Her citation reads:

The number of female players is at an all-time high and growing, thanks to Jodie. She is always accessible for girls and women to discuss their pathways and promote AFLW.

SENIOR PRESENTATIONS AND AWARDS

Kriston Thompson capped off another great year on the field by winning his fourth consecutive A Grade Fairest and Best Kittel Cup. Kriston's 4-peat passes Ron Curyer who won three in a row from 1937 to 1939. He is one behind Kevin Harris who won five5 Cups in total between 1994 and 2005.

Kriston won the A Grade trophy from runner-up Cameron Tiggemann. Kriston also took out the Most Consistent Trophy. The Best Team Man Award went to Caleb Ritter, together with the Round Table and Most Determined Trophy. Other trophies in the A Grade were awarded to Stefan Horner, Darcy Kildea, Ethan Gade (Best First Year Player) and Patrick Kennedy (Coach's Trophy). Trent Ritter and Jamahl McKenzie were joint winners of the Shillabeer Leading Goalkicking Trophy.

In the B Grade, the Best and Fairest Waterworth Cup was won by Connor McMillan, with runner-up going to Shaun Kemp. Others to win trophies included Jack Menzies, Jake Westwood, Declan Franks, Lionel Stewart and Connor McMillan who also won Most Valuable Trophy.

In the Under 18s, the Rodney Lamshed Memorial Best and Fairest Trophy was won by Heath Green from runner-up Tyson Darley. Other trophies went to Lenny Hoffmann, Hudson Brazell, Jakeem Cox, Dalton Gade, Eddie Hannes and Vaughan Yates. Heath Green also won the Best Team Man Trophy.

The Chalmers Family Club Person of the Year awards went to joint winners Ian Brazell and Jeffrey Shillabeer Jnr for their services to the club as volunteers over the last 12 months. Presentations were made to Jacqui Ritter, Ashlee Lee and Nicole McInnis as hardworking trainers. The Patron's Trophy was awarded to Trent Ritter for his behind the scenes contribution to the club off the field in 2022. Life Memberships were awarded to Wendy Black, Jake Collins and Tricia Waterworth for their long service to the club both on and off the field for many years.

Gazza's GOSSIP

This month's newsletter concentrates on Haydn Bunton, one of the greatest players and coaches to have been involved with football in WA and SA, and who played for South Augusta in 1957 when he stood down a season awaiting a clearance from North Adelaide to Norwood. He played for North Adelaide, South Adelaide and played in Western Australia.

He was a champion footballer who played for South Augusta while coaching Norwood in 1957. Bunton was regarded as a tough and skilful player and was a very successful coach in both the WAFL and SANFL. He was named an All-Australian player at the age of 19 in 1956. In the same year, Bunton finished runner-up for the Magarey Medal.

Haydn played for North Adelaide from 1945 to 1956, joining Souths in 1957. Some members say this was the start of his career! He played at Norwood 1958-1960, 1965-67, 1968-1970; Subiaco, 11 games for both WA and SA. In 1957 South lost the Grand Final to Central (18.18 to 13.10) with best players in the final Haydn Bunton, Dimi Contos, Ian Sasche, Paddy O'Keefe, Ray Hesse, Vin Jackson. Bunton, coach of Norwood in 1957 played football for South in the last three minor round games so that he could qualify for the finals.

In 1965-67, Bunton returned to Norwood, bringing his total number of games for the club to 97. After retiring as a player, Bunton coached Subiaco (WAFL) from 1968 to 1972; South Adelaide (SANFL) from 1975-1982; returned to Subiaco in 1984-89, including Premierships in 1986 and 1988; and Sturt (SANFL) in 1992-1994.

Haydn was an All-Australian player, Premiership Coach, SA Hall of Fame, WA Hall of Fame, AFL Hall of Fame, Swan District Team of the Year, Subiaco Team of the Year, Sandover Medal winner and one of the greats that played for South Augusta.

Neil (ex-Appila and then Jamestown/Appila) played for the club from 1975 to 1978, playing a total of 46 A Grade games. It almost paid off when South were beaten in the 1975 Grand Final.

Neil made an impression as soon as he arrived, playing as ruck rover. He had a prodigious kick and long stride. He was described as having the longest kick in the competition.

Neil represented the Spencer Gulf League for several games when it was very strong. He lived in Appila, near Jamestown, at the time and travelled to and from Port Augusta for games and training.

He now lives in Toowoomba (Qld) and was travelling through on holidays when he decided to attend the function.

She then headed to the United States to play for Boston College before returning home for a second season with the Lightning in 2020. Her football debut was against GWS.

A MESSAGE FROM SANFL

South Australia is a heartland of football participation. It has 7% of Australia's population but has 13% of Australian Football participants. This reflects community clubs (like SAFC) working to promote and develop the game. They often have supportive partnerships with netball / basketball / cricket clubs etc. They also support a range of charities, foundations and community causes (SAFC certainly ticks this box). Participation in football as a player, volunteer or active member provides an important outlet for physical and mental relaxation and contributes to social inclusion. Economic contribution and participation in the game has been substantially impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic since March 2020. Throughout 2020, 2021 and 2022 there have been match and event cancellations, restrictions on movement, reduced crowd numbers and people testing positive to COVID, affecting participant and volunteer numbers.
