SGL AGM NEWS

The 2021 SGL AGM will be held on Sunday:

1. 2022 sees the continuation of the SANFL Players Registration Payment of \$20 seniors / \$15 juniors which must be paid when registering on PlayHQ. Every player at every club will have to pay this so it is basically no pay, no play. This is NOT a club or SGL imposed fee. It does NOT replace club membership.
2. The 2022 **DRAFT** season sees us taking on Central Augusta on the ANZAC weekend.
3. Election of Officers: Vice President and Secretary positions will be contested.
4. GENERAL BUSINESS:
 - South to move a motion to amend By-Law 28 so all players in a team that is awarded a forfeit game will be recorded as playing, so able to add one game to their season / career total which will also count towards finals qualification.
 - South to move a motion to amend By-Law 14 regarding uniform requirements for water carriers.
 - Congratulations extended to the SGL Executive, Board, umpires, clubs, players, spectators and sponsors for managing to get through a second COVID-19 season and successfully complete it. It was a huge workload to achieve this.

For whatever reason, the AFL has chosen to change competition platforms from Sporting Pulse / Sports TG / Game Day to PlayHQ. We are attempting to get on top of this new platform so we can issue email invitations for players, volunteers and officials to register for the 2022 season. BRADLEY AMOS REMEMBERED AT CHARITY FOOTY MATCH

The Port Augusta community turned out to cheer on Souths and Emergency Services sides in a charity football match over the weekend. Supporters got to enjoy a sausage sizzle and an Auskick game along with the main event, the Bradley Amos Shield. Along with fundraising for charity, the event was held to honour the legacy and contribution the late Bradley Amos made in the Port Augusta community before tragically passing away in last May. Souths President Michael Kerin said he appreciated the high turnout despite the weather.

"It was a magnificent tribute to Bradley yesterday when we held the second annual SAFC versus Emergency Services match," he said. "Substantial funds raised will be split between Breast Cancer and Heart Foundation charities. The event will continue on each year now; the shield has space for 15 years." The Amos family said they were proud of the impact he had left on the community.



As stated above this event was a huge success. This reflected the great respect we all felt for Bradley. Many thanks to the players on both teams, those involved in the two junior curtain raisers, Lions Club for their catering and subsequent donation and our trusty volunteers who helped out on the day. Thanks also to 5UMA for their broadcast of the game and to Pika Wiya who set up a pop up COVID-19 vax clinic. Substantial donations will be made to Breast Cancer and Heart Foundation charities when finalised.

RIP TREVOR BOLITHO

Past player Trevor "Rigger" Bolitho passed away recently. Trevor played from 1961-1969 for over 100 club games and he was a member of the 1962 B Grade premiership team.

The Bolitho family has been involved with the club for over 95 years. Trevor's grandfather Lindsay played in the 1928 South Augusta A Grade premiership team and Trevor's father Frank played in 1959.

Trevor has two sons who played for Souths - David who played juniors for the club and seniors in 1986; and Damien who played from 1986-2011. A Grade Premiershp player Will Bolitho is the great grandson of Lindsay and grandson of Trevor; and his brother Harry played Under 18s this year for the club. Trevor also has grandsons playing in the juniors. The Bolitho connection is from 1925 to 2021 - a great family story and a long relationship with the club.

The club offers its condolences to the Bolitho family at this sad time.



RIP DEMETRIOS (JIM) CONTOS

South Augusta past player Demetrios (Jim) Contos, passed away peacefully on 14th October 2021, aged 87 years. Born on 31 May 1934, Jim played for Murray Bridge High School before attending Norwood High School for one year at the age of 16. He played football with Teachers College from 1951 to 1954 and then three seasons with South Augusta while teaching in Port Augusta from 1955 to 1957.

