

Cazza's Gossip

This month Gary Kittel mentions two of South Augusta's greats in Wally McManus and his mate Alec Holmes

Alec Holmes

Alec Holmes was involved with South Augusta as a sprigger in the 30's and 50's. He was a sprigger in the 1939-38-42 Premiership teams and in 1939 he was involved with South Augusta's 4th Premiership.

Best players in that game were Harry Nicholson (former sport news writer for the Whyalla News), Reg Flanagan, John Fullerton (father of Jack Fullerton), Harry Burton, Jimmy Gosgrove, Lyle Reeves and Ron Curyer.

Alec, with the club at heart would ride his bike to Stirling North to collect oranges from an orchard farm so the players could enjoy them at half time. Alec was a quiet man, kept to himself but dedicated to his great mate Wally McManus and the Club.

Wally McManus

Wally McManus played for South Augusta 1927-1935. Wally was appointed A Grade coach from 1928-1929 and was also captain in those years. South went top in 1928 and 4th in 1929.


Fairest and Best in 1928 was J. McGarry and in 1929 the Fairest and Best was Cliff Herbert (father of Bob Herbert who played in 3 B Grade Premierships in a row from 1960-1962 and was captain of 1963 seconds).

In the 1928 Port Augusta – Quorn Association South were A Grade Premiers South Augusta 4-7 (31) to West 3-9 (27). Best players in the Grand Final were L. Bolitho, (father to Trevor (Rigger) Bolitho and Great Grandfather to Will Bolitho), Martin Zanker, J. McGarry, Clarrie Dunne (brother-in-law to Les and Sue Kittel) and other players named best were Perry Tamblyn and B. Collings. Dave Barry was Club President, Captain W. McManus.

This is the second premiership for the club with South also winning the seconds premiership v Stirling North that year. The B Grade captain was former mayor of Port Augusta in Lin Riches. Wally McManus was made Life Member of the club in 1953 and served the club as a trainer and head trainer from 1950-1963 a total of 13 years' service. Recently Wally was inducted into South Augusta's Hall of Fame. In closing South Augusta will never

forget the characters of our great club and the service of Wally McManus and his great mate Alec Holmes, players and officials during that era and the tireless workers.

Bob Miller, ex South Augusta footballer from the 1950's and only one of the two surviving members of the 1953 B Grade Premiership supplied a poem to the Bulldog Bulletin on his thoughts on the game today and when he played. Bob turns 90 next year and we thank him for his contribution.

FOOTBALL

(According to Bob Miller)

Australians have a game they invented. It is called Australian Rules.

The public following is probably more than expected. Other countries say lack of protection makes us fools.

In the early days it was a lot slower with slow hand passes and drop kicks. Players were told to keep to their position. If you wandered too far you could be in a fix.

However, there were players with exceptional skill at both kicking and moving the ball. Sometimes they left us as if we were running uphill.

Most were, unlike me, quite tall.

What a pleasure it was to watch players so good, kick pass, pinpoint and to the chest of another. In those days the hand pass was done as it should, if it failed then you were in bother.

Whilst the game was a lot slower, the abilities were admired by all.

When the flick pass was used the call was "thrower" and the common call like now was "ball"

The socialising after the game was good around a keg in the sandhills.

No animosity between clubs was understood although on Monday morning some were a bit ill!

We wore ankle high boots with sprigs of leather. The umpire checked the boots before the game. If a problem, to the sprigger we were sent to put them together. Some regular offenders I could name.

Before the game starts "two bob" was collected to pay for insurance. In other words, we paid to play. We did not regard this as an offence

but we really did not have any say.

To wash and mend our jumpers "oh" what a collection. Ladies of the club were rostered each week and most ladies did so with affection.

What a sight, a line of red and white, no better could you seek

The Ladie's Committee was energetic and keen. From a stall on game days with food of good taste. Clubhouse dinners, some of the best we had seen, obviously all made with no great haste.

The beauty of the game has brought all types together. Everyone was equal and played for a reason. No matter the conditions, we played in all weather to gain the ultimate, to win the flag at the end of the season.

There was a time suburban football was the main league. With all clubs there was a great tradition. The pleasure derived from the spectacle was of high degree. Barracking for our team to finish in a high position.

Now we have the commercial AFL. To some followers of the game it is a hard sell. With claims they want the game to be completely national.

For sure it is professional, not hard to tell.

Whatever level we follow it is with a passion. Although we love it as our national game. AFL controlled firmly by television. Most of us consider that to be a great shame.

In the team were South players David Schooling and past player Terry Smith plus several South members.


In Division 1, South were less successful losing in the final when they were also going for back-to-back.




