PORT AUGUSTA CITY COUNCIL'S CENTRAL OVAL TURF UPGRADE PROJECT

Port Augusta City Council's Central Oval turf upgrade project is on track and is meeting budget guidelines. "Sub-surface drainage and irrigation have both commenced and will be completed soon. Importation of sand has also commenced, this will assist with the growing function of the laid turf" Brenton Daw, Central Oval's Turf Project Manager stated.

Mr Daryl Sellar, an Agronomist from Living Turf who is assisting with the project is pleased with the progress and the event potential the oval will have into the future. "Progress on the redevelopment of the playing surface at Central Oval is very pleasing, with the project timelines being met and the construction process going very well."

"Once completed, the redeveloped surface will provide the Port Augusta community with an asset that will be suitable for local, regional and national sport of all standards, as well as other non-sport community events, regardless of weather. The new profile and irrigation system will be better equipped to meet the specific demands of all needs, as Council staff will be able to manage recovery of the turf specifically where it is needed through better control of applied irrigation and the recycled water that will be used". Mr Sellar stated.

The new turf is due to be laid mid-January 2020 in the form of Maxi-Sods, and Central Oval will be able to be used for the 2020 sporting season. Council will be monitoring progress of the turf quality with the assistance of Mr Sellar.

The upgrade of the oval will enable higher level sporting events to be hosted including SANFL, AFL JLT (Country Round) games. Port Augusta will also be in a position to attract the AFLW and Women's Soccer league to showcase female sports in the region.

There will be some increased traffic and heavy vehicles entering and exiting the oval throughout December. The internal carpark at the oval will be closed for approximately 10 days while sand is being delivered, while the car park near Braddock Oval is still accessible.

LEGENDARY TALES FROM THE PAST - PORT PIRIE GAMES

Organising games in Port Pirie have sometimes been a nightmare for coaches with teams selected on Thursday never the same of those who turn up at the game. In the 1980s South prepared a plate of meats and salads for players to eat either before or after the game, although some, including Kernas, preferred the large saveloys served by the Sollies ladies!

At one game in the late 1980's against Risdon, the coach asked the team manager to get the guernseys as the game was due to start in 40 minutes. "I thought you brought them" he said, only to realise that the guernseys had been left back in Port Augusta. The A Grade guernseys were not available as they were also coming later with the team A quick call to another team manager. (Props, who were not playing that day) meant that the B Grade team borrowed the Props uniforms and for the first time the team ran out in the red and crimson colours until the South guernseys came at three-quarter time - the first time the club had played in different colours for many years.

Another time, a team visit back at Sollies for drinks after the game, resulted in two people on the bus being left behind by mistake at the club which meant that Franko Farr and Dusty Miller had to hitchhike home, walking past the Tinman Roadhouse before anyone picked them up to take them back to Port Augusta!



CRICKET UPDATE

The A Grade are off to a good start with five wins and one loss from the first six games and are currently in top position. Will Waterworth has 159 runs and Craig Shirley 144 after five games; and Craig Shirley has 14 wickets and Ben Trewartha 10 wickets.

The two B Grade teams are in first and third position on the table, with Kurt Reynolds on 14 wickets and Stuart Beaton 10 wickets. Best with the bat so far include old timers Anthony Freebairn with 268 runs (including 101) and Wes Yates 238 runs.

South A Grade captain Greg Shirley will be taking his cricket and football to the east Arnhem Lands in the NT after Christmas, with a transfer through the Clontarf Foundation, we wish him and his girlfriend Georgie Hewett all the best on their new adventure. Georgie will be missed from the Bulldogs twilight tennis team.

Congratulations to Chris Robinson who played his first game of A Grade cricket, against Centrals, on the weekend. He took the valuable wicket of Toby Baxter and conceded only 12 runs off 10 overs which, together with being in his first A Grade win, is a great start to his senior career.

BASKETBALL UPDATE
