The last month has been a busy one with many Xmas events at the club, several school graduation functions, and the South Augusta Xmas dinner to finish it off.


Many thanks to all the volunteers who helped out with catering over this period as its greatly appreciated.





SANFL Players Registration Payment of \$27.50 seniors/\$22.50 juniors must be paid when registering on PlayHQ.

Every player at every club will have to pay this so it is basically no pay no play. This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee.

It does NOT replace club membership. All U18/B/A Grade players from South/West/Central will also pay a PAFL to help run senior football in 2025.

SGFL AGM MINUTES 1/12/24

Across all U15/U18/B/A Grades there were 27 reports, 18 yellow cards and 12 tribunals last season.

1 By Law 32 Major Round Matches..motion to see PP and PA share the finals every two years.

E.g. seasons 1 and 3 town A gets a Semi Final and the Grand Final whilst town B gets the other Semi Final and the Preliminary Final. Seasons 2 and 4 these games are flipped and so on. Thus, it could mean South v Centra/West Grand Final could be in PP etc. All feedback/comment/opinions welcome.

2 2025 SGL Fixture

We play 11 games at Central Oval, and 1 at ETSA against Central in Round 10. Our five games in Port Pirie sees us play Port at Port Oval in Round 8, at Memorial Oval against Sollies (Rounds 7 and 17) and Lions (Rounds 4 and 14).

FOOTBALL FUNDRAISING REPORT FOR 2024

The Football Fundraising Committee has the role of assisting the Management Committee to raise funds which are used towards the Football Operations budget to cover player payments, coaches and trainer payments, oval hire, insurance, medical expenses, strapping, pewters for milestones and trophies etc.

The committee comprises Simon Owens, Kean Parrington, Mick Kerin, Mark Shirley and Harry Waterworth is an advisor to the group. Jarrod Waterworth also assisted with the reunion. The Football Fundraising Committee is separate to the Football Operations Committee who handle the football side of the club, e.g. match day operations, training, coach appointments, recruitment and retention etc.

Sponsorship

The committee together with Simon Owens, Sponsorship Officer, raised funds through cash contributions from sponsors and businesses who assisted the club in 2024. Simon has together with the Fundraising Committee helped raise approximately \$32,000 in cash contributions and another \$12,000 in funds through awards and vouchers this year.

There were over 45 senior football sponsors in 2024 and 24 colts sponsors with 6 Platinum sponsors this year. Through the displays on TV at the club and invites to club functions, mentions in newsletter, website and the Friday night "Sponsor Minute "we continue to strive to ensure they have value for money from the partnership.

Vice Presidents Club

The Vice Presidents club had 31 members this year and they contributed \$3,100 towards football operations. This was down from last year and we will need to look at how we can increase this number in 2025.

Five of these Vice Presidents were past players and officials who no longer live in Port Augusta but chose to support the club. We hope to increase members next year in 2025 and thank members and supporters for their contributions.

Augusta Markets and BBQ

The committee was involved with the Augusta Markets in December 2023 and work involved getting helpers, ordering food, organising rosters, promotion and organising tills and food supply.

Funds of \$600 went towards football operations and many thanks to Simon and Harry who did a lot of work behinds the scenes plus other helpers on the day.

Players Auction

The committee organised 2 player's auctions that raised \$1,250 for football operations in 2024.

Many thanks to those who contributed.

Racing/ Football Tips

These competitions have been well supported with approximately \$1,300 raised in each competition with funding going towards club projects such as the drinks van and new gym planned by the club in the future.

Players Reunion

The committee assisted with organising the Back to Souths/Past Players Day and 1964 and 1994 A Grade reunions with at least 50 past players, officials and partners returning to the club. A great day, the club would have raised some funds over the bar and for meals on the day.

The committee plan to organise another "Back to Souths" day in 2025, featuring 1965,1985, 1995 and 2015 B Grade Premiership reunions and perhaps the 25th anniversary of the 2000 A Grade Premiership.

Other fundraising

The committee was able to obtain grants totalling \$12,500 for the Indigenous Participation Project (\$5,000), Active Club (\$3,000) and Power of Her (\$4,500 which is still to be expended). If you wish to be involved in the steering committee for the POH project, see Mick or Mark as we need help with it.

