UPDATE...Had a win in Round 3 and now sit at the top of the ladder.


PLAYER MILESTONES







PLAYER MILESTONES












Congratulations to our SAPSASA representatives - Layla Culbertson and Myah McInnis (pictured, left). They won the carnival under coach Kurt Reynolds.

Cazza's Gossip

In this Month's newsletter Gazza focuses on the Fullerton Family.

Players in the original Souths team, comprised many well-known South Augusta names of the early years and the Fullertons have been involved with the club for many years. Souths' first team in 1912 comprised of John Fullerton, father of Jack Fullerton and grandfather to Colin and Geoff Fullerton, as well as Ted Fullerton, brother to John Fullerton.

John Fullerton was also Assistant Secretary and Association games were often played in dusty conditions and on the dirt ovals. Generally crowds were around 100-200 for minor round games.

South finished up the end of the decade with another Grand Final loss in 1919, this time to Flinders 3-7 to 3-4. John Fullerton was a member of this team.

In 1928 South Augusta finally broke through for their second A grade Premiership, outstanding performances in this were Robert Fullerton and Ted Fullerton.

Jack Fullerton (pictured, right) began his football career with Souths Football Club in 1933 at the age of seventeen. That year he was third in the Mail Medal, quite an achievement for a young player.

In 1935, while still playing football for Souths he was the Secretary of the Augusta Football League.

Jack was a member of the 1938, 1939 and 1942 Premiership teams and was one of the best players in the 1941 Grand Final team. He played for the club until 1943 when employment took him away, and he played for Central Whyalla and Iron Knob over a period of six years. He returned to Port Augusta and continued with Souths for a wonderful career with the club. He represented Port Augusta many times and was Captain of the club.



As Jack's playing career came to a close, he took on an administrator's role and was on both Port Augusta and the Spencer Gulf Football League management. For many years Jack was a Vice President, Chairman of Selectors and Committeeman for Souths.

When Spencer Gulf Football was formed, Jack became the club's delegate and thus became a long involvement at league level. He was Chairman of the Selectors at both levels - Port Augusta and Spencer Gulf. From 1983 until 1987, Jack was President of the Port Augusta Football League. Remarkably Jack was involved in football, both playing and administration, for seventy years.

Jack is a Life Member of Souths and was posthumously inducted into the Port Augusta Hall of Fame in 2007.

Geoff Fullerton, his son, played in South's 1961 Seconds premiership and was a player and Life Member. He played 137 league games for Souths from 1961 to 1972, including the famous 1964 premiership. Geoff was a regular Port Augusta Football League representative player, and upon his premature retirement due to injuries, acted as club runner and selector, and also PAFL Selector.

Colin Fullerton, brother to Geoff, played most of his football in Adelaide while on leave from Flinders University. Colin played in the South's 1960 Seconds premiership (South 9-7 to Centrals 5-3). While Colin was on leave he also played in South's Senior team.

John Fullerton, brother to Geoff and Colin, played for South in the junior and senior grades and Stewart Fullerton, son of Geoff and Diane, played for South in junior grades and is a senior premiership player.

Jack Fullerton's wife Moira was a dedicated and long serving contributor to the Ladies Committee. Jack and

Moira had three daughters Brenda, Maureen and Helen - all were dedicated netball and softball players.

This story is dedicated to one of the South Augusta greatest families - the Fullerton family.

BILLY'S CORNER

Congratulations to five-time A Grade Premiership player Matt Downey and his partner (pictured, right), who recently had their first child, Layla. Matt moved to the NT after the 2020 Premiership and became a police officer. He was a huge influence on our success over the period 2016 to 2020, leading the ruck for most of that time, winning the Club's Fairest and Best in 2016 and 2017, and many Best Team Man awards. Another netballer (or AFLW footballer) coming up!





We are saddened to hear that 1983 A Grade Premiership player Chris Ramsey recently passed away in Crystal Brook. Chris was recruited from Central Whyalla in 1983, playing 19 games, and then another 7 games in 1985. He made a big impression in his first season, kicking 34 goals for the season from centre half forward and full forward, and finishing high in the Club's Fairest and Best award. He was considered one of South's best recruits and would always give 100%. His commitment to get the hard ball was legendary.

Chris was an integral part of South's success in 1983 under coach Dennis Russell, starring in the team that kicked 8.6 in the last quarter to win the Premiership against Solomontown.

Chris was a sociable person and after the game he would mix freely with both teammates and supporters. Chris transferred to Crystal Brook in 1984 as a pharmacist and continued his football career there. He opened his own pharmacy and other stores in nearby towns. The club offers its condolences to wife Anne, his family and friends at this sad time.

Richard George Oakey played for South Augusta in 1965 and 1966, becoming player-coach in 1966 before transferring to West Augusta. Richard had played 15 senior games for Norwood, making his debut in A Grade versus South Adelaide on 4th May 1963, and playing his last game in 1964. Born on 5th February 1941, he made his football debut as a West Augusta colt at the age of 12.

He worked his way quickly through the grades. After playing at Norwood, Richard answered the call of home and was Captain-Coach of South Augusta in 1965 and 1966, winning the Transcontinental Medal in 1966. In 1965 he was Vice-Captain of the SGL team. In 1966 he was appointed Captain of this team. Among his teammates were Barrie Robran and Graham Cornes. In 1967 Richard returned as Captain-Coach to West Augusta where his on-field ability and demand for discipline produced premierships in 1969, 1972 and 1973. During his stint West won premierships five years in a row, from 1968 to 1972. The club offers its condolences to Richard's family and friends at this sad time.

South finished top at the end of the minor round. The Fairest and Best player award was won by W Richardson.


