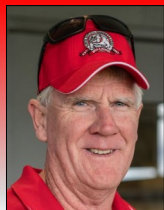

This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It does NOT replace club membership. All Under 18, B Grade and A Grade players from South, West and Central will also pay a PAFL fee of \$20 to help run senior football in 2024.

Gazza's GOSSIP

In this month's newsletter Gary Kittel focuses on one of South Augusta's greats in Jeff Shillabeer.

Jeff commenced playing football with the South Augusta club in 1969 and he continued for eight seasons before injuries curtailed his career at the end of 1976. Although still relatively young, Jeff did not quit the sport he loved, he still wanted to be involved. Even in his last year of playing he was also the club's U15 coach. In 1977 and 1978 he continued to coach the U15 side and at the same time was a goal umpire with the Port Augusta Football League. He has the distinction of being a goal umpire in 1978 League Grand Final. In 1979 he was the team manager for the club's seconds and still goal umpire for several games. From 1980 until 1983 he was the league team manager and Jeff considered this some of the best football of his life, learning so much about the game. For the next two years he was both a trainer and the club's property steward. Then from 1986 until 1988 he was the club's timekeeper for two years.

Throughout the 1990's Jeff was involved with both the SAFC and the PAFL. During this time, he was club secretary and league delegate. In 1995 he was the league's secretary and in 1998 he was the third's team manager.

At the start of the new millennium, Jeff put his football energy into the PAFL and for ten years he was League Secretary. Jeff has devoted over forty years to football in Port Augusta and has enjoyed the rewards of winning premierships at all levels. Through his playing and administration has been held in the highest regard at all levels and throughout the state. Jeff a SAFC Life Member, was inducted into the South Augusta and Port Augusta Hall of Fame.

CRICKET FLASH BACK

1973/74

David Gloede was made Captain this year after a great season in 1972/73. South finish third after losing to West in the Preliminary Final - West 125 vs South 101 in a dismal loss. West batted first and the bowlers performed well with Bruce Curtis 4/55, Roger Sampson 4/50 and Dean Barry 1/11 were the only 3 bowlers required. West best bats were Trevor Grantham 31, Kevin McSporran 23 and Mick Foote 27.

South were off to a bad start when batting star David Gloede was dismissed by Trevor Grantham for 6 and Chris Reynolds was the only batter to hold his head high after a 51. Others to bat were Brenton Zubrinich 0, D Muldoon 4, David Collins 3, Gil Schupelius 6, Bill Baker 2, Dean Barry no 8, Wayne Shepherd 2, Roger Sampson 4 and Bruce Curtis 11. Trevor Grantham was the destroyer with 5/57 and Greg McSporran 4/11. In the First Semi Final win against Willsden South best bats were Brenton Zubrinich 76 and David Gloede 46 and the best bowlers were Bruce Curtis 4/34 and Roger Sampson 6/26.

Where are they now: Of those mentioned in the flashback, David Gloede has his own waste disposal business in Brisbane, Roger Sampson lives in Adelaide and often works at Adelaide Oval, Dean Barry lives in Adelaide and is retired,(you'll see him at the Test Match), Gil Schupelius lives in Port Augusta and plays croquet, Wayne Shepherd lives in Adelaide and is retired and unfortunately Bruce Curtis, Brenton Zubrinich and Bill Baker have passed away. We are unsure about David Collins and D Muldoon.

CONNOR ROZEE UPDATE

Congratulations to ex-South Augusta junior Connor Rozee who at 23 is the Port Adelaide Football Club's eighth Captain. He has also signed a huge contract through to 2032. Father Rob was a 200-game premiership player, past coach and inaugural SAFC Hall of Fame inductee at the Bulldogs. Rozee was pick 5 at the 2018 draft after winning a flag with the North Adelaide Roosters, who wear the same red and white as the South Augusta Bulldogs. He has played 106 games. The Rozee family moved to Adelaide when Connor finished primary school partly to help him chase his AFL dream. Mum Sue said his country upbringing has held him in good stead when it comes to dealing with the pressure of AFL. "He grew up playing out of his age group with an expectation that he needed to play well for his team to win," she said.

How Power star Connor Rozee has progressed from promising South Augusta junior to Port Adelaide's new Captain

Right from an early age, Connor Rozee showed signs he would go far in whatever calling he followed. Those close to him are still amazed at just how far the new Port Adelaide Captain has gone already. Connor Rozee was in a win-win position early on draft night. If St Kilda chose him at pick 4, he would be going to the club he supported. If Port Adelaide did with the next selection, he would be staying in his home state. Michael Kerin, a family friend, St Kilda supporter and president of Rozee's junior club, South Augusta, was hoping for the Saints. "Connor's dad, Robert, was a mad Saints supporter and Connor was as a kid," Kerin tells this masthead. "My oldest son was and I remember giving Connor a hand-me-down Tony Lockett guernsey from my lad – a kid's guernsey with number four on the back. I said to him if he ever gets drafted, it has to be St Kilda and if he doesn't, I want the guernsey back." The Saints were said to have had strong discussion about taking Rozee, only to instead choose key forward Max King with their first pick in 2018.

That allowed the Power to pounce. It could hardly have turned out better for Rozee and the club. Five years on, the 23-year-old is a dual All-Australian, a best-and-fairest winner and the club's new captain – one of the youngest skippers in Port Adelaide's history.

Speak to people who have followed his ascent and two traits they emphasise are his maturity and determination. "It sounds over the top but even as a 12-year-old kid he was driven," Kerin says.

Rozee's SANFL premiership captain at North Adelaide, Max Thring, adds: "He was 18 but one of the more mature blokes of the group and just such a team player." Those who watched Rozee come through the ranks always felt he was destined for big things. But not necessarily the captaincy. "We had Jack Viney in juniors and you knew he was going to be a leader," North Adelaide's regional talent co-ordinator Neil Sanders says. "Connor was a lot quieter. "But obviously players develop and once he got in the AFL system, he would have built his confidence up pretty quickly I would have thought." Rozee's first steps in football were at South Augusta, where his father is a Hall of Famer, premiership player and ex-coach. Rob was a utility who had a stint at South Adelaide under former Crows football manager John Reid. Reid coached Rob at South Augusta in the early 1980s before convincing him to join the Panthers. The family moved to Adelaide, to Oakden in the northeastern suburbs, at the end of primary school for their son and daughter Paige's sport.

Rozee started with the Roosters' U13s and Broadview, while also playing cricket for East Torrens and state junior teams. "I'm not saying he could've gone on to play for Australia, but he was a pretty handy cricketer," Kerin says.

Mark Bowman, a former junior coach of Rozee's at Broadview, says the new Power skipper stood out. (Mark also played in the South Augusta 1983 A Grade Premiership). Not just because of his talent. "I always say sport is three parts: skill, preparation and mental," Bowman says. "My sister tells a story that he was drinking water and having healthy stuff even at a very young age. "The mental side of it, he had the tenacity and drive that was a cut above the rest."

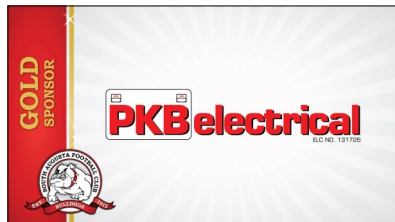
