Dear Patrons

Due to rising costs we have taken the step to increase prices across the Club.

It is a decision we have not taken lightly, in some cases our costs have risen over 70%, it is a case of rising costs against steady or falling margins.

As part of this review, it was highlighted that we have not set higher prices for a considerable time.

In an effort to relieve some of the burden of increasing costs to our members, we will introduce a discounted rate for our members across a range of goods. The discounted rate will vary, but generally may be in the vicinity of 10% or so. To receive a discounted rate the member will be required to show their membership card.

It is estimated the price increase will occur from 15th April, 2023. Until then it's business as usual and we hope that you continue to enjoy the hospitality our great Club offers.

You are needed to join the Red Army to spread the load and share in the rewards of volunteering.




It seems from this picture that our President may need to avail himself to some parking lessons from Club member and driving instructor, Carmen Kernahan of Carlton Driving School.

Cazza's Gossip

In this month's newsletter Gazza Kittel focusses on the life and history of Stan Burk and family.



Stan (pictured, left) and former wife Dawn (nee Khan) had two sons and two daughters. Chris played for South from 1985 to 1987 and Greg Played for South from 1971 to 1972, both coming through South's junior system. Greg played in the 1972 B Grade Premiership. Daughter Linley was a dedicated netballer and this year was elected Town Mayor. Linley's husband Rick Shine is a Life Member of the Port Augusta Racing Club and he still likes the social club, mixing with the public and helping with the busy bees. Karen is a resident of Marree, where she has been living for a number of years.

Football: Stan played for South Augusta from 1959 to 1964 and he played as a

ruckman in the 1964 A Grade Premiership side (pictured, right). With a disheartening 33 point deficit at half time, South fought back magnificently to score a memorious win. This was the first Premiership in the SGL by a Port Augusta team and without the lionhearted effort of Stan Burk, this win would not have been achieved.



Swimming: Stan was a member of the Port Augusta Swimming Club and for many years he entered the swim through which was the long distance swimming event of the year. Stan had success winning the event and he also trained and coached local swimmers in the club.

Boxing: Stan had a great boxing record and held a title in the Armed Forces when he was in the Navy. Stan and brother Jim were valuable members of the Port Augusta Boxing Club.

Dancing: Stan and his partner entered the marathon dancing contest in Port Augusta. It took them all night to win the contest as the last couple standing wins, and Stan also had a big heart on the dance floor!

Marriage: In later years Stan married Val Maule, the late wife of Jock Maule, a Life Member of the South Augusta Football Club. Stan and Val cared for each other Val's passing. Due to declining health, Stan is a resident of Ramsay Village.

Fishing: Stan and brother Jim were local fisherman for years and had many good catches. I'm sure they have many stories to tell. Both were shack owners.

Employment: After Stan left the Navy, he joined the Railways and he gained positions as a shunter and Guard on the Transcontinental Line and the East West Line.

That concludes the story on Stan Burk, a proud person, and it was a pleasure that he was involved with the South Augusta Football Club and other sporting clubs in Port Augusta.

BILLY'S CORNER





Sad news to hear about the recent passing of two past players for the club - Eric Poole and Max Polmear.

Eric Poole (pictured, above left) played for the club from 1958 to 1959 after moving from Quorn when the Railways closed in the town. Eric moved to Stirling North Railway Siding where he lived until his recent death. Eric played 20-30 games mainly in A Grade and was known as a determined player, mainly in the backlines where he impressed when the club didn't have a great deal of success. He was awarded Most Determined Trophy in 1958 and was amongst the best players that year. Eric later left football to play tennis where he played at Stirling and later All Saints at the highest level. He later coached tennis juniors, with his three daughters all being accomplished players. Condolences to Molly and daughters, Angela, Melody and Lisa and their families at this sad time.

Max Polmear (pictured, bottom left) played senior football in the same era in 1958, however he only played 1 year of senior football before he moved to Adelaide. Max played all his junior football at Souths and was known as a promising A Grade. He played in juniors with John Uma and Billy Baker and Gary Kittel says that if he had stayed on, he would have been part of the 1964 A Grade Premiership and he was a skilful forward with a high mark and plenty of speed. Condolences to Max's family at this sad time.

The Bulldog Maulers (pictured, right) took out both the Division 1 and Division 2 Premierships in the Twilight Tennis competition which concluded recently. The teams were made up of current South Football players, ex-players and parents of players, the current B Grade Coach and even a Junior Coach from another team who found it hard to wear the South colours on the night! The team was created over 10 years ago by current club sponsor Mark Maule, thus the name Maulers.

