For the third year running, our colts were given the opportunity to raise some funds at the recent Port Augusta Cup. Twenty-three volunteers consisting of both parents and colts were tasked with the collection of cans and bottles, along with the added role of monitoring the bathrooms, keeping the facility tidy throughout the day. All cans and bottles collected were taken into the recycling yard and cashed in. It was a long day for our volunteers - from 11:00am to 6:15pm. The kids received many compliments on how hard they worked and conducted themselves. In total \$1460 was raised for our colts compared to \$1545 last year, and \$1185 in 2021.

Gazza's GOSSIP

In this month's newsletter Gary Kittel discusses the 1940s in Part 2, the War Years....

South began the 1940 season promising much and rapidly settled down to hard football under the guidance of coach Lyle Reeves. Several juniors made their debut in 1939 and the club looked forward with confidence to the years ahead. The next decade, including the war years, brought limited success with only one Premiership in 1942. However, the club was very competitive, also playing in the Grand Finals in 1941, 1943, 1944 and 1949. West Augusta dominated the competition, winning six premierships during the period and Central Augusta three premierships from 1946-1949.

Officials who featured during this period included Jack Shinnick, who was President from 1940-1941; Norm Brealey who coached from 1940-1942 and 1945-1946, including the Premiership year; Ray Miller who coached from 1943-1944; Frank Rooney in 1947; and Ken Walkington in 1948 and 1949.

Jack McCorquodale served many years as Secretary, together with Bert Lehmann, former Whyalla News reporter Harry Nicholson as Treasurer and Harry Aldersey. Club Champions included Norm Brealey, Fred Woodforde, Roy McDonald, Keith Walkington, and ex-Magarey Medallist Jeff Pash.

The Port Augusta teams suffered greatly with lack of numbers during the war with one shining light for South being the recruitment of Jeff Pash (pictured), the 1939 Magarey Medallist who was a school teacher in town. Jeff Pash actually tied for the award in the first instance with West Adelaide's Ray McArthur, where upon the SANFL conducted a poll among all of the field umpires who had officiated in at least one match involving each player as a means of determining the winner that was Jeff Pash. Almost sixty years later, the SANFL awarded retrospective Magarey Medals to all players who had originally lost either on countback or by means of a vote of some kind, including Ray McArthur.

Jeff Pash played for South from 1941-1943 then he resumed with Norwood / North Adelaide combined team that won that year's flag. The resumption of full-scale league football the following year saw Jeff playing mainly across half forward or on a wing. Once his football career, which included four interstate appearances for South Australia, was over Jeff continued to provide sterling service to the sport he loved as a football writer for The News from 1950 to 1964.

In these war years, Port Augusta was a big railway hub and many good players came here for work. South did not have the same access to players as Central and West. Ray Miller, who played during this era, commented that there were many champions during that time including Norm Brealey who was a great player and exceptional high marker and hardman who captained coach three times including the 1942 Premiers. Norm was also the League Fairest and Best and two times Fairest and Best for South, playing all of the 1940s, and Life Member of the club. Norm has been inducted in South Augusta Hall of Fame for his service to the club.

Other players mentioned by Ray Miller included Keith Walkington, who was Captain Coach twice and Fairest and Best winner; Lyle Reeves who was a strong player; Pat Merrill; Eugene Barry; goal kicker Harry Nicholson; Jack Marshall; Reg Flanagan; Kevin Matthews; Pat Laragy and back pocket Jim Averis. Other players that impressed Ray were Jack Fullerton, Sid Zanker, Hube Zanker, Wally Rasmus, Frank Rooney, Ken Higginson and Frank (Squagger) Woodforde who also won a Fairest Best.
