We submitted all three as worthy entries in the Port Augusta Council Community Event of the Year and were proud to be announced as the winner for the Will Bolitho Recovery - a truly amazing effort. This makes us back-to-back-to-back winners following on from the \$5000 we raised for the MS Foundation via the inaugural Mid-Summer Ball in February 2019, and the \$5000 we raised for the Western Districts Saints Football Club who lost their clubrooms in the Kangaroo Island bushfires of 2020. These things just don't happen. It has been a team effort with outstanding support from the club and the wider community. Three awards in a row shows we are truly a community club. INTRODUCING PlayHQ

This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It is NOT club membership which is also added as a separate fee during the registration process.

Dean Barry was appointed captain this year and the club recruited David Allanson from Willsden. Other new players included Don Pasculli, Max Thomas, Ian Ruxton and Gary Curtis. Souths won their third Premiership, their first in 12 years, when they defeated Quorn in the Grand Final (South 167 vs Quorn 9/153). Don Pasculli was the best South batsman with 41 runs, Mark Bowman 28, Joe Yeates 25 and Dean Barry 12. Barry Rimmer for Quorn bowled well with 17 runs off 12 overs and Ray Buzzacott 2/44. Sazza's Gossip

This month Gazza presents a story on the Zanker family's involvement with SAFC over the years.

Hube Zanker: Captained the 1938 A Grade Premiership team when South defeated Central 8.6 to 7.8. He represented Port Augusta in the 1937 combined team. He played from 1937 to 1944. In 1940 when the team was defeated by Central in the final, he was named in the best players and in 1941 when teams suffered due to the war, South won just one game but due to only having three teams in the competition, we still made the Grand Final but lost to Central 13.8 to 4.6. Hube was named Best on Ground that day. In 1942 he was named South Captain again and they won the A Grade Premiership - the fifth premiership for the club. In 1944 South had a good season and made the Grand Final but were defeated by Centrals 13.23 to 3.12 with Hube being named second best player. In 1927 the B Grade had a separate Association to the A Grade and they practiced at Conwaytown at the back of the railway workshops. That year the B Grade won the Premiership and Association medals were won by Hube for the Most Gentlemanly, Best Mark and Best All-round Performer.

Sid Zanker: Sid played for South from 1934 to 1947 and in 1946 was named Fairest and Best together with the Best Placed Man in 1945. In 1934 when South lost the semi-final to West 15.14 to 4.14, he was named in the best players. Soon after this Sid was recruited to Sturt in Adelaide.

Other Zankers to play for South Augusta were A. Zanker in 1924; Bevan Zanker 1946 to 1953; Brian Zanker 1995 to 1997, including a B Grade Premiership in 1995. Brian was a talented half forward who went on to play juniors at North Adelaide and then on to Broadview. Daniel Zanker 1993 to 1999, was a reliable ruckman who played in the 1999 A Grade Grand Final loss to Port. Mark Zanker played juniors up until 1998. Martin Zanker played from 1925 to 1932. Martin played in the 1928 A Grade Premiership when they defeated West 4.7 to 3.9 with Martin named second best player. Frank Zanker was an official that year. And finally, Peter Zanker played in 1954.

For many years the Zanker family has also given support to the Stirling North community and Stirling North Cricket Club. As you can see the Zanker family have been a big part of the South Augusta community for many years.
