FOOTBALL REPORT

After the first loss to Lions in the first final, the A Grade team came back well last weekend with an excellent win against Ports. Injuries in the last two weeks to Billy-Jo Russell and Will Bolitho have been setbacks to the team and we wish the lads well with their recovery. The team will aim to win it for these players, who have been part of the club through the juniors.

Best players in the finals so far include Kriston Thompson, Matt Downey, Darcy Kildea, Gary Warren, Caleb Ritter, Kyle Aitken and Craig Shirley with Clayton Milera around the goals. The form of Chris Heron in the first final was excellent.

The B Grade also play in the Grand Final this weekend and are after another Premiership to match others in recent years. Players to look out for include Dylan Barnett, Byron Taylor, Stuart Beaton, Marcus Gill and some of the younger players who are making an impression.

The Under 18s went down in the Preliminary Final - this was a great effort and they were competitive in the finals. Best players this year include Lenny Hoffman, Ethan Gade, Rex Waterworth and Ethan Reid. Ethan Reid (6 votes) and Ethan Gade (5 votes) were the best of the South Augusta votegetters in the Bishop Medal results, which was won by Bailey Congdon (14 votes).

The Under 15s lost in the first final against West Augusta by 6 goals, but had a good season with quite a few players gaining extra confidence over the past year, including Tyson Darley, Hudson Brazell, Maci Wilsdon and Beau Renshaw with Tyson Darley leading the way in the goalkicking as well. Annalise Digance also had a good season; and Tyson Darley and Eddie Hannes were selected in the Under 15s SGL side which was a great achievement. The Under 13s who came up to play stood up when required and will gain from the experience.

The Under 13s played the Grand Final on Friday night and lost by 5 points in a great game. Ronan Coombe won the Best and Fairest award for the League and those to perform this year include Ethan Maloney, Ronan Coombe, Lewis Renshaw, Nate Munzer, Whalley Yates, Amelia De Bortoli and Coheyn Patrick.

The Under 11s had a competitive team this year and finished in top spot to win the Premiership, the first one for several years - a great achievement. Best players for the year include Zech Amos, Nate Lukich, Leo McInnis, James Heritage, Eddy Heron, Tait Digance and Addyson Di Paolo.

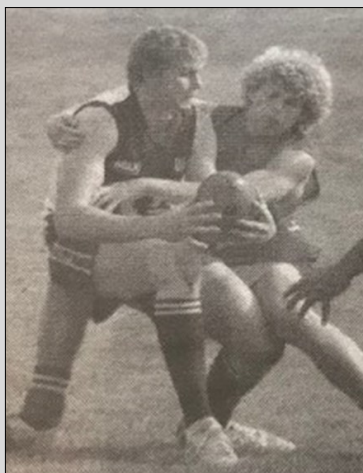
PLAYER MILESTONES

Congratulations to South Augusta veteran Daniel Dohnt (aka DD) on achieving 200 SGL games recently (197 A Grade for South Augusta plus 3 Combined games). Daniel is a product of our junior development program and made his senior debut in 2005. He played in the A Grade Premierships in 2006, 2012 and 2017; and the B Grade Premiership in 2018. He was awarded Best on Ground in the 2006 A Grade Premiership win and was the club's A Grade Fairest and Best in 2008. Daniel played three SGL games and has won the Anzac Day medal in recent years. He has also assisted the Junior Colts coaches for several years and is a great clubman.

Daniel didn't look like making the milestone a few years ago as he had played B Grade in recent years. However he has broken through to A Grade performing at the standard we knew he could play, and is making a great contribution to A Grade this year.

KRISTON WINS TRANSCONTINENTAL MEDAL

Kriston Thompson added another accolade to his career after being named the best Port Augusta player in the Spencer Gulf Football League. "It's a good feeling I suppose," a humble Thompson said.

"I'm fortunate to play in a strong team and to play my part each week."

In a strange COVID-19 restricted season, it was anyone's guess who would finish on top of the medal count.

With one round to go, Thompson was just two points shy of Port's Adam Coe and PropRisdon's Luke Edwards. Thompson picked up two more points in the final round of the season where he polled best on ground and snagged a goal. But it wasn't enough to top Edwards, who took home the 2020 honours.



Thompson finished equal runner-up, trailed by West Augusta's Nick Collins and teammate Lawrence Bradley-Brown.

Kriston first played for Souths in 2018 when he lined up for 16 games with the Bulldogs and played an integral role in their premiership wins in both 2018 and 2019.

Thompson was also selected in the Country SA team last year, but was unfortunately ruled out with a sprained hand.

Congratulations also to Jaylon Wingfield who plays his 100th senior game this week, having played 88 A Grade games and 11 in B Grade. He is a product of South Augusta juniors, and has played A Grade Premierships in 2016 and 2019. Jaylon has played either on the ball or in the backlines over his career.

Jaylon is a mentor to the younger players and has performed consistently well in the finals.

Will was flown to Adelaide on Saturday evening and underwent surgery Sunday afternoon. The injury sustained will have him out of action for awhile and he will have a long road to recovery. Information received from his family indicated the surgery went well and in fact Will was standing up and took a few steps on Monday morning.

As you can appreciate, Will and his family are working through this trying time, but his extended South family are putting in place a few things in the interim and beyond to assist them.

PREMIERSHIP REUNIONS WELL SUPPORTED

The Premiership reunions held at the South Augusta Football club recently went well with several of the team members meeting to remember the big games. It was great to see sixteen of the 2000 A Grade Premiership team turn up together with coach, Peter Rivers.

It was great to see six of the 1960 B Grade squad come along, that is only 60 years on! Together with members from the 1970 Under 18s Premiership team, 1980 B Grade and 1990 B Grade teams, there were several who travelled many kilometres to attend. Everyone enjoyed the day - well done to Anthony "Hey Hey" Anno and Jak Waterworth, who helped organise the get-together.

1960 B Grade Premiership player, Brian "Joe" Masters, had an interesting story about when he played. Brian wasn't sure why he was in the team as he had played A Grade for most of the years he played. In fact, Brian made the Port Augusta A Grade squad in 1959, the same year the best intertown game between the two towns was ever played, resulting in a draw (26.11 to 25.17). Brian applied for a clearance to West Augusta in 1961 for a change but was declined for several years. He decided to take up goal umpiring for several years only to be involved as goal umpire in the 1964 Grand Final win by South Augusta against Ports. We are lucky Joe called truly when several Ports shots went haywire in the last quarter after being declined the clearances!

BREAKTHROUGH FOR MENTAL HEALTH

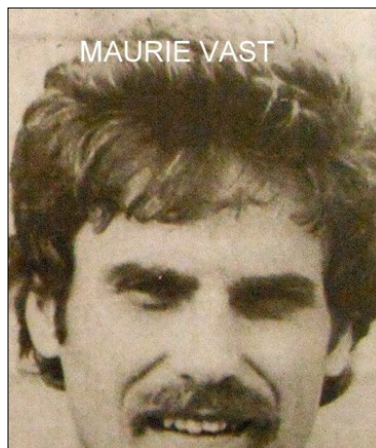
