After five matches, the A Grade has not had the best of starts with one win and four losses. However, the B Grade has performed well with four wins; and the Under 18s had a great win last week against Sollies.

The loss of at least nine players from last year's A Grade Grand Final win will mean that it will take awhile for new players to find their feet and, with a few recent injuries, the club will be tested in its depth. However, this will create opportunities for those who aspire to play at the higher level. The second half against the undefeated Sollies showed a lot of promise.

The next few matches include an important one on Saturday against Ports (at Port Oval); against Lions (at Central Oval) on 5th June; the SGL v Whyalla FL game (in Port Pirie) on 12th June; against Central Augusta (at ETSA Oval) on 19th June; and against West Augusta (at Central Oval) on 26th June.

FROM THE President

It has been an extremely sad and stressful time for all involved at SAFC. I would just like to include an update of my statement dated 15th May and ask that we look out for each other as we prepare for a huge funeral on Friday 4th June.

STATEMENT FROM SAFC (updated)

All at South Augusta Football Club were shocked to the core upon learning of the devastating loss of our past player, coach and mentor for our indigenous players. Words fail to express the loss we at SAFC feel, and feel for the family. A great loss also to the Port Augusta community and especially to SAPOL. We have worked very closely and carefully with the family to respond in a culturally sensitive way which explains our delay in posting our original statement. The one-minute silence observed at the South v West match was our first chance to grieve publicly as a club and community. Many in attendance took the invitation to line the oval boundary to join in this tribute. Players, umpires, officials, SAPOL colleagues and Quorn Wolves joined the tribute by lining the centre square. This is a very hard time for all who knew him and, of course, all family members. On behalf of all at SAFC we pass on our deepest sympathy to all family members. To all affected by this loss please look out for each other as we travel this extremely painful time.

A brief look at his contribution to SAFC shows:

- Joined the club from Quorn Wolves in 2003 after playing for South Augusta in the Colts
- After playing in the middle when he first started, he moved to full forward and was invaluable in our success with his accurate kick for goal and quick recovery, beating most opponents
- He retired after playing a few games in 2017 with 108 A Grade games and 17 B Grade games
- In 2005, he kicked 4 goals in the Grand Final loss to West Augusta for a total of 39 goals for the season
- In 2006, South won 12 games in a row to win the Premiership after a poor start to the season.
- In 2006, he kicked 12 goals against Quorn/Wolves
- In the 2006 finals, he kicked 7 goals in the first Semi Final; 11 goals in the Preliminary Final (against Port when South won 28.15 to 7.9); and kicked 7 goals, 5 behinds in the Grand Final against Central for a total of 25 goals in the three finals games, which played a huge part of the Premiership win, with a total of 79 goals for the season
- He was named Best Player in the Preliminary Final and in the Best 5 Players in the Grand Final and deservedly won the Fairest and Best for the Club
- In 2007, he kicked 106 goals for the year, the first South player to kick 100+ goals in a season
- That year, he made the Port Augusta Team of the Year, Northern Cities Team and Team of the Carnival
- In 2008, he kicked 21 goals, missing a few games through injury but captained the Port Augusta team which won the State Aboriginal Championships
- In 2012, he played in the losing B Grade Grand Final against Lions
- In 2015, he coached the South Augusta Under 15s to a Premiership
- He made the SGL Team on several occasions
- He also served on the Football Committee for 1-2 years and continued to mentor the younger indigenous players after he retired

All who attend games at Port Augusta Council ovals are requested to take better care of the oval environments especially with regards to disposing of rubbish. Please either use the bins or take it home with you.


We would also like you to intervene if you see patrons (especially children) running or loitering within the club balconies or stairs and using the lifts. Many hands / voices make it easier for all of us.

PLAYER MILESTONES

Great to see Sam Maule play his 100th A Grade game recently. Sam played in the three Premierships from 2016 to 2018 in the backlines, wing or on the ball and we welcome him back to the club this year after a stint at West Whyalla.

Chris Heron recently followed up his 200 SGL game milestone with his 250th club game, made up of 202 A Grade games and 48 B Grade games.





Kyle Aitken (pictured left) played his 50th A Grade game recently, including three A Grade Premierships in 2018, 2019 and 2020. He plays mostly as a wingman but more recently in the forward lines. Kyle has played most of 2018-2020 in A Grade, following a stellar year in B Grade in 2016, and playing a handful of A Grade games in 2017. Kyle has pace to burn and can set games alight on the wing. He has a bright future with the club and has become a permanent member of the A Grade team.

