Gazza's GOSSIP

This month's Gary Kittel Gossip discusses the Ladies Committee of the SAFC over the early years.

When football got underway in Port Augusta just over a century ago, it was very much a man's world. The game was organised by men, controlled by men, generally watched by men and apart from the odd spectator, women were mostly not seen or heard. Today it is a vastly different story with females being on the boards of all organisations and clubs from the AFL down to the smallest football club.



At the end of each season it appears that the club held an annual dinner and a record of the proceedings for 1923 is included. It appears a very formal evening but someone had some very interesting ideas about the menu.

In 1927 it is recorded that a Social Committee existed with five members – A Hearne, J Main, O Schammer, W Knuckey and I Bolitho. About halfway through the twentieth century, help was sought by the men for women to lend a hand. This was particularly evident just after World War Two, although in 1937 a Ladies Committee did exist – Mrs G Scrivener, Mrs H Corbett, I McCartney and H T M. Luke. They held

regular dances every Thursday evening in the Parish Hall. It is also recorded that these ladies sold afternoon tea at all matches at Central Oval to raise funds for the club. The President of this committee was H T M. Luke.

Later, in the mid 1950s and early 1960s, and still working in the background but receiving due thanks, women were being asked to help with the organisation of twenty first birthdays, engagements and weddings as these were seen as very profitable events for the clubs. Player's teas became more than the old BBQ or pasty nights, so again the ladies were asked to lend a hand. They were also involved with the catering for visiting teams through lunches and dinners. Their fundraising activities were also encouraged by the males and beside running regular raffles they set up food stalls and ran the canteen at Central Oval where all league matches were played.

By the 1950s, the ladies were well organised with full committees of up to a dozen members and meticulous records of all their activities were kept. The Ladies Committee for 1960 was: J. Gallagher (President), M. Hesse (Secretary), J Moore (Treasurer), Mrs Kohler, Mrs Brandle, J Black, Mrs E Kernahan, Mrs A Clancy, Mrs Main, Mrs Ledger and Mrs Laragy (Adelaide).

The Ladies Committee for 1969 was (pictured, L-R): Ruth McInnis, Sue Kittel, Moira Fullerton, Phyl Mundy, Kath Henderson, Rona Williams and Kath Williams, who just sat inside the front door of the clubrooms with a raffle book in one hand and a menacing walking stick in the other. No one was game enough to walk past without buying at least one ticket.

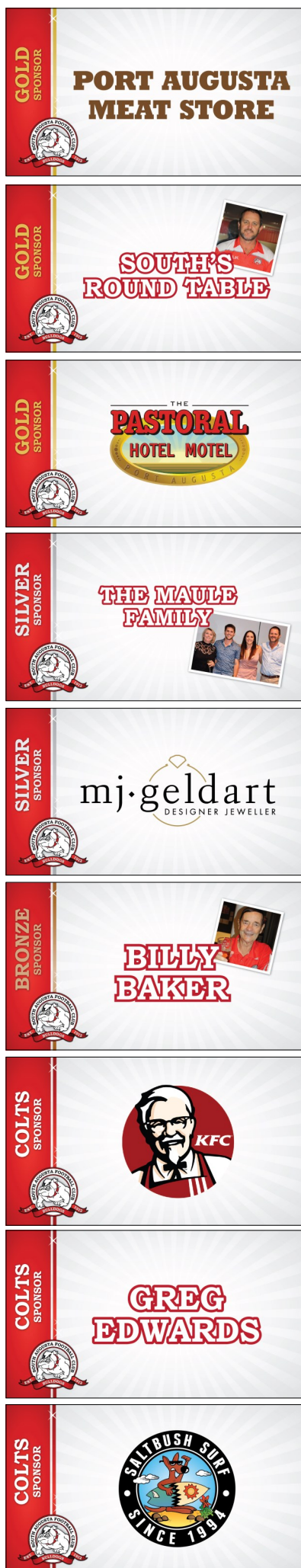
