SGL AGM NEWS

The 2020 SGL AGM was held on Sunday with some interesting outcomes:

- 2021 sees the continuation of the SANFL Players Registration Payment of \$15 seniors / \$10 juniors, which must be paid when registering on Sports TG for 2021. Every player at every club will have to pay this so it is basically no pay no play. This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It does NOT replace club membership.
- The 2021 DRAFT season sees SAFC playing the following:
 - ♦ 11 games at Central Oval, 1 at ETSA, 1 at Port Oval and 4 at Memorial Oval
 - ♦ Round 1 vs Ports home game on Anzac Day Eve, Saturday 24th April
 - ♦ Round 3 vs Central U15 Thursday / B Grade and U18 Friday / A Grade 5pm Saturday as part of double header, in lieu of Sunday game
 - ♦ Round 4 vs West in our one and only Sunday game
 - ♦ Round 8 vs Central at ETSA as payback for Round 3 double header, in lieu of Sunday game
 - ♦ Three of the first six games in Port Pirie. Nine of the last eleven games at home

GENERAL BUSINESS

Congratulations to new Life Member, Peter "Flogger" Flower - longstanding player / umpire / administrator.

South to move a motion at next meeting to amend By-law 28 so all players in a team that is awarded a forfeit game will be recorded as playing, so able to add one game to their season / career total which will also count towards finals qualification.

Colts Send-off Rule which was trialled in 2020 and worked well will be continued in 2021.

Last kick out of bounds rule will be reviewed for the 2021 season.

Discussion regarding 2021 Fixture confirmed that a 5-year cycle started in 2019, COVID-19 2020 was a hiccup to the cycle and thus the original 17 game 2020 fixture will become the 2021 fixture. It was great to be able to welcome Solomontown back on-field for the 2021 season.

Congratulations extended to the SGL Executive, Board, umpires, clubs, players, spectators and sponsors for managing to get COVID-19 season 2020 up and running and successfully completed. It was a huge workload to achieve this.



GAZZ'S GOSSIP

Why are South Augusta known as the Bulldogs? Why are there two Bulldog teams in the SGL? This month Gazza Kittel provides information on the origin of the Bulldog.

Don Harris who was a playing coach from 1959 to 1960 moved at a Committee meeting that the Bulldog be accepted as the club mascot. There may not have been a mascot before then. The Committee agreed to the proposal and approached Dennis Ledger to draw and design a Bulldog which was also approved. Dennis played football for Souths from 1955 to 1962 and his wife Kathleen then sewed a Bulldog onto a large white banner which was displayed on the scoreboard side of the ground on match day.

Kathleen sewed the Bulldog with a pedal pushing old Singer sewing machine, which she still possesses, and she also sewed the mascot on the club blazer in 1960.

Sadly, Dennis passed away in 1969 and the club lost a valuable member. Dennis's father Digger Ledger was at the time a club legend who made and supplied pasties and pies for Souths to be sold to supporters on match day from the South Augusta stall.

Charlie Williams, a local who owned a Bulldog, let Don Harris lead the mascot on with the team at every match at Central Oval. When the Spencer Gulf League was formed in 1961, the Bulldog name was kept and when Ports joined the League they also had a Bulldog mascot, PHOTO: (LEFT) Charlie Williams with the original Bulldog but all agreed to keep their mascots.... ours is better though!

They tag the fish and release which helps with the science. Would have loved to be a fly on the wall after the day, with some of stories!

The club recently was awarded a \$3,000 grant from the Office of Sport, Recreation and Racing for equipment and costs for the club to manage the current COVID restrictions. The club is also going through the Starclub sports governance process which helped in the successful application.

Interesting fact from the AFL season. Collingwood received the most frees, 329 for and received 255 against, which was the biggest differential in frees - 74 in the positive. Compared to Richmond, the 2020 Premier, with 314 in favour and 384 against - minus 70 in total.

Congratulations to club stalwart Vicki Fullerton who was recently awarded Life Membership of the Port Augusta Racing Club for her services to the sport. Vicki, who also organises the Club's Footy Tips, should be commended on her long service to the club and being the first female to receive this award in its 100+ year history.

FOOTBALL FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE REPORT 2020

Congratulations to the Football Club and its Committees on achieving five premierships in a row for the first time in the Club's history. In 2020 the Football Fundraising Committee had a challenging year with less games played, limiting opportunities to fundraise during the year.

There was however less expenditure this year with no player payments, coaches and trainer payments but still costs such as insurance, travel expenses, medical expenses and strapping, pewters for milestones, trophies and Grand Final celebration costs.

The Committee together with Simon Owens, Sponsorship Officer, was still able to keep most of the sponsors in 2020 through cash donations, awards and vouchers. Many thanks to those sponsors who continued to support the club and we hope they want to be part of the club in 2021.

The sponsorship numbers continue to be high. Through the displays on TV at the club, invitations to club functions, mentions in newsletter, website and the Friday night "Sponsor Minute" Simon has been in close contact with businesses to ensure they have value for money from the partnership.

The Racing Tips also raised at least \$1800 for the club in 2020 as well as one raffle organised through Colin Waterworth.

Many thanks to Vice Presidents, Sponsors and those members who have contributed through the Players Auctions and fundraising events to assisting the Football Fundraising Committee who have worked with the Management Committee to ensure that the Club has a competitive team, with the aim of winning the Grand Final and another Premiership in 2020.

Congratulations to Kean Parrington on receiving Life Membership in 2020 for his contribution to the Committee over many years.

Kean Parrington, Simon Owens, Mick Kerin, Harry Waterworth and Mark Shirley have all committed to be part of the Football Fundraising Committee in 2021 and they are always looking for new members, if you are interested in joining the team or even the Football Operations Committee who are involved with the football side of the club.
