



Players still alive from that team include Norm (Nipper) Reed, Bob Miller (who sent his apologies) and Bill Applebee, a great club stalwart. Kevin Markham who played A Grade that year lives in Adelaide.



Cazza's Gossip

One of the highlights of the long and arduous football season is the end of season trip. There are many stories, some that can be shared and some that will remain with the players on these trips. Here's a small story to enjoy.

South were on their footy trip to a place unknown and Wally McMannus and Arthur Applebee were sharing a room. We don't know what they had been up to earlier in the evening but Arthur had gone to bed before Wally and was lying there with the light on when Wally came into the room. Arthur called out "Put the light out Wally" Wally promptly picked up a shoe and threw it at the light smashing it to bits. "Satisfied now Arthur?" said Wally.

Life member and gastronomical legend, Charlie Huddlestone was well known to like his food and at twenty plus stone (over 150kgs) his eating habits were infamous around the district. Ted Brown recalled an end of season trip to Eudunda some seventy years ago. The local club boasted a bloke they reckoned could out-eat Charlie in a competition. Bets were laid and the eating was on. It is reported that Charlie won by twelve pasties and a side of lamb.

On another trip to Port Lincoln the host team arranged a welcome dinner for the South players and officials. The Lincoln boys had heard about Charlies liking for food. On Sunday morning prior to the club departing Port Lincoln, the host club put on a farewell BBQ. After the BBQ they presented Charlie with a full leg of lamb between two pieces of bread. Rumour has it that Charlie ate the lot on the homeward trip.

Two of South Augusta's most ardent supporters during the 1950s and 1960s were Charlie Huddleston and Bobby McInnis. Charlie was as big as Bobby was small, but Bobby was the far more vocal one and in particular was very loud and free with his advice to umpires. The two friends rarely missed a game and both served on the Management Committee for many years. They always occupied the front seat of the bus for the journey to Port Pirie or Whyalla. On one such trip to Whyalla in the early 1960s, the bus' accelerator cable broke about ten kilometres from Memorial Oval. The bus had a long pointed bonnet and forage front mudguards and it was decided that someone would have to sit on the mudguard and work the accelerator by hand, with driver giving him signals when he needed to change gears or slow down. It's not known if Bobby volunteered or if he was pressured into it but because he was the smallest and probably the most expendable passenger onboard. He got the job as they needed to get moving in order to get the players to the game. There was Bobby, precariously

perched on the mudguard, working the cable in conjunction with the driver's signals. It was fortunate that he had consumed just the right amount of beer. Too little and he wouldn't have had the courage, and too much and he might have fallen off. Everything was going fine with Bobby happily waving to passing motorists and as his confidence grew, he had the bus going faster and faster. He was in control now and didn't notice the driver indicating that it was time to slow down and make a left hand turn to Memorial Oval. The bus was almost through Whyalla before the driver finally got Bobby's attention and make the necessary turns to get everyone safely to the oval.