The Indigenous Participation Project was fully expended, and funding went towards an Indigenous recognition day, subsidies for uniforms, cultural awareness talks and a specially designed guernsey for the U15 and U18s for the first time.

Many thanks to the sponsors in 2024 and those who have contributed through the players auctions and fundraising events to ensure that the club has competitive teams each year. New Fundraising Committee members and ideas are always welcome. We hope you are on board again in 2025.

Bob Fry died on the 2nd December. He played for South from 1960 to 1962, playing 2 A and 43 B Grade games. Bob played in the 1960 and 1961 B Grade Premiership teams and played a big part in these victories.

Bob did not play after this as he left town. His brothers Reg and Arthur were also involved with the club during those years. Bob always showed an interest in South Augusta and came back to reunions when he could.

He later worked as a gatekeeper at Prospect Oval during North Adelaide matches. We send our condolences to Bob's family and friends at this sad time.



Coral Thompson wife of the late Laurie" Toddy "Thompson, passed away recently in the Booleroo Centre aged care facility. Coral was a great support to Laurie when he played at Souths and when he was Captain Coach in 1955. She remained a South supporter after his death through her grandsons who played at the club. The club sends its condolences to Laurien Frick and her family at this sad time.

Barb and her husband Kevin Markham both recently passed away within a few weeks of each other. Kevin played football for South Augusta from 1947 to 1954, playing 80 senior games. During his time at the club South unfortunately lost 5 A Grade Grand Finals with Kevin winning club trophies in 1949 and 1950. Kevin also served as Committeeperson and Treasurer for 4 years from 1952 to 1955 and was part of the 1947 and 1948 B Grade Premiership teams. Kevin played with Bill Applebee and was amongst our oldest past players at 93 years of age. He was also a great bowler at the Port Augusta Bowling Club before moving from Port Augusta. Barb was also a South supporter and great support for Kevin. Their son Lawrie also played juniors at South Augusta and over 50 A Grade games and 60 senior games. The club sends its condolences to Lawrie and family at this sad time.

After 8 rounds of the Racing Tips it's still anyone's championship with some great winners picked so far including a 42 pointer at one meet. A few names amongst the top five have been Kean Parrington, Cheryl O'Neill, Peter Trewartha and past champion Harry Waterworth who is regularly amongst the best. Sazza's Gossip

This month Gazz discusses the history of the Port Augusta football clubs.

The Port Augusta Football Association was formed in 1901 after the meeting of the interested persons formed a committee to administer the sport on an organised basis in Port Augusta. It was decided to establish two teams, Albions and Excelsiors and the first competitive match was staged on Central Oval on the 19th of March 1901 with Albions defeating Excelsiors 1 goal 4 points to 2 points.

Although this match represented the first attempt of organised football in Port Augusta the two club competition was abandoned after only a few games and a combined team, the Port Augusta Football Club then completed the 1901 season with a series of matches against neighbouring towns.


For the next eleven years from 1901 to 1911 no attempt was made to introduce local football and the Port Augusta Football Club continued over this period to engage in intertown fixtures mainly against Quorn, Port Pirie, and Wilmington. The Port Augusta Football Association decided in 1912 to introduce a local three club competition with South, Central and North being the teams chosen to start the competitions.


In 1912 the officials who took the far-sighted decision to revert to a local competition were Patron W.G. Pryor, President T Hewitson (mayor of Port Augusta) secretary T. Brennan and the committee of John Fullerton, H Trembath, J Scharenberg and A. Withers. North was disbanded at the conclusion of the 1915 season while West and Flinders commenced as member clubs during the same year. Centrals winner of the first Premiership, withdrew from the competition about the same time and were not to re-appear under the name until 1939.

During later years, Quorn and Wilmington were admitted to the competition and the Association was restyled for a time as the Great Northern Football League before subsequently reverting to its present designation. Players who represented Port Augusta in 1912 from South Augusta were Ralph Cilento, John Fullerton, A. Withers, and A Spicer. The Transcontinental paper at the time commented that the innovation of the football had proven its worth and next season should see an improved standard of play. The Secretary of the Association T.R Brennan who was also a South Augusta player had worked very hard for the year and they commented that it would be gratifying to him to see all three clubs well established in the town.

Players in the original South team comprised many well-known South Augusta names such as Grantham and Fullerton who have been involved with the club for many years. Many of the players were recruited from the Port Augusta wharf where the shipping industry was flourishing at the time.
