WILL BOLITHO FUNDRAISER - UPDATE

The Port Augusta community has rallied behind Will Bolitho and the South Augusta Football Club in the wake of the young player's devastating injury. Will suffered a career ending injury during South's A Grade preliminary final against Port, breaking his back in the midst of a tackle.

A charity football match on the weekend saw South Augusta alumni and Emergency Service/Clontarf Foundation strap on their boots to raise funds for Will's recovery. A competitive four quarters, in less than favourable conditions, saw South (44) defeat Emergency Services/Clontarf (43) by just one point. Fittingly, it was Will's dad Bluey who kicked the winning goal for South Augusta right on the final siren.

South Augusta Football Club President Michael Kerin praised participants. "The match was quite competitive, especially with the young legs of the Clontarf lads making good use of the wind in the first quarter," he said. "Like in the recent SGL Grand Final South rebounded in the second quarter only this time to fall behind in the third quarter and to come home strongly with the wind in the last quarter."

South legends Pat Hynes and Gary Kernahan were appointed coaches of South and the Emergency Services/Clontarf teams respectively. Mind games between the two started early and continued throughout the day with Hynes getting the upper-hand.

Sophie Glamuzina starred in the forward line for South, finishing with three goals. Ex South junior, Port Magpies and Adelaide Crows player Bryan Beinke returned to show glimpses of why he achieved his AFL success. Golly Harrison also came out of retirement to umpire the match.

Mr Kerin said the club is overwhelmed, but not surprised by the generosity of the community.

The football match was the perfect backdrop for the carnival atmosphere with games for the kids, food stalls and a visit from Santa. "Local businesses have been very supportive with donations and prizes for our raffle," he said. "Local media have given us great support as well. "Fellow SGL clubs have shown the true spirit of sport via their generous fundraising at their own clubs which totals \$2200. Tickets in our monster five-part raffle have been selling very well with some still to be sold."

Many thanks to our SGL on-field foes who have proven the true spirit of sport. On field enemies are off field comrades.

Sollies and Port have contributed a total of \$2200 to the Will Bolitho Fundraiser. Port raised \$400 and have taken 10 raffle tickets (worth \$1000). Sollies couldn't make the match day due to their postponed AGM been held at that same time, followed by a players meeting to organise their very welcome 2021 comeback. They managed to raise \$800 including \$200 won by the players on a horse in the Sollies blue and white colours which beat a horse in the red and white colours! An omen for next season?

FAMILIES OF BULLDOG LAND

This month we focus on the Kittel family that has been involved with the club for over 75 years - from 1945 when Les Kittel became involved with Club Management and Administration from 1948-1976 (a total of 26 years), Club Patron from 1983-1990, Vice President for 4 years in 1959, 1961, 1971 and 1972; and President for 7 years in various years between 1956-70, including the famous 1964 A Grade Premiership year. Les was also Secretary in 1950 and 1951 and generously participated in fundraising, being involved with the Committee that purchased land and built the club in Fern Street. Les was heavily involved with recruiting players. He played no small part in bringing some top class players in to win the club's first premiership for 22 years in 1964. Somehow he found time to run his own electrical business also.

Les' wife Sue was involved with the club for the same time and worked actively on the Ladies Committee and was widely acknowledged for supplying meals to South footballers at her home. Sue worked for many years at all functions held at the club. Les has sons who played at Souths including Gary who played 187 games between 1959-1971, playing in Seconds Premiership in 1960-1962 and 1965, and three runner ups in 1959, 1964 and 1967. He was leading Seconds goalkicker in 1961 and Captain of the Seconds in 1969. Gary's other brothers Gerald and Phillip Kittel also played football for Souths and Phillip's son Stephen played in the 1993 A Grade Premiership. His other son Anthony is Managing Director of international company Redarc Electronics.
