WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

I recently went to Adelaide Oval to see an SANFL match and I started talking to the security officer and usher on the location of my seat. I discovered that the man had previously played for South Augusta in both football and cricket, playing in the era of 1972-1977.

His name was Roger Sampson. Roger was a Police Officer stationed at Port Augusta for that period and he relieved at several country locations over that time. Roger played over 50 games in both sports and remembers fondly playing football with names such as Richard Gough and David Shillabeer; and cricket with Bruce Curtis and Dean Barry. Roger opened the bowling and took 4/50 in the 1974 loss to West Augusta in the Preliminary Final.

Roger returned to Adelaide and tried out for Port Adelaide before playing amateur football in the northern suburbs, together with local cricket which was his favourite game.

Roger enjoyed his time in Port Augusta and is retired,

working casually at Adelaide Oval, together with bus driving in an aged care facility.

He has been receiving the newsletter for several years. Make sure you say hello if you notice him at Adelaide Oval during visits for football and cricket.





BILLY'S CORNER

Did you know that the South Augusta B Grade played an ex-AFL player in the second round? Cameron Faulkner, aged 36, travelled from Roxby Downs to have a game when the Far North competition was abandoned due to Coronavirus. Cam was a former professional Australian Rules footballer who played with the Western Bulldogs. He was recruited through the 2002 National AFL Draft at number 17 and played up to 20 games, but suffered some bad injuries which forced him to retire. The 2006 Record described Faulkner as an exciting and quick small forward / midfielder. He was delisted at the end of the 2007 AFL season and returned to his SANFL club, Central Districts, for a year. Cam played for the East Roxby Roos in Roxby Downs as a coach/player but with no season this year he wanted the opportunity to have a game with Souths.

Lawrence Bradley-Brown also played in A Grade after travelling with his girlfriend from Mt Gambier to play. Lawrence plays for West Gambier, however that team is not playing this year so he took the opportunity to have a game and go kingfishing with Buck Everett and the lads on the Sunday. He has represented the Western Border Zone at the Zone Championships and was Captain of the West Gambier team last year. He some good glimpses in the first game and should be a great asset once the year goes on. We hope to see a bit more of Lawrence in the future.

Great to hear from Brenton Hall who played for the club and coached the Under 18s in the 1980s, while working as a teacher. Brenton has just moved from Indonesia to work at the Australian International School Bangkok, starting on August 3rd. He will initially work with the Director then take this position when it is vacated in November. This is a big move for him and the family after 13 years in Jakarta. 

GAZZ'S GOSSIP

This month Gary Kittel features one of the great volunteers for the club over the years - Don Gourd. Imagine living across from the old South Augusta clubrooms at Fern Street for over 40 years. The noise from the Saturday night discos, premiership and Grand Final nights and weekends, big bands, people leaving the premises in the early hours of the morning, waiting for taxis, yelling, and screaming. Well Don put up with that and as they say, if you can't beat them you have to join them!

Don came to Australia from England in 1953 and started work with his uncle as a builder for 4-5 years. Don then worked with Norm Kohler for 2 years and then worked with Willsden Joinery for 2 years. Don then with the Commonwealth gained work Railways where he remained for 33 years until he retired. Initially Don got involved with the Willsden Football Club as a volunteer goal umpire before he moved to South Augusta as a Trainer. Living so close to the club, he was involved with caretaker work, maintenance and bar renovations, together with the extensions to the club around 1985. When it was time to finish work, he enjoyed a couple of beers and came over the club at 4:00pm, not having to worry about driving anywhere.

Don is currently the second oldest non-playing Life Member at the club and is in his 94th year. He volunteered his time as an Administrator, serving on the Management Committee for many years, as Trainer from 1972-1983, Timekeeper from 1984 to 1995 and Club Caretaker in 1988 for several years. Don was awarded Clubperson of the Year for his outstanding services to the Club. He currently resides at an aged care facility in the town, with limited visits due to the virus restriction. The Club wishes him all the best and thanks him for his valuable contribution over the years. Don is pictured at a recent celebration of his birthday.



VALE RAY HESSE

The senior players wore black bands in the first game to honour the passing of Life Member Ray Hesse. Ray played football for Souths from 1952 to 1963, and played in the 1961 and 1962 B Grade Premierships, being Captain in 1962. Ray was an excellent player and mainly played A Grade. He was selected in several Port Augusta representative sides, including the famous draw against Whyalla in 1959. Ray served on the Management Committee from 1954 to 1963 and was Secretary for six years over this period. Ray supported the Club in recent times through the Vice Presidents Club, and lived in WA but



kept in touch with many club members. The Club honours Ray's contribution to the its history and sends its condolences to his family at this sad time.

VALE JOHN KERNAHAN SNR



Condolences to the Kernahan family on the recent passing of John Kernahan Snr, brother of Harry and uncle of Gary. John passed away recently aged 79 years. He played a handful of games with brother Harry, both starting their football at Port Augusta. John was renowned District cricketer before movina to Augusta. He played for South Augusta in the cricket and made the SA Country side which played the English Touring side in 1970/71, making 54 not out.

John was part of the South Augusta A Grade premiership team in 1969/70, captained by Billy Baker and in the 1970/71 season, he hit 162 in a match, with the club making the Preliminary Final that year. John captained the South Augusta A Grade side in 1971/72 and 1972/73, when he made 86 in the First Semi Final loss to West Augusta. John leaves behind wife Judith and their children Lorraine, Wendy and John. The Club offers its condolences to Gary, Carmen and family at this sad time.

SUNDROP FARMS

Sundrop Farms is back on board as sponsor in 2020.

In 2010 Sundrop Farms began operating its first pilot greenhouse facility in South Australia, near Port Augusta. The water once again comes from the Spencer Gulf, and is desalinated using a cutting edge thermal desalination plant.
