All intending players must be registered on the club site on PlayHQ to be eligible for selection. The SANFL Player Registration Payment of \$20 seniors / \$15 juniors must be paid when registering. Every player at every club in SA will have to pay this so it is basically no pay, no play.

This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. SAFC membership is also added as a separate fee during the registration process (see attachment for instructions).

## SGL SEASON UPDATE

Current COVID-19 requirements means there is still a need to keep match day crowds below 1000 at any of the football and netball match days. Thus, again this season U15 games between the three Port Augusta clubs will be played at Central Oval on Friday evenings. At the February SGL Board meeting the following issues arose:

1) Yellow / Red cards that have applied at U15 and U18 level for a few years will now be introduced to A Grade and B Grade.

- One yellow = 15 playing minutes off the field with no replacement
- Two yellows in the same game = sent off for rest of game (can be replaced) and one game suspension
- A red in a game = two yellows
- Four yellows over the season = one game suspension
- Each subsequent yellow = automatic one game suspension

2) Melee Rule - yellow and red cards can be applied to offenders in a melee. If melee is during the game, umpire calls "melee" out three times, allowing players time to disperse. If no dispersal, then the clubs can be fined first offence \$200, subsequent offences \$400 each. If melee is after the game, clubs fined \$500 for first offence, subsequent offences \$750 each.

3) Entry fees up by \$1 - Adult \$8; Early Bird fee up 50c to \$5

4) In another SAFC player initiative, we have approval to wear RU OK orange socks versus Port in Round 14 on 6th August. It was also suggested it become a permanent round in 2023, in a case of SAFC setting the standards yet again.

Our first pre-season trial game versus Crystal Brook was held last Saturday. Our return bout against Central Whyalla takes place at Central Oval this Sunday 3rd April at 12:00 noon. 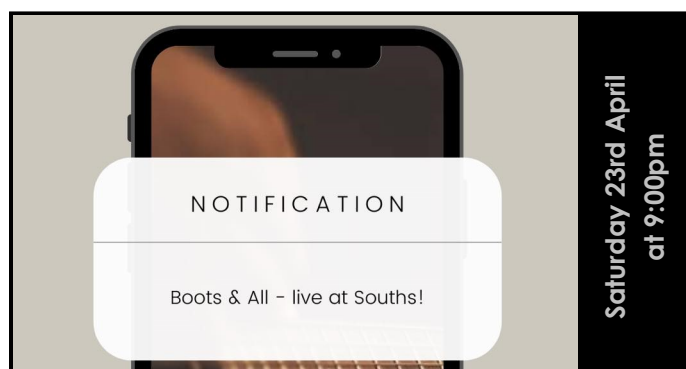

## Gazza's GOSSIP

This month Gazza focusses on the career of Brian Fountain, one of the finest footballers to play for South Augusta. A Life Member, Brian played over 150 games from 1945 to 1962.

In 1945 he was named best player in the B Grade Premiership and in 1946 was also best when South won the B Grade Premiership 7.12 to West Augusta 5.5. Brian quickly progressed to A Grade and was in the best in 1949 when South were defeated in the A Grade Grand Final against West Augusta 12.6 to 6.10. In 1950 South lost another Grand Final to West Augusta and Brian was again named in the best players as was the case in the 1952 A Grade Grand Final, when they lost to Central Augusta.

1953 saw another Grand Final loss to Central Augusta. Brian was named second best, having had a great season finishing third in the Association W Milhinch Trophy (chosen by The Transcontinental), and the Mail Medal in the Great Northern Football League (equivalent to Madigan Medal today). He was named South Augusta's best placed player.

In 1954 South lost yet another grand final to Central Augusta, this time by 1 point. With a minute to go, South had the ball in the goal square. The Central Augusta ruckman grabbed the South coach Bob Bishop and threw him into the goal post breaking his jaw. Because Bob could not take the free kick the ball was then bounced, as was the rule at the time. Central Augusta cleared the ball from the goal square and the siren sounded, devastating the whole team and club. Brian was again named in the best players as South again fell short in the premierships race. In fact, from 1942 to 1964 South did not win a premiership, and if anyone deserved one it was Brian Fountain.

Brian served on the Management Committee. He was sadly taken away from the Fountain and South Augusta families when he was hit by a motor vehicle when crossing the road in front of his home, as he was heading to a Committee Meeting at Conroy Street. He will be remembered as one of the greats of the South Augusta Football Club.

## SOUTH AUGUSTA IN OTHER SPORTS



South Augusta won the 2021-22 A Grade Cricket Premiership with a 23 run win over Central Augusta in a low scoring affair. These teams last played a Grand Final 44 years ago in 1978, when Centrals won. Conditions were very hot, so South had no hesitation in batting first when they won the toss.

Central restricted South to 9/108 thanks to tight bowling by all of its bowlers, including Cameron Edson 2/17, Will Tucker 2/7, Kristopher Crabbe 2/28, Robbie McDonald 1/11 and Drew McDonald 1/27. South's only contributors with the bat were Rex Waterworth (43 in nearly 2 hours in a great effort) and Ben Trewartha with a late hitting 18.

South had the runs on the board and with the slow outfield it was not going to be easy, however they needed early wickets. South took two early wickets including the valuable scalp of Drew McDonald, the Association Medallist, for a duck. Central steadied and put on 26 more runs when they lost two more wickets at 39 with Robbie McDonald and Subramanian departing. A 20 run partnership between Khan and Crabbe took the score to 59 however wickets were taken consistently after that, and Centrals were dismissed for 85, 23 runs short of South's total.

Best bats for Centrals were Subramanian 18, Robbie McDonald and Kristopher Crabbe with 13 runs. Best bowling for Souths was Craig Shirley with 4/7, Clayton Parkinson 2/15 and Cameron Parkinson with 2/27. Aaron Vater 1/13 and Will Waterworth 1/6 were also very tight in a consistent bowling effort. Craig Shirley was awarded Man of the Match by the umpires.

Association Trophies went to Liam Bury for the Bowling Aggregate and Cameron Parkinson for the Bowling Average in A Grade.



In the Under 17s Grand Final, Central Augusta avenged the A Grade loss by defeating South Augusta. Central batted first in hot conditions and put on 4/184 with Joe Keenan 58, Jack Clark 60 and Harrison Dunneman 31. In reply, South could only manage 75 runs with best bats Whalley Yates 28 and Vaughan Yates 18. Best bowlers for South were Addyson Di Paulo 2/30 and for Centrals Max Grover 4/13 and Tom Freebairn 3/18.



In the Under 14s Grand Final, South Augusta 4/179 defeated Central Augusta 140. South batted first with runs to Campbell Crombie 67, Leo McInnis 50 and Addyson DiPaolo 20.
