PORT AUGUSTA COUNCIL AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS


You may recall the 3-peat of Port Augusta Council Community Events of the Year we have won on the past three Australia Days (pictured, right).

SANFL Players Registration Payment of \$20 seniors / \$15 juniors must be paid when registering. Every player at every club in SA will have to pay this so it is basically no pay, no play. This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It does NOT replace club membership.



ISAAC KEELER PICKED IN THE AFL DRAFT BY ST KILDA



Congratulations to former South Augusta Football Club player Isaac Keeler, who was picked up by Saint Kilda in the recent draft.

Isaac grew up in Port Augusta playing for Souths and then went to Adelaide where he has been playing for North Adelaide since he was 15. He is the son of 2000 A Grade Premiership player Keiron Keeler who is also a Madigan Medallist and club Fairest and Best in 1999 and 2000.

Isaac spoke to ABC radio's Chook Harslett and said getting drafted means a lot, "not just for myself, but mostly for my family and friends knowing that they have been there and been supportive the whole time and knowing my dream has come true now." He said any kids that have the dream of becoming a professional athlete need to put in the work and the dream will be realised. "You need to persevere and be persistent, keep working hard because I find that once you work hard the rewards will pay off."

CONNOR ROZEE WINS PORT ADELAIDE FAIREST AND BEST

Ex-South Augusta junior Connor Rozee's move to the midfield this year has seen him win the John Cahill Medal as Port Adelaide's Best and Fairest for the 2022 season.

The 22-year-old was an unsurprising winner after a breakout campaign that earned him a first AFL All-Australian blazer.

Having started his AFL career in the forward line, Rozee went to a new level this year after being moved into the midfield. His shift into the centre part-way through Port's round five match against Carlton led to an upswing in the Power's fortunes this year although he couldn't quite steer them into the finals after they had lost their opening five games.

Rozee was the standout vote-getter and finished 30 votes clear of Travis Boak in second spot.

Rozee also claimed the Coaches' Award as the most improved player.

Sazza's Gossip

This month Gazza concentrates on Harry Kernahan, one of the greatest players to have come through South Augusta juniors to go on to a career with Glenelg and South Australia, and moving on to club administration at a higher level.


Harry's highlights for Glenelg were playing from 1959-1965 and 1969-1971, a total of 176 games and 149 goals. He was leading goalkicker in 1960 with 29 goals, and Captain from 1964-1965. Harry was assistant coach in 1971 and 1972 and represented South Australia ten times, becoming a great of Glenelg and inducted into the Glenelg Hall of Fame.

Other career highlights were 14 years as Secretary at Glenelg and General Manager from 1973-1987. Harry Kernahan led Glenelg's rucks during the 1960s and at the start of Neil Kerley's golden era. He was a prominent and capable administrator as well and was at the helm as the club evolved to meet the financial demands of a football club. Fellow SA Footy legend Neil Kerley described Harry as "unique and we enjoyed a great relationship as teammates, opponents and as a player coach. He was a great competitor, not the most skilful but had a heart like a lion". Harry played for South Augusta from 1953-1956 and other members of the Kernahan family who played for South are Gary Kernahan 1982-2003, Life Member and Hall of Fame; Jim Kernahan 1950-1952; Todd Kernahan 2003-2011 and Billie Kernahan is a trainer and Life Member.

Harry played for South Augusta under coach Bob Bishop and he also coached South Whyalla to Premierships. The Kernahan family is regarded as one of the greats of the South Augusta Football Club.



VALE 1964 PREMIERSHIP PLAYER WALLY REDDAWAY


It is with great sadness the club advises of the passing of Tim "Wally" Reddaway, aged 79. Wally played in our 1964 A Grade Premiership which was described as one of its greatest victories in the 12-team competition. Wally was recruited in 1964 and just played the one season. He was known as a tough on-ball player or ruck. He certainly made an impression when he came to the club. He went on to be instrumental in having the Tee Tree Gully Club enter the Amateur League in 1988. His vision for this club was implemented successfully. Wally's love for the club was obvious and many teammates and juniors he played with and coached had the deepest respect and admiration of Wally. He served the club proudly and was awarded Life Membership in 2019. Wally was described by David Crisanti from the Tee Tree Gully Club as one of the kindest football people he has ever met and a major influence on his football life. He coached at Tee Tree Gully back in the 1970s and later at West Torrens in the early 1980s. He thanked Wally for everything he gave to the hundreds of young footballers he

coached and for his dedication and volunteer work to the club. We send our condolences to Jan, Justine and Lawrie, Anne and James and their extended families.

A MESSAGE FROM SANFL-PART 2

A SANFL report has revealed the significant economic contribution and social benefits delivered by community football clubs. The study found that SA's regional football clubs contribute an average \$1.127 million into the economy. The study estimated that participation in football clubs by players, volunteers and active members delivered up to \$18,220 in annual health benefits by helping to prevent chronic diseases such as heart disease and diabetes and mental illness. Participation provides an important outlet for physical and mental relaxation and contributes to social inclusion. Community football clubs represent more than just a place to play and watch a footy match but rather are a place to gather, celebrate occasions, catch-up with friends and socialise. Country clubs are the heartbeat of the community and have a powerful role to play in driving economic activity and improving health outcomes. They are ideal places to promote mental health and wellbeing and start the mental health conversation to support players, volunteers, officials and the wider community.
