most mentioned in the best players include Ronan Coombe 9 times; Robert Naylon, Ethan Maloney and Edward Hannes 6 times. Joe Clancy has kicked 34 goals.

The Under 13s won the Premiership last Friday night after an excellent win over Centrals. Congratulations to Kurt Reynolds, Dwayne Crombie, Zac Blinman and their support team and the players. Best players most mentioned in Sporting Pulse include Coheyn Patrick 8 times (Coheyn also won Best on Ground in the Grand Final), Zech Amos and Campbell Crombie 6 times, and Oscar Williams 4 times. Coheyn kicked 13 goals and Zech finished with 12 (records not updated from the Grand Final).

Jak Kerin played his 100th senior game recently (now on 67 A Grade games and 34 B Grade games). He is a product of the South Augusta juniors, having played in several junior premierships, including the 2008 Under 18s premiership, under coach Ryan Struck. Jak moved to Adelaide after the power station closed to pursue study and work as an electrician. He returned to the club this year after a stint at Bute, and last year with Old Ignatius in Adelaide. He has played with Elijah Highfold in the ruck, having played in the backlines and forward lines in previous years.

Jak won the Best First Year Player award in 2010 and played in the 2010 A Grade Grand Final loss to Central. Jak played in the 2015 and 2018 B Grade Premierships. This year he and

James Weir have made the weekly trip to play for the club and we thank them for this tremendous effort. We especially congratulate Jak on this great achievement which coincidentally now takes him past his old man's 100 game tally before he retired. The club offers it condolences at this sad time to Tanya and Alan, Troy and Corrine, Dean and Joanne, Martin and Melissa, and grandsons Jake and Daniel and families.



Annie "Tupp" McKerlie recently passed away, aged 96. Tupp was the wife of past player and 1966 Club President Jeff McKerlie. Annie was on the Ladies Committee for many years and was a great supporter of the club, often coming to games to watch the team perform. She was a Life member of Souths and together with Betty Snowden they were regulars at the club, even having their own table reserved. Tupp was also a founding member of the Stirling North Progress Association, Life Member of Cooinda Club, and had service medals for Meals on Wheels, Probus Club, Flinders Hotel Social Club and

the Port Augusta Racing Club, to name a few - a great community service volunteer. The Club offers its condolences to the McKerlie family at this sad time.

Vicki Fullerton indicates that the date for the Footy Tips final show is being organised, with a possibility of having it the day after the AFL final as the SGL final will now be on the same day... but still to be confirmed.

South Augusta recently had a draw in the A Grade match against Sollies. This has not happened much over the years and our researcher Harry Waterworth has indicated that Souths have had four draws in the last 60 years:

1998 - South 12.6 to West 11.12, (18/4/98) / 2001 - South 18.7 to Port 17.13 (19/5/2001) 2010 - South 6.9 to Lions 6.9 (11/7/2010) / 2021 - South 10.16 to Sollies 11.10 (14/8/21)

From 1961 to 2010, South have played 905 games with 482 wins, 420 losses, 3 draws. We have kicked 11,682 goals and had 10,844 goals kicked against us. Harry has also found out that in the 12 team competition between 1961 to 1966, South A Grade played 88 games, winning 46 and losing 42. Souths' highest score in that period was 32.17 vs Willsden in 1964 and its lowest score was 0.8 vs West Whyalla in 1963. The total score from 1961 to 1966 was 955 goals and 1018 points for, and 905 goals and 996 points against. It was of course Premiers in 1964.

Bait was ready, lines were hooked, the Groves cruiser was full of diesel and Port Augusta had put on a great day for the lads who had travelled to the reunion. What more could you ask for? The lads from Adelaide had recovered from the Sunday breakfast cooked by Kernas (pictured, right) and Harry, and were ready for a a great day of fishing on the waters as they left the boat ramp at 8.30am Monday. Hynesy was asked to get the batter ready for fish and chips that night and when they returned it didn't take long to count the proceeds... not a razoo! Lucky the Western Hotel was open when they returned to the boat ramp that afternoon. Nevertheless, a good day on the water with many stories told. Couttsy was blamed for declining an invite and his local knowledge would have been invaluable for the best spots.





South Augusta junior colt Connor Rozee has come into some great form leading into the finals and has played no small part in the success of the team so far. We wish him all the best in the Preliminary Final and hopefully a Grand Final to come.

It was great to see Billy Baker at the club (pictured, left) on the Friday night of the reunion with a few of the 1964 Premiership team in attendance to have a few beers with him for his 80th birthday. 1981 A Grade coach John Reid was also there, and they recalled how well Billy did on his bets with the opposition that day in 1981!

Jazza s Gossip

This month Gary discusses three past players who played for the club around the 1920s and 1930s - Clarrie Dunn, Fred Copley and Rex McRae.

Clarrie Dunn: Clarrie played for the club from 1928 to 1933 and was a member of the 1928 A Grade Premiership side who won 4.7 to 3.8, with Clarrie being amongst the best players.

Clarrie and wife Kath, (who was a sister to another Life Member Sue Kittel), were part of a well-known family in the Port Augusta community. They had three boys - Richard, Lance and Frank. All boys were involved in sport including basketball, bowls, football and track cycling. Frank Dunn, the youngest, excelled in billiards, snooker and eight ball. Clarrie was a brother-in-law to Life Member and Hall of Fame member Les Kittel. Richard and Marg Dunn have a friendship with South Augusta 1964 Premiership player and champion Mick Vanvacas and his wife Lesley.

Fred Copley: Fred played for Souths from 1937 to 1939. He was part of the 1938 A Grade Premiership and was named in the best players. Fred and wife Myrtle were parents to two boys and two girls who were all involved with sport, with son Mason being Life Member and A and B Grade player at West Augusta. Another son Ivor played in West Augusta seconds and Lesley and Merrill played netball. All were members of the swimming club. Fred was also part of the boxing club. His greatest achievement was the years he gave to the Port Augusta Fire Brigade and he was a member of the 1939 A Grade Premiership side that won by 6 goals. He became a commentator for football on local Port Augusta radio 5AU and he did an excellent job.

Rex McRae: Rex played for Souths from 1938 to 1941 and he was the father to Dale and Jill. Dale is a Life Member of the West Augusta Football Club. Jill and husband Len Mayo are Life Members of the Port Augusta Tennis Association and are related to Vin Jackson, also a past player at Souths. Rex was part of the 1938 and 1939 A Grade Premierships before South suffered with lack of players due to the war, losing the 1940 Final. Despite winning only one game, they made the Final in 1941 but lost to Central 13.8 to 4.6.

Clarrie Dunn, Rex McRae and Fred Copley all had outstanding football careers with South and were part of our early history, making us the mighty club we are today.
