FROM THE President

Last month all clubs received a direct message from the SGL regarding on and off field behaviours. In summary "as a league we cannot continue to tolerate these incidents and behaviours involving umpires/ coaches/ players/club officials/club members/ spectators /parents. By ignoring these issues, we risk losing good people/respect and brand damage/ sponsors/revenue. The time for change is NOW." As a club we fully endorse these concerns and will continue to strive towards club improvement.

Unfortunately, we spend too much time cleaning up the mess created by some of our so-called supporters such as the disgraceful umpire abuse at Port Oval in Round 5. It will not be tolerated. Such issues can result in us losing the respect we aim for as a club as we try to achieve one of our club goals which is "aiming to be the best SGL/PAJFL club both on and off field". You are all club ambassadors so your behaviour should reflect this.

One of the responsibilities of being a SAFC person is that our behaviours both positive and negative reflect directly on the club. Please ensure your behaviour reflects the high standards we should demand from each other. If you can't please stay away from our games and do not wear our colours. We do not need your "support". I also ask that you show initiative when you see club people letting us down via a simple reminder to them of the culture/behaviours we will accept at SAFC. Alternatively report their behaviour to someone who will take the required action. I know it is a cliché but the behaviour you walk past is the behaviour you accept.

FOOTBALL UPDATE

Recent A Grade debuts include Troy Miller (Round 4) and Henry Shea (Round 5).

B Grade debuts have been made by Falesa Sc'oiala (Round 1), Jason Cullen (Round 3), Tristan Sharrock, Hudson Brazell and Ethan Mundy (both in Round 4) and Bobby Warren (Round 7). We welcome them and their families to the club.

After Round 7 the A Grade are a painful 1 win and 6 losses. The matches against the Port Pirie teams proved that we can match them for 3 quarters but cannot sustain the pressure for the full game.

Those to feature most amongst the best players include Zech Amos, who is having a standout start to the year and showing the senior players how it's done, Ethan Gade,
Caleb Ritter and Cam Tiggemann.

The B's have been far more competitive this year and are not far off a win. Josh Niamak, Tom Clancy, David Schooling and Flynn Everett have been impressive as was Bobby Warren in his club debut. The added experience of Marcus Gill and Chris Heron has helped also.

It is hugely disappointing for our proud club but it is a reality for this age group at the moment. The improved performance against Lions and Centrals proved that the players we do have are keen to play. We thank those U18s who have put in so far this season and the many U15s who have filled in after playing their own games. We admire your dedication and resilience.

SANFL MEMO RE VILIFICATION INCIDENTS AND FUTURE SANCTIONS

The SANFL has sent this memo to all clubs....

"There have been several examples of players using inappropriate and discriminative language to other players. The SANFL strongly requests clubs that this trend doesn't continue and understand the impact such comments can have on victims. Match Review Panels (i.e. tribunals) will be taking a far stronger approach when considering penalties for such matters. Five matches will be used as a precedent for future investigations. Bans of this length will be considered given players have been made aware of their responsibilities again under the league's rules".

This initiative encourages positive reinforcement of safe driving hopefully helping to reduce the devastating road toll. There has never been a more critical time to get the road safety message out there via footy clubs to spread crucial road safety messaging to all corners of the state.

FINDINGSS FROM 2023 SA GOVERNMENT REPORT INTO VOLUNTEERING

After a good season making the Grand Final. However, in a poor form reversal they are defeated by Central 13.23 to 3.12.

Best in the Grand Final included: Stuchberry, Zanker, Polmear, Davies, Wilson, Jim Averis, Norm Brearley, Clem Matthews, Jack Marshall and D.Higginson.

A Grade Captain was Norm Brearley who also wins the Hooker Medal for the Best Player in the Association. Jack Marshall leaves town at the end of the 1944 season.



Cazza's Gossip

This month Gazza Kittel focuses on the 1965 and 1966 SGL seasons. Keep in mind that these years were in the initial stages of the new league that comprised of 12 teams with 4 from Whyalla before Whyalla decided to leave the SGL in 1966. In 1965 the A Grade captain coached by Trevor Searle finished 6th. Trevor was coach when the A Grade won the famous 1964 Premiership. President was my father Les Kittel, assisted by the Management Committee of Max Reed, Jack Fullerton, Laurie McInnis, Merv McKenzie, Harrold Bowman and Colin Chalmers. The A Grade Fairest and Best was Hall of Fame legend Bill Virgo.

In 1965 the B Grade won the Premiership after a great year with best players in this final Chris Bowley and captain Scotty Hosking. Also, in 1965 South recruited Bruce Curtis from Port Pirie and Richard Oakey from Norwood to boost its ranks. Richard Oakey and Bill Virgo represented the SGL with Bill being named best in their loss against the State Colts team. Both players made the team of the year.

In the 1966 season the club went backwards finishing 7th. The new President was Ron Rozee and new captain coach was Richard Oakey. Ron was assisted by his committee of Laurie McInnis, Frank Williams, Charlie Huddlestone, Les Harvey, Gordon (Bud) Harbridge, Ray Hanrahan, Lyle Manning (Sect) Jack Fullerton, Ray Hearse, Max Reed (Treasurer), Harrold Bowman, Colin Chalmers and Brian Fox.

In big moves Mick Vanvacas member of the 1964 A Grade Premiership left the club together with Brian Gloede and John Evans. Richard Oakey continued his good form to win the Transcontinental Medal and Kevin Matthews won the Charlie Elliot Medal. South just finished out of finals with 12 teams in the competition, after a competitive year with over ten wins recorded. If only they had Collingwood's current luck with the umpires that year!

South players to play for Port Augusta in this year included Dean Woolford (best player), Bob Bowman, Gil Schupelius, Ray Hanrahan, Bill Virgo, Bruce Curtis, Richard Oakey, Sam Moore, and Geoff Fullerton. Best in the game against Whyalla were Dean Woolford, Geoff Fullerton, Robert Bowman 4 goals, and Ray Hanrahan. The 1966 trophy winners were the A Grade Fairest and Best Trevor Searle, Runner Up Bill Virgo and the Hooker Memorial Trophy Trevor Searle. The player with the most Madigan Medal votes and Transcontinental Medal went to Richard Oakey and Most Courageous to Robert Groth. Best placed player and Fountain Memorial went to Dean Woolford, Best Follower Barry Stephenson, Best First Year player Gunther Scheide. Seconds Fairest and Best was shared by Brian Hosking and Barry Stephenson and the Thompson Memorial went to Peter Reidy.

Other trophy winners that year included the Fountain Memorial Best Placed Billy Baker, Bill Johnston Memorial and Most Consistent Graham Williams and Best Trier Bud Harbridge. The Senior Colts Fairest and Best was Kevin Matthews, Most Courageous David Williams, Best Backman and Best Placed Brian Shirley. Junior Colts the Fairest and Best was Peter Blaschek, Most Improved M. Barry, Best in Final Phillip Pidgeon, Best Team Man

Anthony Farr, Most Constructive John Fullerton and Best Utility Kym Applebee.

I hope the 1965 and 1966 S.G.L seasons has brought back some fine memories. Best of luck see you in June.


