INTRODUCING PlayHQ

Players, volunteers and Team Managers can register for the 2022 season via PlayHQ at <https://www.playhq.com/afl/register/c01966>.

All intending players must be registered on the club site on PlayHQ to be eligible for selection. The SANFL Player Registration Payment of \$20 seniors / \$15 juniors must be paid when registering. Every player at every club in SA will have to pay this so it is basically no pay, no play.

This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee.

SAFC membership is also added as a separate fee during the registration process (see attachment for instructions).



SGL SEASON UPDATE

CRICKET FLASH BACK

1991 / 1992

POSITION: 3rd

Captain Coach was Robert Rozee and new recruits included Justin Henderson from Stirling and Lee Simpson. South A Grade had a very good season finishing top at the end of the minor round, but lost both finals to finish third.

In the Preliminary Final South batted first and made 179 with Mathew McInnis making 65, Anthony Everett 25 and Justin Henderson 25. Stirling in reply made 5/183 with the best score Mark Collins 74, Darren Grocke 43. The best of the South bowlers were Iain Elliott 4/45 and Jarrod Waterworth 1/32. A disappointing end to the season.

B Grade did not make the finals and C Grade lost in the Preliminary Final. PACA awards saw Iain Elliott winning both the Bowling Average and Aggregate and David Shillabeer the Batting Average in the C Grade. Mark Manko won the Bruce Curtis Medal as well as Batting Aggregate and Average and Bowling Aggregate.

Gazza's GOSSIP

In this month's bulletin Gazza Kittel concentrates on the past players and coaches of the South Augusta Football Club who played and were selected as members of the Port Augusta team that drew with Whyalla in 1959, scores being 26.13-169 to Whyalla 25.19-169 in what was described as the best intertown game played in this league.

The South Augusta players who played in that team include:

Merv McKenzie: A club champion, Merv was made a Life Member in 1962 having played from 1953 to 1962. After being recruited from North Adelaide in 1953, Merv won the League Fairest and Best trophy in 1959 and he played in the tied game kicking 3 goals and 1 behind, and was named in the best players. In 1958 he was appointed South Augusta Coach and played for Port Augusta on several occasions including in 1960 where he polled well in the Mail Medal. Merv won the Club's Fairest and Best, and served on the Committee from 1964 to 1968, for 5 years.

Robert Nowak (pictured below, far left): Robert played senior football for Souths from 1942 to 1964 and played over 150 games, being a Life Member and part of the 1964 A Grade Premiership team. In 1959 Robert won the A Grade trophy for the Best Centreman. From 1958 to 1962 Bob served on the South Augusta Management Committee and made the 1961 SGL team and Port Augusta team in 1962. In 1950 Bob was B Grade Vice Captain, rising through the ranks to become a great player for Souths. Bob Nowak was a playing member of the 1959 Port Augusta team. He played the game hard and could fill any position, and in 1961 he was named the Club's Fairest and Best.

Ray Hesse (pictured below, second left): Ray is also a Life Member of the Club and played senior football from 1952 to 1963, including the seconds Premiership in 1962, coached by Reg Richards. Ray was selected in a number of Port Augusta combined teams, including the famous draw. Ray served on the Management Committee from 1954 to 1963 including as Club Secretary from 1958 to 1963. Ray played in the back pocket and was a regular A Grade player playing the hard game. Ray's wife Maureen served on the Ladies Committee for several years.

Mick Vanvacas (pictured below, second right): Mick was another South Augusta champion who in 1964 played a vital part of that year's Premiership. He was a tough and courageous rover, always hard at the ball and possessing a prodigious drop kick. In the 3 years he was at the Club, Mick was a positive influence in the way he trained and prepared himself for the game. Mick won the Madigan Medal in 1961 playing for North Whyalla, and kicked 8 goals for Whyalla in the drawn game.

Don Harris (pictured below, far right): Don, an ex-South Augusta A Grade coach was one of the big guns that played in the famous draw against Whyalla. Don played for Sturt at full back. He was selected for the SA State team and in 1959 he was playing in top form.

Brian "Joe" Master: Joe, a left footer, was the fifth South Augusta player to be selected in the Port Augusta team but missed out in the final selection but this was still a great achievement.

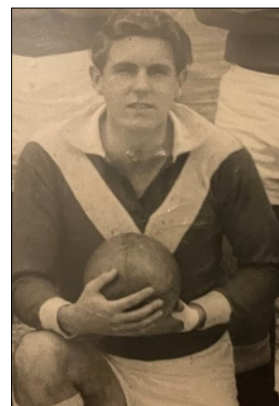
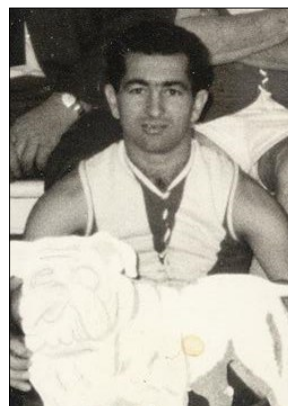
Malcom Dixon: Malcolm is also an ex-South Augusta Coach, and he was selected in the team that drew against Whyalla. Malcom was a brilliant footballer and was noted for his speed, being one of the best wingman in the north. Malcom played for West Augusta and North Adelaide and toward the end of his career he played a few games for Central under Ted McAuliffe. Malcom was selected to train for the State team, and he was named as Fairest and Best for North Adelaide. Malcom's association with South was as a coach, taking the team to the 1975 A Grade Grand Final. He is a Life Member of West Augusta and a Port Augusta Hall of Famer.

John Kernahan: A member of the famous South Augusta Kernahan family, John also played in that game. John also excelled at Cricket for the Club, being an A Grade Premiership player in the early 1970s.

John Bowman: John played for Port Augusta in the tied game. Being a colts players for South he transferred to the West Whyalla club. A brilliant centre half back he had a strong overhead mark.

Allan Dighton: Allan was an ex-South Augusta A Grade Coach from 1961. He played in the tied match and was a sound utility player with tons of courage and was a brilliant footballer. Allan was a Life Member of West Augusta and a Port Augusta Hall of Famer.

As you can see South Augusta players and Coaches were well represented in the epic game which will be remembered for many years to come.

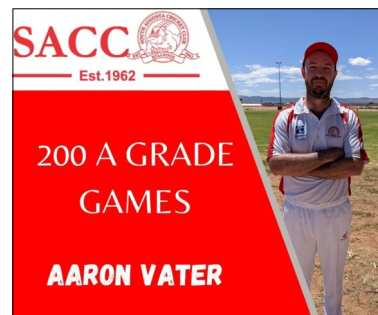

Port Augusta Basketball Association met recently and decided to impose a two week pause on competition, in an effort to combat the ongoing issues and concerns impacting the current season. COVID has caused significant disruptions to games, with clubs unable to field teams and the reduced availability of umpires and officials due to multiple close and casual contact implications.

B GRADE MEN - In the B Grade, Souths White are third on the ladder, with five wins, three losses and two draws; while Souths Red are fourth, having won six of their ten games. Darcy Kildea (Souths White) leads the top scorers list for this grade with 108 points. Trent Ritter (Souths White) and Dylan Barnett (Souths Red) are third and fourth highest scorers with 104 points and 97 points respectively. Jaalen Raspe (Souths White) and Josh Forrest (Souths Red) also feature in the Top 10 scorers list with 86 points and 80 points respectively.

C GRADE WOMEN: The C Grade Women are currently sixth on the ladder, with three wins and eight losses. Tiffany Miller is the third highest scorer for this grade with 95 points.
