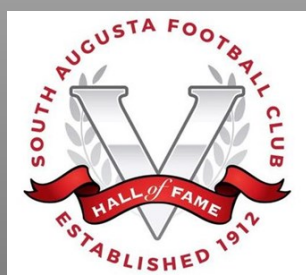

JODI LEE FOUNDATION EVENT.... TALKING SHIT

We were extremely proud to be chosen (as one of just four towns across the nation) by the Jodi Lee Foundation to host their Port Augusta event on 23rd June. When I read the following, "Souths on a Friday night has been repeatedly mentioned as the best place to connect with the Port Augusta community", written by Sydney based Hannah Devereux Co-founder and Director THEY who was I to disagree!

Rachel McKay, General Manager, Jodi Lee Foundation sent us the following feedback.. "The South Augusta Football Club was a fantastic place to host our main event in Port Augusta for the Talking Sh!t tour. The venue was the perfect spot for us to present our message and connect with the local community. The team at South Augusta Football Club were wonderful to deal with, so accommodating and they went above and beyond to make it seamless for us to host our event there. We sincerely thank all the staff and volunteers who helped out on the night. In partnership with the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care, the Jodi Lee Foundation is raising awareness and educating the community on the importance of doing the free Bowel Screening Kit when it arrives in the mail for 50-74 year olds. The Foundation is working with AFL legend Gavin Wanganeen to promote positive health and wellbeing messages, including regular bowel cancer screening tests. The Foundation covered dinner costs for all who attended which was followed by a Q&A with Gavin. For more information check out <https://jodileefoundation.org.au/>

JODI'S STORY

Jodi was complaining of constipation, abdominal pain and some bloating. Her doctor quickly recognised an obstruction in her bowel and ordered scans. Jodi had cancer and the tumour had all but blocked her bowel. She was only 39 but the cancer had spread to her lymph and liver. She passed away aged 41. She had no family history and no symptoms whatsoever, which is typical of bowel cancer. It could have had a different ending if her bowel cancer had been detected early. The Jodi Lee Foundation is now a leading voice for bowel cancer prevention. Each year they reach millions of Australians through national initiatives to raise awareness about bowel cancer which is the second leading cause of cancer-related death in Australia.

But it doesn't have to be. That's because, if detected in the early stages, it can be up to 90% treatable. Bowel cancer often develops without any symptoms, which is why screening is so important. Unfortunately, too many 50-74 year old Australians are ignoring this free, life-saving test when it arrives in the mail from the Australian Government every two years. The campaign aims to encourage Australians to take action to complete the test as soon as they can and send it back. Taking the test every two years dramatically increases the chances of early detection.

Gazza's GOSSIP

This month's newsletter sees Gazza focusing on footy in the 1940s, during the war years.

The Westside and Central Ovals were both used in 1940. Bill Applebee, Life Member and longest living member of the Club, indicated that the Westside Oval was shell grit at one end and fish shells the other. The Central Oval was just flat dirt. Footy boots had stops or sprigs removed and leather cleats were tacked on like rubber tractor treads. Today we take for granted the changing rooms, medical staff and everyday supply of electric heated hot water, etc. Up until the early '60s these ovals had boilers that had to be lit and stocked at each training or game for showers. The player most thought of and remembered with affection was Wally McManus, a coach and player in the '30s and trainer through the '50s and '60s. Wally is a Life Member and now South Augusta Hall of Famer.

Players in the 1940s such as Rex McRae, Eugene Barry, Tom Shinnick, Ray Hooper and H McConnell were South players whose names are now more related to other clubs. In the last forty years, it seemed to have turned around and football clubs are now organised institutions. Ray Miller mentioned that two exceptional local umpires in the 1940s were Jack Penglase and Ted Martlew, who made the game enjoyable to play.

Jack Fullerton interviewed in the 2000s and stated that clubs were not rich and social life was limited in the '30s and '40s. Often awards for players were quarts of beer and the like, and conditions were harsh with games on the hard gritty ovals. There was limited coaching and junior development programs, but players were generally fit and strong through boxing and cycling, which were popular; together with many players being occupied in hard working industries such as the railways and the wharf.

South began the 1940 season promising much and rapidly settled down to hard football under the guidance of coach Lyle Reeves. Several juniors had made their debut in 1939 and the club looked forward with confidence to the year ahead. The next decade, including the war years, brought limited success with only one premiership in 1942. However, the club was very competitive also playing in the Grand Finals in 1941, 1943, 1944 and 1949. South had better success in the Seconds, winning Premierships from 1946 to 1949.

Officials who featured during this period included Jack Shinnick who was President from 1940 to 1941, Norm Brealey who coached from 1940 to 1942 and 1945 to 1946, including the Premiership year. Ray Miller coached from 1943 to 1944, Frank Rooney 1947 and Ken Walkington 1948 to 1949. Jack McCorquodale served many years as Secretary, together with Bert Lehmann and Harry Nicholson as Treasurer. Club champions included Norm Brealey, Fred Woodforde, Ray McDonald, Ken Walkington and ex Magarey Medallist Jeff Pash.

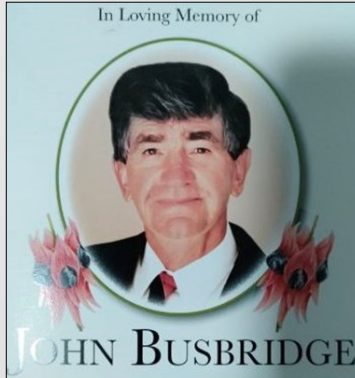
