FROM THE President

Secondly, what a great response from our players in making themselves available for the recent SGL vs Whyalla FL matches. You have done our club proud

Thirdly, the Round 6 game against Central Augusta very nearly did not happen. A lack of umpires was only solved by the diligent work of both clubs and the eventual finding of club volunteers to step up and take the whistle for the games, allowing players to play and spectators to spectate. Yet these CLUB people still got some abuse from over the fence. This is pathetic behaviour and does not go unnoticed. To those critics I say grab a whistle and show us how it is done. I have said it before IF you can't represent SAFC in an acceptable way please stay in your car (windows up) where no one can hear you. Consider staying home. Better still, zip your lip, support and thank these CLUB volunteers who are keeping SGL football viable and give you a game to watch each week. As if to prove my point, a very disturbing incident of umpire/spectator abuse by one of our valued members happened whilst they were watching the B Grade against Solomontown. Fortunately, it was quickly dealt with after information from Sollies officials was immediately brought to my attention. This is a perfect example when I ask all spectators to monitor each other and thus make a valuable contribution to the club by correcting people as necessary. 




Cazza's Gossip

Harold Bowman was transferred in his employment with the Commonwealth Railways from Quorn to Port Augusta in 1954.

He brought with him his lovely wife Doris, daughter Annette and three sons, John, Garth and Robert. The boys were introduced to South Augusta through Ray Miller who lived two doors down in Hobler Street, and Harold immediately joined the club as a member. During these early years, Annette was courted by and eventually married Harry Kernahan who played for South Augusta before moving to Adelaide to continue a long and wonderful football association with the Glenelg club.

Throughout Harold's initial years with South Augusta he mainly became active in the area of colts football where, at various times, he was a committee man, guernsey steward, sprigger, time keeper, team manager and/or whatever job had to be done.


In 1965 Harold moved into the club's senior Management Committee where he became involved in all aspects of the management of the club's licensed club



Harold was a mild, unassuming person who never lost his "cool" although there is a reported incident where he locked the umpires in their change room one day!

Harold was devoted to the sport and often offered his assistance to other clubs if he thought he could help in any way.

In 1975 he was awarded Life membership of South Augusta and until the time of his passing in 1980, he was totally dedicated to the betterment of the club. In 2010 Harold was posthumously inducted into the Port Augusta Football League Hall of Fame.