Although Doug Morton was not involved with Souths, his involvement with sports and community work needs to be mentioned. Doug moved from Kalgoorlie and obtained work in the Railways where he later became involved in the Union movement assisting thousands of workers who worked in the town, including many Southies. Doug was involved with football at Wests, swimming and community groups, volunteering many hours to good causes. It was sad to hear of his recent passing and condolences to his wife and family.



Recently caught up with past South cricketer and A Grade Premiership player Paul Trzeciak and his wife Sue, together with Sue's mum Anne in Adelaide (pictured, below left). Upon speaking with Anne it was discovered that Anne's great uncle, Jim Holdsworth, was a pioneer of Port Augusta, serving as Town Clerk in the Council from 1888 to 1930, a total of 42 years in the role. In that time Port Augusta grew rapidly from a small town of 2000 to a large town with the commencement of the Railways as a major industry. It was also discovered that Jim had a son called Jim or James who was Captain of South Augusta's first ever Premiership in 1918 and played for South in its first ever team in 1912. Sue and Anne were South Augusta royalty and for some reason Sue didn't know this when she lived in the town for 20 years before moving to Adelaide.

Paul, her husband, played for South in cricket and their three sons all played for South. There must have been something forcing them to play for the club and I reckon Jim might have had something to do with it after all these years!!

DRINKS VAN ON THE HILL PROJECT

The South Augusta Football Club plans to purchase a second-hand van (similar to that pictured below) to locate on the hill at Central Oval for use during the games. The van will allow spectators to purchase drinks at a better location, thus increasing revenue, with profits to go towards Football development. The project will also allow better access to people to refreshments at the local football.

The drinks van will also be used on big occasions such as Past Players and Officials Days, Family events during the year and can be loaned out to charity organisations.

The van will also provide an opportunity for spectators to meet on the hill, cheer on the team and be heard rather than behind the glass upstairs.

CRICKET UPDATE

What a way to finish the cricket season with Premierships in both the A Grade and under 13s!

The A grade went into the game as underdogs against Quorn, but fortunately won the toss and elected to bat. After a cautious start that saw the in-form Sam Maule go early, Will Waterworth and Todd Kernahan built a steady partnership of 39 before Will fell LBW. The wickets of Kernahan and Shirley fell in quick succession to leave us in trouble at 4/52.

This left young guns Rex Waterworth and Rowan Irvine with the task of rebuilding the innings, which they did with maturity and skill, and when Rex was dismissed for 29 they had put on 52 and set the innings up for the big hitters at the end. Rowan followed a few runs later for a well-made 29, then Travis McNamee was caught on the fence trying to get quick runs. Billy-Jo Russell joined skipper Ben Trewartha at the crease and this saw the scoring rate increase, a huge six into the bowling green from the skipper then two onto the mound in front of the bar from "Boom Boom" Billy saw the total end at a very competitive 150.

It was always going to be a task to contain the highly talented Quorn batting line up. Despite some tight bowling early from Clayton Parkinson, Will Waterworth and Travis McNamee, we couldn't make a breakthrough. The skipper then tossed the ball to Grand Final specialist Craig Shirley who quickly claimed two wickets, including that of the opposition skipper for a duck.

Quorn were rebuilding before a great bit of fielding from Todd Kernahan and Sam Maule forced a run out and when Cameron Parkinson accepted a hot return catch from Quorn's in-form opener Liam Bury, the game was leaning our way. Two good outfield catches from Rex Waterworth and Shirls, and a return spell of 3 wickets from Craig Shirley, then Will Waterworth, went straight through the defence of their number nine. When Clayton Parkinson took an incredible return catch, the game was all over and we were back-to-back Premiers - this time by 29 runs.

Craig Shirley was named Man of the Match for his figures of 5/32. Incredibly this was Craig's third Man of the Match from our last three premierships - a magnificent achievement.

The win was a great team effort with every player contributing something on the day. The leadership of Captain Ben Trewartha must be acknowledged as he has moulded a close-knit team of lads who love playing cricket together.

South had won back-to-back Premierships for the first time since 1990/91 under Captain Robert Rozee, and it comes in the club's 60th year, also celebrating anniversary Premierships from 1992/93 (30 years ago) and 2012/13 (10 years ago).
