FAREWELL SAFC LEGEND JAMES BOLES

After eight seasons we bid farewell to 5-peat A Grade Premiership coach James Boles who has decided it is time to move on.

There were a few surprised people when James was announced as our new 2016 A Grade coach. After eight seasons, five A Grade Premierships followed by two Preliminary Finals, the proof is on the clubroom walls. Thank you James for the huge impact you have had at SAFC and the historic legacy you leave behind you. It has been a magnificent ride and the envy of nearly every other football club in South Australia.

The well-deserved standing ovation after his announcement at our Presentation Night was due recognition of his place in our proud history (see pictures next page, and we hope you enjoy the memories as much as we enjoyed creating them).

JAMES BOLES - THANK YOU! and THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

James Boles has officially retired as our A Grade coach after 8 years and five consecutive A Grade Premierships at the helm. James made the announcement at our recent Presentation Night. In his parting speech James thanked the players, trainers and game day officials who have been part of his coaching journey with special mention to Kean Parrington, Anthony "Buck" Everett and members of the Football Committee. He also thanked joint Captains Darcy Kildea and Caleb Ritter who had been with him all the way through, both playing in the 5-peat of Premierships and providing leadership both on and off field. He also thanked Kriston Thompson who had been of great assistance since transferring to South Augusta in 2018.

From when he started playing senior football in 1976, James became a household name in the SGL and country football generally.

He was always a Willsden player, playing 411 SGL games, a current record. The long serving captain won Transcontinental Medals in 1982, 1983 and 1990; and a Madigan Medal in 1982. He was a State Country player five times and was selected in the All Australian Country team once, and twice selected as SA's best player.

He coached Willsden in 1982 and also coached Central Augusta for a short period before a break. He then assisted our previous A Grade coach (Cameron Redden) before taking on our A Grade team in 2016.

South had players who had progressed from its junior colts, and recruits Darcy Kildea, Matt Downey, Vinny Urbancic, Brendan Colson, Daniel Roach and Tom Hamilton provided much needed skills and experience to the team. In later years, Kriston Thompson was to be added to the list of recruits. Amongst these recruits were Madigan Medallists and Fairest and Bests that provided support to the younger players.

James' secret to success as coach was a game plan which included using players with pace, accountability, playing on at all costs, and supporting each other on the field. He lost an average of 4-6 A Grade players each year but still managed to keep the team in the Top 3 for 7 years straight from 2016 to 2022. He wasn't scared of trying new players from U15 and U18 teams if they fitted into his game plan, and gave them responsibility, rotating them off the bench on a regular basis. He encouraged leadership skills of his senior players, asking their opinions, enabling them to take training and talking to groups at breaks during games.

James was proud of all of the A Grade Premierships from 2016 to 2020, however he has a soft spot for the 2020 one against Proprietary/Risdon, where we were behind by 33 points in the middle of the second quarter and turned it around to win the game convincingly by 42 points...an amazing 75 points turnaround against the second best team!! All Grand Finals were won well with the smallest winning margin 24 points and the undefeated 2018 team setting club records.

In his speech James admitted he wasn't everyone's cup of tea but always had the team at heart and was determined to instil a winning attitude amongst his players.

James received a standing ovation by the crowd at the end of his speech. Congratulations James on a coaching career which is the best in SAFC history.



Gazza's Gossip

This month Gazza Kittel focuses on South Augusta's reliable footballer in David Williams who was born in Quorn and moved to Port Augusta as a young lad. His father Sid played for South. Sid was a former Mail Medallist while playing at Quorn and David followed in his footsteps. He began high school in 1962 and played U15 football for South that year, winning the Grand Final. David won the medal for Best and Fairest. His brother Peter won the medal for Fairest and Best in U17 the same year, David's first year in A Grade. He played some seconds in 1967. His last season of senior football was in 1978, after 212 league games. He represented Port Augusta in combined games six times.

Following his playing days, he coached South U12, U13 and U14 grades from 1982 until 1991. David was Secretary of the Port Augusta Colts League from 1992 over a period of twenty years. David was on South Augusta Colts Committee from 1986 until a few years ago, and has been President, Secretary and Treasurer of it for a good part of his time there. On top of this, David has always been available to assist the club with social functions and fundraising events.

In 2006, he was inducted into the Port Augusta League Hall of Fame. In 2023, David was inducted into South Augusta Hall of Fame as a Legend.

David Williams has been a great player and club person over several decades. His mother (Roma) served on the ladies committee for a number of years. Other contributions to the club came from David's brothers Graeme, Peter and Neville. All these boys played for South and gave many years service to the club.
