FAREWELL TO THE SHILLABEER FAMILY

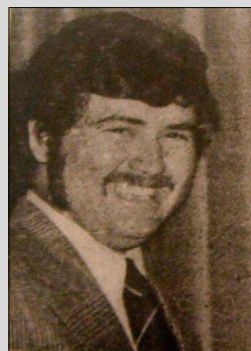

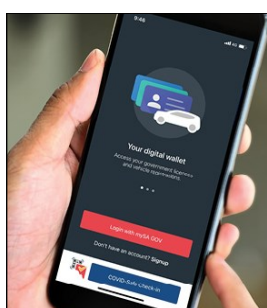

GAZZ'S GOSSIP

This month Gary Kittel focusses on another great family that has been involved with the club and has provided great support for many years - the McInnis family.

Several brothers played for the club initially and they include:

Gill McInnis, father of Gus and Trevor, was one of the brothers. Gill played for Souths from 1950-1954 and was a Life Member, also playing cricket for the club. Gus played from 1978-1983 including the 1979-1981 B grade premierships, winning the B Grade League Fairest and Best in one of those years. Trevor also played senior football from 1977-1978 after coming through the juniors, and played in Under 18s premiership side.

Laurie McInnis played for South from 1945-1959 and coached South Seconds to two premierships in 1960 and 1961. Laurie showed great passion for the club for over 50 years and was a member of the 1947 B Grade premiership side. A decade later in 1957, Laurie was a captain of the Seconds team and was named best player in the Grand Final. In the same year he won the Fairest and Best award for the Seconds competition. In 1959 Lawrie was awarded Life Membership and from 1953-1973 he was on the Souths Committee, as Treasurer for 2 years in 1956-57, Secretary for 3 years and Assistant Secretary for 5 years, before becoming Vice President in 1973. Lawrie went on to be a selector for the club for many years, Club Delegate for both the Port Augusta and SGL Leagues and was inducted into the Port Augusta Hall of Fame in 2009. Lawrie also played cricket for Souths.

Keith McInnis played for Souths from 1949-1964, playing most of his football at fullback. He had a long left foot kick, clearing the ball to the centre and took a good overhead mark. Keith was member of the 1964 A Grade premiership side coached by Trevor Searle and he played in a Seconds premiership in his first year and a League premiership in his second year. He served on the Management Committee from 1961-1963 and was Secretary for one year. Keith has a grandson Corey Cuffe, who plays both football and cricket for South Augusta.

Bobby McInnis was a long time Committee Member and one of our most passionate supporters, attending most games. Bob did not back off with the umpires and he did a lot of voluntary work around the club especially behind the bar with his good mates Elwyn Walter and Charlie Huddleston. In recent times Bob's granddaughter Caitlyn McInnis served as barperson at the Central Oval clubrooms. Bobby is a Life Member at the club.

Malcolm "Paddy" McInnis was an administrator at the club, Life Member and player. He played from 1955-1961 and due to his employment he was transferred to Darwin where he married a Darwin girl. Maylene and Malcolm have three sons Kelvin, Matthew and Dean. Kelvin has gone on to be a South Life Member, played colts and seconds football and has served on South committees, Colts committees and can be seen as a goal umpire for the SGL. He played senior football from 1994-1997 and has played cricket for Souths as well. Kelvin's son Angus played in the 2020 B Grade Premiership side.

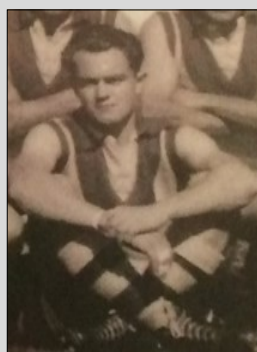
Mathew McInnis played football from 1990-2001, being a member of the 1993, 1994 and 2000 A grade premiership sides and was named best player in the final in 1994. He is also a long serving cricketer for the club, playing in several premierships.

Dean also played in the 1994 A Grade premiership side that defeated Ports, at the age of 15 years. Dean has also provided great service to the club, playing from 1997-2011 although spending some time in the Barossa league. He currently coaches the junior grades and has also played cricket with his lad for Souths.

A total of many years of service from the McInnis family of South Augusta and I'm sure we will see many more into the future.

Others were David Robinson 0, A Freebairn 0, Wes Yates 18, Greg Shirley 20, Jarrod Waterworth 0, Aaron Vater 1, Chris Drew 1, Mick Gilbert 4, Chris Grantham 3 no.

Quorn was then defeated by West, who won their fifth premiership in a row.

Wes Yates won the Keith Zubrinich Medal for the best player in the Association.

A Grade batting totals for the year - Wes Yates 323 runs, Anthony Freebairn 280 runs, Greg Shirley 125 runs, Nick Callary 210 runs, David Robinson 198 runs.

Bowling for the year - A Freebairn 22 wickets, Chris Grantham 15 wickets, Aaron Vater 14 wickets, Nathan Nistico 12 wickets.
