GOOD SPORTS GAME READY ROUND 3/5/25

Good Sports is a free Australia-wide program building stronger community sporting clubs.

Good Sports supports and inspires clubs to set up a better environment for players, volunteers, supporters and officials. For over 25 years, it has helped clubs tackle tricky topics such as alcohol, drugs, smoking, mental health and safe transport. The program is run by the Alcohol and Drug Foundation (ADF), an independent and not for profit organisation, funded by state and federal governments. The ADF is committed to building strong communities and minimising the harm caused by alcohol and other drugs. Join us as we take a stand against drink driving with the Game Ready Round. This round is a powerful way for the sporting community to raise awareness of the importance of staying safe on the roads. Clubs have the power to save lives.

We aim to show our members and our community loud and clear where SAFC stands on drink driving by promoting this theme in Round 2 against Sollies on May 3rd.

Why is this important?

- Drink driving makes up over 30% of the fatal road toll in Australia, with over 1 in 4 drivers and passengers killed showing a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) over the legal limit.
- In the last five years, 41% of all drivers and motorcyclists killed (who were tested) had drugs in their system.
- We know the stats are even more concerning in regional areas. 55% of road crash deaths occur in regional areas of Australia, where many clubs are located far from members' homes.
- Even one death on our roads is too many.
- The combination of risky alcohol consumption on club premises and the need to travel home makes community sports clubs a particularly high risk setting for drink driving.

And drink driving is still common. A third of young adult club members said they drove home after drinking five or more standard drinks.

The Game Ready Round is funded by the Australian Government through the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts.

As early as 1937 a Ladies Committee existed holding regular dances on a Thursday evening in the Parish Hall. Records show they sold afternoon tea at all matches at Central Oval to raise funds for the club.

The President was H T M Luke.

Later in the mid 1950's & early 1960's women were asked to organise 21st birthdays, engagements and weddings as they were seen to be very profitable events for the clubs. Players teas became more than the old BBQ or pastie night, so again the ladies were asked to lend a hand. Catering for visiting teams lunches and dinners.

Their fundraising activities were encouraged by the men, running raffles, setting up food stalls and canteens at Central Oval.

The Ladies Committee of the 1960's included: President J Gallagher, Secretary M Hesse, Treasurer J Moore, Committee members, Mrs Kohler, J Black, Mrs A Clancy, Mrs Ledger, Mrs Brandle, Mrs E Kernahan, Mrs Main, Mrs Laragy (Adelaide).

A list of cooks and helpers who were called upon as required. Records and comments on every event were well documented, right up to 1996. An example of this were the notes taken for Bill Virgo and Margaret Brown's wedding on 4th March, 1967 for 140 guests. The catering list read like this:

Four turkeys, twelve crayfish, three pounds of mincemeat, five tins of fish, baked beans and frankfurters, two pounds of Polish sausage, twelve dozen cocktail pasties, twelve dozen sausage rolls, six loaves of sliced bread, celery, lettuce, tomatoes, radishes, apples, bananas, oranges, lemons, three gallons of ice-cream, tea and coffee.

The ladies charged fifteen shillings (\$1.50) per head for weddings, seventeen shillings and sixpence (\$1.75) per head with crayfish and twelve shillings and sixpence(\$1.25) for 21st birthdays.




Kath Williams just sat inside the front door of the clubrooms with a raffle book in one hand and a menacing walking stick in the other. No one was game enough to walk past without buying at least one ticket.

Apart from food stalls they also catered for the wonderful Red & White Ball over the years. A tradition that still continues to this day.

The food stall at Central Oval and from records kept from 1973 showed that an average of 35 dozen pies and pasties were sold during a game.

Through the years the level of dedication from one of our Life Members and inaugural Hall of Fame recipient has been incredible. He can still be found fossicking around in the kitchen at Racing Tip and Footy Tip shows. Harry Waterworth, made salads and soup, among many other dishes on his own for many years as Head Caterer for Souths.

Our gratitude is immeasurable!

Harry is pictured here keeping well hydrated while he goes about preparing for another event.

Trevor and Joylene White became the head caterers along with volunteer helpers on Friday nights and functions. It is estimated that over 4,000 meals were served each year with the Friday night teas, players teas after the games and functions during the year. Trevor and Joylene didn't continue after the shift to the Central Oval.

Harry took up the challenge again and made the salads when we first arrived at Central Oval. Since then it has been a progression of volunteers that have stepped up to ensure meals on a Thursday, Friday night & events stay at the level of quality the club has been striving for all these years.



Over the years the club has helped fundraise through catering outside of the normal players teas, Friday night teas, and the Red & White Ball. For example, a Parma for a Farmer Night and the HOG Rally to name two. The HOG Rally in particular was an enormous task and we were ably led by Chef Brad Kenny and volunteers that went above and beyond to make it a successful event.

Over 3 days there were breakfasts and dinners served for approximately 350 people. It was a phenomenal effort and the club received extraordinary feedback from the organisers. There have been Christmas shows, Probus Dinners and Graduations that are repeat bookings each year because of the level of service and quality of the meals served on the night. South Augusta Football Club is indebted to the efforts of those who continually step up to help. Judith Barnett, our Catering Coordinator is the first contact for any bookings and from then the call goes out to volunteers for donations of time, and goods where possible. Keep a look out for any requests as they arise. Jasmine Barnett & Trish Waterworth with helpers Willow Williams and Jarrod Waterworth have been doing delicious meals on Thursday nights to encourage patrons to come to the club. A dedicated group of ladies and occasionally men, make the fresh salads you see in the bain-marie each week. Our fantastic Friday Night Tea Roster keeps everyone fed on a Friday night.



Football clubs are extremely diverse and made up of many characters. Some Footballers enjoy the privilege of playing in premiership teams while some never enjoy that honour. Many clubs have players and supporters who for a variety of reasons never receive any notable rewards or allocates. There are some people within the club who are missed when they are gone – that little job that was always done is now no more. We have tried to recognise many of the characters in South's who did not receive any club or association awards but contributed in many ways to make South's successful with premierships, Fairest and Best, Madigan Medals, and Transcontinental Medals.



Craig Cock—Craig was transferred to Port Augusta in 1981 during John Ried era and had an immediate impact at the club with his enormous work ethic and fitness. His vast experience at South Adelaide and a number of strong country leagues was invaluable to the emerging young talent at the club. He was a premiership player in 1981 and 1983 and won the Madigan and Transcontinental Medals in 1981. Craig retired from football after the 1984 Grand Final loss.

Dwayne Crombie—Dwayne commenced his football career with South's in 1988, playing in the under 14's-16's and 18's before moving to Adelaide for employment. He returned to the club and had success in the 1994 premiership team, where he was awarded the medal for best on ground in the grand final. He also played in the 2006 League premiership and was again one of the best players. Regarded as a good player in big games. Dwayne was still playing for the club in 2012. Dwayne Crombie's playing career commenced in 1993-2012.

Andrew Magarey—Andrew commenced his association with the club in 1986 as a player and has been involved ever since in many behind the scenes activities. He has been coach or assistant coach from under 9 to under 15 level, runner for 18's since 2008, and often runner for the seconds. 


