(1) Volunteer of the Year - Ricky Gill

The club is so proud to announce that Ricky Gill is a finalist for the Clubs SA Volunteer of the Year.

Ricky joined the volunteer group at SAFC, following his sons as they began their junior careers.

Ricky spent several seasons as our scoreboard attendant and as an U18 Goal Umpire. In 1999 he also became the U18 timekeeper. At the time, we had two senior timekeepers, but in 2001 they both quit. Ricky stepped up to fill the void in a case of one man replacing two. He has been our timekeeper ever since - for 21½ years. Ricky does four games every Saturday and it took a pandemic to interrupt his otherwise perfect attendance record.

We have worked out that 4 games each Saturday x 17 rounds + finals x 21.5 years totals around 1500 games that Ricky has kept time for! He is very well respected around the SGL and is often asked to mentor new volunteers from other clubs. Ricky is also often asked by the Spencer Gulf League to act as timekeeper in association games. He is a favourite among opposition timekeepers. His actions have brought the club much respect from outsiders, especially from opposition timekeepers. Ricky has gained great respect from them and all of us at SAFC.

Ricky is one of our most passionate club members. He wears his red and white bulldog heart on his sleeve and we wish him all the best in the finals process.

Gazza's GOSSIP

Gazza provides some club statistics in its 110th year which we hope you enjoy.

PREMIERSHIPS: SAFC have won 18 A Grade Premierships since 1912 in 1918, 1928, 1938, 1939, 1942, 1964, 1981, 1983, 1993, 1994, 2000, 2006, 2012, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020. The A Grade side has played in another 26 losing Grand Finals, which means they have played 44 Grand Finals in their 110 years. This is a 40% success rate with making it to the Grand Final in our history.

The A Grade's most recent Grand Final win in 2020 against Lions was our fifth Premiership in a row and equalled an SGL record with West Augusta. Since the SGL was formed in 1961, South Augusta has played in 23 Grand Finals, winning 13 Premierships and making a Grand Final on average every 3 years.

Since 1961 and the start of the SGL, we have finished in the finals 42 times in 60 years giving a 70% success rate of making the finals which will happen again this year. In the last 20 years we have finished in one of the top 3 positions 16 times. Souths have also won 27 B Grade Premierships since 1912, the last being in 2020.

Known as South's best ever Grand Final game, was in 1964 where there was a 12 team competition, coached by Trevor Searle, the father-in-law of past player Chris Struck and grandfather of past player Ryan Struck. They played Port in a nail-biting clash, where Souths came out on top by just 2 points! There have been over 220 players who have played in A Grade Premierships for the club. Out of all the players who played in any of the Premierships since 1993, 75% of these started their football careers playing juniors for South.

INDIVIDUAL HONOURS: Magarey Medallist recipient from 1938-1942, Jeff Pash played for South and participated in 2 Premierships. Ron Curyer won the Mail Medal in 1938 and 1939. He was a player in the Premiership sides for those years.

A Grade Madigan Medallists for South include Bill Virgo 1967 and 1969, Pat Hynes 1980, Craig Cock 1981, Shaun McLennan 1993, Keiron Keeler 2001, Ryan Struck 2010, Lee Schmidt 2012, Azriel Stuart 2018 and Darcy Kildea 2017 and 2019.

South Augusta players who have been the SGL leading goal kickers include Brendan Colson, Bradley Amos, Mick Vanvacas, David Shillabeer and Lionel Brown.

Kevin Harris holds South's record for winning the most Best and Fairest awards with 5 trophies.

Outstanding players for the club who have been nominated for the Port Augusta Anniversary Team include David Williams, Barry Stephenson, Rod Lamshed, Bill Virgo, Ray Hanrahan, Pat Hynes, Anthony Anno, Robert Rozee, Kevin Harris and Robert Farr.

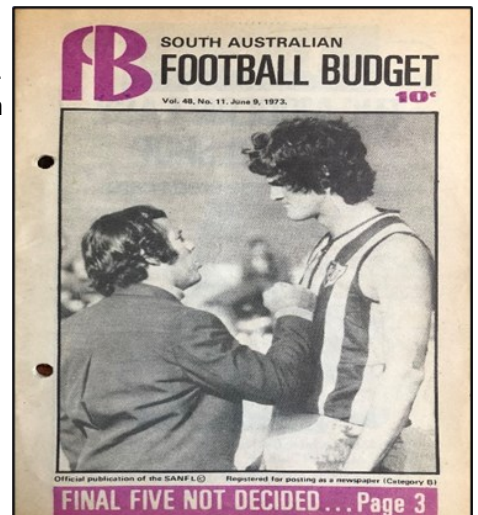

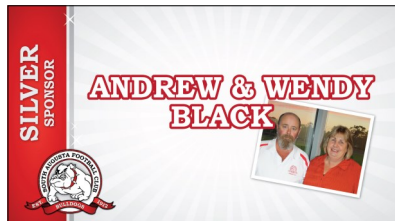
