Changes in points calculation for 2020/21

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

- MICK COREY -

Mick Corey came through South Augusta juniors. His father Keith was heavily involved with the Colts League, having being awarded Life Membership of it.

Mick played in the 1977 Under 18s Premiership before playing senior football in the 1978 and 1979 B Grade sides at full forward. He was then taken under the guidance of John Reid in 1980 and played in the 1981 A Grade Premiership. Mick was later to play games in Adelaide for Woodville, before returning to Port Augusta and eventually moving to Willsden. There he played in their 1986 A Grade Premiership under ex-South champion rover Chris Struck. Mick was an excellent forward and was known as "Mr Gadget" for his long arms which, when stretched out, made it hard for defenders to spoil.

Mick now lives in Darwin and has children and grandchildren. He is still working as an engine driver, travelling to Port Augusta on occasions.

Mick played a bit of Masters Football after he retired but now plays golf. Fishing is a pastime, together with travelling with wife Kerry who is the aunty of Mark Horner, current trainer and A Grade Premiership player.

Hopefully Mick can make the 1981 40 year A Grade Premiership reunion to be held in 2021, with a date yet to be decided until the full program is released.

PRESENTATION NIGHT AWARDS

In the B Grade, the Best and Fairest (Waterworth Cup) was won by Dylan Barnett, with Runner-up going to Tyrone Waye. LIFE MEMBERSHIP RECIPIENTS:

Kean Parrington

Records indicate that Kean has served the club since 2005 - 16 years of service to the club. Kean first joined the Football Committee in 2005 and for the past 16 years he has been involved with recruitment of players to the club, player retention, player contracts and payments. Kean has also been involved with fundraising for the club which has included sponsorships and organising the Vice Presidents Club each year.

Between 2009 and 2015, for 7 years, Kean was also involved with the Management Committee which involved the operation of the club both on and off the field and extra time as volunteer.

His work on the Committees involved bringing live acts, bands and the like to the club that assisted the club financially, and helped with the retention and recruitment of players.

Since 2005 Kean has been involved with the club winning at least eight A Grade Premierships during his time on the Committee and he has been integral to the club's success.

Peter Rivers

Recruited from West Torrens, Peter started playing in 1975 for Souths and finished in 1990, including a small stint with Willsden. He won the Club's Best and Fairest in 1987. He started coaching the juniors from 1985 and finished with B grade in 1992 having coached two B Grade premierships and 8 years involvement in that stint.

He returned to coaching in 1995 with the juniors and then went on to A Grade coaching, winning a Premiership in 2000. Peter then retired from coaching until 2012 when he returned to coach the A Grade premiership team to a famous premiership in our centenary year.

Peter then went on in 2013 before retiring again that year. Peter also served on the Management Committee for one year and is the father of A Grade premiership players Jess and Jared Rivers, with Jared also going on to play 194 AFL games with Melbourne and Geelong. Peter has had at least 25 years involvement in the Club as a player and coach.

Billie Kernahan

Billie has been part of the South Augusta community for many years as a Trainer and has been part of at least six A Grade premierships and several B Grade premierships, together with being a great supporter for the club over this time. Billie has always been reliable and helpful to other trainers in the football department and has always encouraged her friends to come to the club every Friday night where she has great success with the Friday night draws.

Billie has been a long serving volunteer for the club and thoroughly deserves the Life Membership awarded to her.

Before Will Bolitho's football accident, Gary Kittel profiled the Bolitho family and with the fundraising so important now for the family, we thought we would include this information as part of the Bulldog Bulletin.

Did you know that the Bolitho family has been involved with the club for over 95 years? Lindsay and Jeff Bolitho (brothers), played in the 1928 South Augusta A Grade premiership team and started playing in 1925. Lindsay was father to Frank Bolitho, who played in 1959; and Frank's son Trevor played from 1961 to 1969, being a member of the 1962 B Grade premiership team.

Trevor has two sons who played for Souths - David who played juniors for the club and seniors in 1986 and then other brother Damien played from 1986 to 2011, with 184 senior games, playing in a B Grade premiership in 1990 and coaching South seconds for several years.

Will Bolitho is the great grandson of Lindsay and grandson of Trevor. To continue with the tradition, Matthew (son of Sam and a great grandson of Lindsay) played Under 11s this year and is going well.

Matthew is also the grandson of Eric Poole who played for Souths in the late 1950's. Trevor's daughter Megan and Marsha both have children playing in the junior colts. The Bolitho connection is from 1925 to 2020 - a great family story and long relationship with the club.
