FROM THE PRESIDENT

As valued members of SAFC, we thank you for your continued concern regarding Coronavirus. Your Management Committee met on Saturday and had an email hook up on Sunday night. Rest assured we are on the front foot on this matter. Last Friday's new regulations as announced by Scomo were strictly enforced. This involved measuring the clubroom in square metres, dividing by four and arriving at our clubroom limit. A doorperson was appointed to keep a count of people entering/leaving the club on Friday night. We were well under our limit at all times and thus we were easily compliant with the then current rules which then changed rapidly on Sunday night. Two non-negotiables were stated at the start of the meeting:

- SAFC will at all times comply with all instructions/regulations handed down from Federal and State governments/SANFL/SGL
- SAFC will have their members/players/staff health concerns as a number one priority

Thus we beat Scomo to the punch and decided to close the club until further notice, effective from 22nd March. Please stay safe for the duration of this event. Everyone has a role to play as does SAFC. We will continually monitor the situation and keep you informed of any updates regarding club re-opening, season start dates etc.

For your safety, I have taken the liberty to quote from Clubs SA thus:

The Coronavirus is spread from person to person through:

- Direct close contact with a person while they are infected;
- Close contact with a person with a confirmed infection who coughs or sneezes;
- Touching objects or surfaces (such as door handles or tables) contaminated via cough or sneeze from a person with the infection, and then touching your mouth or face.

Most infections are only transmitted by people when they have symptoms. These can include fever, a cough, sore throat, tiredness and shortness of breath. The spread of coronavirus can be prevented by practicing good hand and sneeze / cough hygiene by:

- Washing hands frequently with soap and water, before and after eating and toileting;
- Covering your cough and sneeze, dispose of tissues, and use alcohol based sanitiser;
- If unwell, avoid contact with others (stay more than 1.5 metres from people);
- If unwell people should not attend your club.

Anyone returning from overseas in the past 14 days, should not attend your club until the 14-day period has elapsed. Obviously, similar action applies to recently returned patrons who are experiencing flu-like symptoms."

The meeting also discussed the implication on staff, players, members and supporters of the current state of play (or no play) of the 2020 SGL and PACFL seasons and associated events. See the list of planned events that have either been cancelled or postponed.

On a lighter note, it is hats off to Claudia and AusKicker Henry Land for their magnificent efforts to raise funds for the Leukaemia Foundation. Claudia coloured her hair whilst Henry undertook the World's Greatest Shave courtesy of club legend Pat Hynes and co-captain Caleb Ritter. This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It does NOT replace club membership which ALL senior players are required to take out and all junior families are requested to take out.

CENTRAL OVAL UPDATE

A meeting with Port Augusta City Council last week was reassuring to confirm that the Central Oval surface is on target for the upcoming season. All indicators such as root growth etc. are positive.

- Laying of turf at Central Oval is 100% complete and is progressing well
- Irrigation is completed and the system is currently being tested so it can be utilised with both non-potable and potable water supplies
- Rolling and top dressing of the oval surface has been completed
- The newly laid turf has caused increased bird activity with some minor turf impact
- They are currently in discussion with both the Contractor and Turf Consultant, regarding top dressing and fertilising turf areas, which will limit bird activity
- Works are on target to be finalised by mid-March and the Oval is expected to be available to the public by the end of April 2020

If there is a silver lining to the current crisis it is that the oval will get at least an extra six weeks free of football.

One Friday night recently a new family came into the club and a man was seen looking at the Honour Board, taking photos etc. When approached by a couple of club members, he indicated that he was taking photos of the board where his father had been mentioned. His father was Keith Walkington who had Captain/Coached the team and won the Fairest and Best in 1948. Keith's son, Greg Walkington, indicated that Keith's name was put down as "Ken" on the Board. "Whoops" - a minor mistake that we will deal with and get updated as soon as possible.

Greg indicated that Keith was working for Elder Smiths as a stock agent whilst in Port Augusta. He knew the area well and served with the Army Ttransport section during the war, driving the track from Adelaide to Alice Springs. He played a couple of games for Norwood-North during that time and Greg remembered Keith telling him about his major disappointment in losing a Grand Final whilst with South Augusta when the umpire was Hayden Bunton Snr and Keith felt he favoured the other team. Keith became great friends with Peter Young (his godfather) and in 1955 went to work for Young's Ltd managing the Oodnadatta store until 1960. Prior to the war Keith played for Snowtown and after South's, Eudunda before we went to Oodnadatta . Keith died aged 55 in 1977.

Records indicate that Keith played at least three seasons for the club, high up in the best players for the club over that time and took over the job of Captain/Coach for Souths, just falling short of a premiership in 1948. Keith was named in the best players in most of the finals he played in and amazingly Bill Applebee was in that team - still alive and kicking! BASKETBALL UPDATE

As with many other sports, the Port Augusta Basketball Association season ended abruptly due to Coronavirus precautionary measures, after only a small number of modified finals were able to be played. The finals schedule was made up with only 1st vs 2nd playing as the Grand Final, and all other Semi Finals were cancelled.

In the B Grade, Souths White finished in fifth place, with ten wins for the season; and Souths Red in fourth place with eleven wins. Souths Red were denied the opportunity to play their Semi Final, and the Grand Final in that grade was eventually cancelled also. Darcy Kildea (South White) finished the season as the third highest points scorer with 194 points; Josh Forrest (South Red) finished fourth with 180 points; and Trent Ritter fifth with 170 points.