Dylan Barnett recently played his 100th club game. Dylan debuted in 2013 and started his career mostly on the wing. He is now a strong defender. After some time in the B Grade, he has knuckled down and regained his proper place in the A Grade side. Dylan's achievements include A Grade premiership player from 2016, 2017 and 2018; B Grade premiership player in 2015 and 2020; B Grade Fairest and Best Player in 2019 and 2020; and Best First Year Player in 2016.

Ethan Gade and Micheal Collins made their A Grade debuts last week against Sollies. Both players, who have come up through the juniors, picked up several touches.

On the other side of the ledger, B Grade coach Matt Phillis played his first game since 2015 last week. Matt has now played 5 A Grade games and 68 B Grade games and its great to see him back at the club after a few years away.



Jack Menzies (pictured left) plays his 100th senior game this week, which includes 25 A Grade games plus 74 B Grade games. Jack came up through the South juniors and started playing senior football in 2011. He moved to Adelaide for 4 years to study to be a teacher and returned to work at Port Augusta West Primary School. He has played in the 2018 and 2020 B Grade Premierships. Jack is a well respected player and is regularly amongst the best players in the B Grade trophies at the end of the year. A ruck, onballer and forward, Jack is used in a variety of positions and is a leader on the field. He has also coached at the Under 18s level.

Kriston Thompson (pictured right) plays his 50th A Grade game this week. He joined the club in 2018 from West Augusta, and previously North Adelaide where he played over 80 games. He played juniors for Willsden. Kriston has played the 2018, 2019 and 2020 A Grade Premierships. He plays in the centre and on the ball, always putting in consistent great games for the club. He has won the Fairest and Best Player in 2019 and 2020, and has assisted James Boles with a coaching role. He is a great mentor for the younger players at the club and is currently a Director with the Clontarf Foundation at Port Augusta Secondary School.

 (Please note after concerns expressed for the on-field safety / comfort of trainers / water carriers we intend to address the SGL with some proposed changes to this)
- Any viewed undergarment worn by a player is to be a bone or a similar colour approved by the Board / Executive prior to entering the playing field.
- Umpires have been asked to take particular notice of this. Any player / runner / trainer not complying will be asked to leave the playing surface until rectified.



GAZZ'S GOSSIP

In this month's newsletter Gazza concentrates on the Baker family and their involvement in the club. South Augusta is a family club, and the Baker family are just that. Allan and Rita Baker had five boys and one girl. Allan, who was employed in the railways, was working at Mambray Creek when he transferred to Port Augusta and the boys got into action by selecting South Augusta as their club. The brothers Bill, Jeff and Rodney played in the Under 18s and progressed into the seniors. Other brothers Robert and Phillip did not play for Souths and pursued other interests.

Bill Baker: Bill played from 1959 to 1972 and in those years he became one of our finest players, playing over 150 senior games and becoming a Life Member. He was a member of the 1960 -1962 B Grade premierships and a playing member of the historic 1964 A Grade premiership. One of Bill's greatest memories was playing alongside the great Jimmy Anderson. Bill has been a fantastic sponsor of the club over the years and when we auctioned off the 2012 Centenary guernseys, Bill claimed No 7 and no one else had a chance as the sky was the limit. Bill also played cricket for South, winning premierships as captain in all three grades. He also played tennis and eight ball for Souths. Later in life, he has been involved with lawn bowls and when it came to eight ball there was no way he was going to let anyone beat him. Bill worked in the railways for many years and was transferred to Port Pirie at one time, where he played for Sollies. Supporters of the club will remember Billy's Corner at the old club where anyone who sat in the corner would be showed the clenched fist.

Robert Baker: Like Bill, was a fine sportsman who played football for West Augusta together with cricket, golf and was a Life Member of the Railways Tennis Club. Robert's wife Helen is niece to Central Augusta great Ted McAuliffe.

Rita Baker: Bill's mum was a staunch South supporter who would attend games to watch her beloved sons play. When it came to the umpires, she would make her presence felt. Rita was a loyal member who was involved with the Ladies Committee, her speciality being freshly cooked home-made sponges.

Jeff Baker: Bill's brother played from 1964 to 1969 and was a ruckman, just losing the B Grade Grand Final after only oned loss for the year but making up for it in the 1965 B Grade premiership.

Rodney Baker: Bill's other brother played from 1966 to 1973 and in those years Rodney was a regular seconds player, together with games in A Grade. He was also an accomplished tennis player and cricketer.

Bev Baker: Bill's sister was the only girl in the family and was a talented netballer; and like the rest of the family was a loyal South Augusta supporter. Bev is married to former South Augusta player Peter Leader.

In closing I would like to say that South Augusta has been blessed with successful families and Bill and his family can hold their head high and deserve a place in the long history of the club.
