
Sazza's Gossip

Part 2 of the story of the Waterworth family and their involvement over many years. This month I discuss Val, Harry and their family.



Val Waterworth: Val is a local Port Augusta girl and because of the family's involvement, she has been associated with the club since the 1960s. She has ably assisted her husband, Harry who has been involved in many aspects of the club. One of the first things Val became tied up in was the washing of the player's guernseys. When son John played colts football in the early 1980s, Val took on the role of a Club Trainer. From 1995 until 2019 she was Head Trainer and after relinquishing this position, continued as a trainer. She was involved with training for 36 years and was Head Trainer for 17 years. For 23 years, from 1995 to 2018, she served on the Management Committee and has been heavily involved with fundraising and social functions. In 1989 Val was named Club Person of the Year and in 1999 she received her Life Membership. For many years Val organised or assisted with the purchase and sale of club merchandise.

There is little doubt that the spa room and the trainer's room was her domain for 20 years, and without her the spa bath would probably have ceased operating. In 2008 Val was recognised for her long and valued contribution to the club by being inducted into the Port Augusta Football League Hall of Fame.




Harry Waterworth: Harry joined the club in 1953 and played colts and seconds football before becoming involved with the administration in the early 1960s. Harry was very busy with the Social and Fundraising Committees and spent time on the Football Committee. He joined the Management Committee in 1970 where he was Assistant Secretary or Secretary until 1976. After a ten year break, he was Secretary again from 1986 to 1988, 2008 to 2009 and 2013 to 2014. At the ground Harry has been a runner, timekeeper, team manager for all senior grades as well as being the club's tribunal representative. For many years he volunteered at the club's BBQ shed. Whilst on food, Harry was Catering Manager for many years and helped with fundraising as well. In 1997, 2002, 2005 and 2014 he was the Club Person of the Year - a great record! For over twenty years Harry was a delegate to both the Spencer Gulf and Port Augusta Football Leagues.

In 2000 he was awarded the Australian Sports Medal and in 2009 he received a Merit Award from the SANFL for his service to football. The following year he was presented with the Clubs SA Presidents Citation Award of Excellence. In Harry's spare time, he has been either Assistant Team Manager or Team Manager for the Northern Zone team in the SA State Country Football Championships. He attended his first Port Augusta League meeting in 1969 as a club delegate with Les Kittel who told him.. "Listen, learn and don't talk". Harry is a Life Member of South Augusta, Port Augusta Football League and Spencer Gulf Football League. A worthy recipient, Harry was an inaugural inductee to the Port Augusta Football League Hall of Fame.

Val and Harry had two children, John and Debra. John played 133 senior games for the club from 1989 to 1999 and was part of the 1995 B Grade Premiership. He was a reliable backman and was used in other positions when required. Debra is a dedicated Southie and netballer, being involved with the Ladies and Social Committees over the years.

The Waterworths arrived in Port Augusta 70 years ago and became involved with the South Augusta Football Club through the friendship with the Kernahan Family. Thus began a wonderful period over the next 70 years as the club became a large part of the family's life.


