#### Hi All

We are now a month into the season currently without registering a win in the A-Grade and U18s. Stewy and the Bs have notched a win but are unfortunately feeling the injury pain the most, as their squad is impacted by the availability of all players the most.

Round 1 was an absolute nightmare copping 4 injuries inside the first 15mins of the first quarter which resulted in 2 of the 4 ending up in hospital and another out of action for the entirety of the game. It was certainly a wake-up call to let us know footy season is here.

Unfortunately, on the injury front things didn't improve as we made a total of 13 changes from the selected Round 1 team to the team that ran out on the park in Round 4. The fact we have nearly used a full team in changes highlights the struggling start to our year.

In saying that with great opportunities, come great moments and it has been exciting to give a couple of young pups their first A Grade guernseys in Leo McInnis and Noah Kruger. 

























## AFLW WHYALLA OPEN WOMEN'S COMPETITION

#### PORT AUGUSTA FOOTBALL LEAGUE HALL OF FAME REVIVAL

Next April, the PAFL is reviving their Hall of Fame after a few years in recess. Clubs can nominate up to 3 players. It is also planned to select a Port Augusta Ruby Team from 2001-2025 with help from the coaches of the 3 clubs over these years. Daniel Dohnt (DD) 300 club games and 250 A grade games

Recently Daniel Dohnt became the 10<sup>th</sup> South Augusta player in it's history to surpass 300<sup>th</sup> club games and a week after he played 250 A Grade games. Daniel has currently played 251 A Grade games and 51 B Grade games. Daniel first played senior football for the club in 2005 after progressing through the club's junior competition and he is currently in his 21<sup>st</sup> year. In his 2<sup>nd</sup> year playing Senior football, he played in an A Grade premiership as part of the club's victory over Central Augusta under Coach Gary Kernahan in 2006, when he was named best player on the day. Daniel has also played A Grade Premierships in 2012 against Sollies under Peter Rivers and 2017 and 2020 Premierships under James Boles. Daniel also played in the 2018 B Grade Premiership

and has played several games representing the SGL.

In 2008 Daniel won the A Grade Fairest and Best for the club and has been high amongst the club's best players for most of his playing years. DD has played mainly on the ball, in the forward lines and wing but in more recent times he has been used in the backlines to great effect. Daniel has assisted the junior coaches when required and has been a great clubman. Congratulations Daniel on a magnificent career and you fully deserve the accolades you receive for achieving 300 club games and 250 A Grade games. He was named in the best players in recent games so still going strong.



#### Brett Jones 338 Club games, club record

Brett Jones has surpassed the club games record recently when he played his 338<sup>th</sup> game against West Augusta in the first round of the 2025 season. Brett passed the record held by Gary Kernahan for many years.


Brett first played senior football in 2001 after coming through Souths junior competitions. Brett's family was originally from Oodnadatta and made the move to Port Augusta to play football for the club.

He first tasted success in 2006 when he played in the 2006 A Grade Premiership under Gary Kernahan after being awarded A Grade Fairest and Best in 2004. Brett also played in B Grade Premierships in 2015,2018 and 2020 where he was amongst the

best players on the day. Brett has been high amongst the vote getters in the Madigan Medal over the years and he has also been awarded the Dyason Medal for the best player in B Grade in the League. Brett has played SGL representative during his career and has played mainly on the ball, wing and the forward line.


It is great that 2 players who both played in the 2006 A Grade Premiership in Daniel Dohnt and Brett Jones still playing for the club in 2025.

Congratulations to Tom Clancy who reached his 50 Club Games milestone in round 1. Tom has played a mixture of both A's and B's and we are looking forward to him continuing to improve with senior football and hold down a position as a key defender adding to his tally of senior games.

#### **CHRIS HERON CALLS IT A DAY**

After recent conversations it looks as though Chris Heron has played his last game at the club.

Last year's injuries, work and family commitments may not allow him to play and it's worthwhile looking back at his career at the club

Chris played 274 Senior games including 216 A and 58 B grade games. Chris played junior football at the club before playing senior football from 2002 to 2024.



Chris played in the 2006, 2012 and played in the last 2 of the "5 in a row" A Grade Premiership teams in 2019 and 2020. Chris also played in the 2015 and 2018 B Grade Premierships which meant he played in 2 B Grade Premierships and 4 A Grade Premierships.

Playing mostly on the wing forward line and on the ball during his career he was later used in the backline to great effect. A hard-hitting player he possessed plenty of speed and was great team player and a big part of premierships for the club. Chris will be missed but has sons coming through and he will be involved with their development ensuring his involvement with the club for years to come. Congratulations on a great career Chris and all the best on your retirement, always welcome to come back though!

#### **BUILD THE RIVALRY**

The Central Augusta rivalry with South's first started in 1912 when we played our first ever game against each other, Central winning on that occasion. South and Central played 100 years later in the Centenary match in 2012 when South Augusta reversed that result under Peter Rivers later to go on and win the Premiership that year

It's true Central won more Premierships in the 3-4 team Port Augusta competition from 1912 however since the SGL was formed in 1961 South have won 13 A grade Premierships and Central 8 A grade premierships. South have an equal amount of SGL Premierships with Port.

Central have taken several players from South Augusta over the years. Mick Fuller, Darryl Dadleh, Kahran Mckenzie and Darren Shillabeer all played junior and senior football at South before moving to Central and playing and winning in A grade Premierships against South. In more recent times players taken from South include A grade Premiership players Ryan Struck, Brenton Colson, Gary Warren and this year Aziel Stuart.

Those involved with 1982 A and B grade premiership losses to Central will remember that carry on in the town that year and the one- eyed hill over the years. We lost to them in Grand finals in 1982, 1991 and 2010, however we did defeat them in the 2006 Grand Final under Coach Gary Kernahan. No matter where the clubs are positioned it's always a great game and we look forward to playing them again in 2025, get along and build the rivalry!

#### **LEAGUE DEBUT - NOAH KRUGER Round 4, 2025**

We congratulate another young bulldog star who made his A Grade debut over the weekend. Noah Kruger is the grandson of Greg George who represented the club back in the late 70's and also the nephew of Simon George who also played A grade for a couple of seasons back in 2014/15. Noah's father Damien played senior football for the Quorn Wolves back in the 90's. Noah has been a standout junior for many years capable of winning games off his own boot. Well done Noah and the Kruger/George families.






#### **LEAGUE DEBUT - JESSE HOCKNEY-FORRESTER Round 2, 2025**