Norwood coach Haydn Bunton spotted Jim Contos while both were playing with the South Football Club in Port Augusta in 1957. North Adelaide had refused the 20-year-old Bunton a clearance to play for Norwood, but he was able to maintain match fitness by having a run with South Augusta in Sunday matches while coaching Norwood to the grand final. This was possible because the Spencer Gulf League was not affiliated with the SANFL at the time.

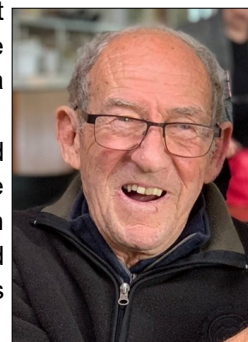
Bunton was Norwood's playing coach the following season when he recruited Contos, who played five league games until a broken wrist ended his league career. "A pity", says Norwood legend Wally Miller, "because he was a brilliant player. Jim was a beautiful player, a slightly built wingman."

Jim kicked one goal in seven games with the seconds. He also played cricket and was a very good batsman and spin bowler.

Although he was known in Port Augusta as Dimi (short for Demetrios - James in Greek), no-one in his family called him by that name and to most people he was simply 'Jim'.

While with Norwood in 1958, he taught at Enfield High School where he stayed for six years. About 1964, he resigned from teaching and moved to Murray Bridge with his wife Marie, a daughter of Port Augusta couple Theodore and Anne Struck, to take over the family building supply business. He played a short time for the Ramblers Football Club.

Jim and Marie had two children - Melissa and Jason. The couple built a brick shack near Blanche Harbour, about 20km down from Port Augusta, which they treasured for more than 45 years. Marie passed away in September 2012, aged 71. The club offers its condolences to Jimmy's family at this sad time.

Gazza's GOSSIP

In this month's newsletter Gary Kittel reports on the South Augusta Building Committee.

Gary remembers how the committee discussed the suitability of a decent social and drinking site after the game and decided that after game functions would be held out of town on Cemetery Road. South did not have a clubroom and South and Central people would converge on the land with kegs and food after the game. Tickets were purchased and handed to barmen for butchers of beer and both teams mixed well. There were no clubrooms at this stage and 6pm closing meant that players had to go somewhere for socialising after the game.

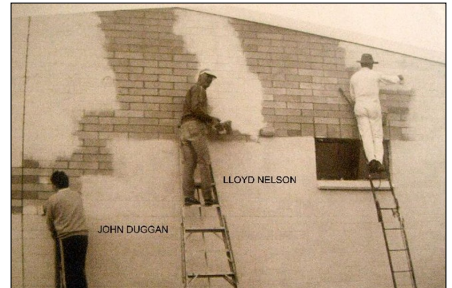
A building committee was set up to look at the vacant blocks of land around Port Augusta and obtaining quotes for building a clubroom. This committee was Peter Clarke, Ken Higginson, Bob Bishop, Les Kittel and Bill Croft. In 1958 under the guidance of President Jim Brandle the club looked at vacant blocks of land at the corner of Fern Street and Conroy Street for 130 pounds. South leased the Davenport Hall which was their first clubrooms whilst they continued to raise money for the new clubrooms. In 1962 South built their first clubrooms and in later years the Davenport Hall was sold to the Airforce Association. More recently the clubrooms in Fern St were also sold. South's new home is Central Oval complex and although a few members were concerned about this move it has been successful with five premierships in a row.

Congratulations to A Grade coach James Boles and players, Social and Football Committees, and trainers including Billie Kernahan, Mark Shillabeer and Arnie Warren for the wonderful job they have done over these years.

The C Women are currently sixth on the ladder, with one win and five losses. Kate Brusnahan is the ninth highest points scorer in this grade, with 41 points.

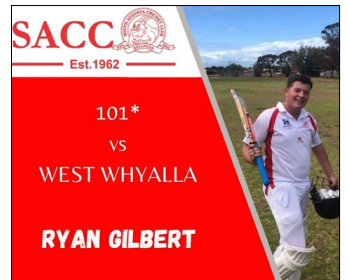
CRICKET REPORT
