

South defeat Stirling in the Preliminary Final to once again play Redsox in the Grand Final.


They reversed the result from the year before.

The following is an extract from their Facebook page...

Vanuatu Brothers making waves in Australian Football League

"Two brothers from the island of Tanna are making waves in Australian football, impressing coaches and fans alike. Mark and Josh Niamak, both AFL Vanuatu players, have set a new milestone by playing for two prominent AFL clubs in Australia: Mooroopna Football Netball Club and the South Augusta Football Club.

Mark, playing for the Mooroopna Football Netball Club, has quickly made a name for himself due to his versatility and game sense. His debut season has been marked by standout performances, including scoring in every game he's played. Meanwhile,

Josh has been making his mark playing for the South Augusta Football Club in South Australia. He has the distinction of being their first-ever A Grade player from Vanuatu. After spending most of the season in the Reserve Grade team, Josh was promoted to A Grade on August 3rd, debuting in a match against Solomontown. He celebrated the occasion by kicking a goal in his debut, drawing applause from his club and fans. At 27 years old, Josh is proud of his achievements and looks forward to setting more milestones as he progresses in his career. # Peter Trewartha


Played 179 games comprising 123 A and 56 B games. He played senior football from 1982-1992 unfortunately playing in five losing grand finals during his career. He coached junior grades from 1996-2007 (from U11 to U15 with several Premierships) and was involved on the Colts Committee for 12 years. Peter also managed the hot dog trailer for 4 years at junior games and managed the BBQ shed over on the 'Southies wing' for 10 years. He also managed the downstairs bar at the new complex for 6 years. He had 2 terms on

Management Committee over 8 years and was made a Life Member in 2003 and a South Augusta Hall of Famer in 2023. He was Club Person of the year in 2009 and on the Friday night tea roster for over 30 years at both the old and new clubs.

Sue Trewartha served the club for over 20 years. Her roles included as a parent assisting with the junior teams her sons played in, together with serving on the Management and Social Committees. Here she was involved with organising the Red and White Ball and more recently fundraising events for causes such as breast cancer research.

# Ben Trewartha


Ben, son of Peter and Sue played for South from 2008-2020, playing 83 games consisting of 62 A and 21 B grade games. Ben was the A Grade leading goalkicker in 2013 with 38 goals. He played his whole career with Souths starting as a 7 year old and won Premierships in U11, U13, U15 and U18 along with the A Grade Premiership in 2012.

Luke played junior football for Souths from 1996-2005. He played in the U13 Premiership in 2001. 
# MICRO-VOLUNTEERS OPPORTUNITY #1— Sunday at Souths
