





Cazza's Gossip

This month's newsletter concentrates focus on Darryl Fullerton who was born on 4th November 1947 and passed away on the 9th November 2005, on a Melbourne Cup Day. Darryl's parents were Ivor and Joan Fullerton and he played football for Central Augusta in his junior and Seconds years, but cycling was his sport.

Darryl (nicknamed "Fully") represented South Australia in the Under 18s State Championships in the pursuit cycling team with locals in Jimmy Waterman and John Perry. They did extremely well, being boys from the bush.

Training sessions included travelling to Whyalla for training in the Whyalla velodrome and also training and competing against the Port Pirie boys. Fully was a clerk in the Commonwealth Railways in the Mechanical branch and his father was a bookmaker and travelled all over the state. Occasionally Darryl helped his father as a bookmaker's clerk but Darryl's most important part of his life was when he courted Vicki Shields and married in 1967.

They had three children - Angela, Bronwyn and Megan and two grandchildren, Jed and Lucy Waterworth. The Fullerton family, Ivor and Sam were partners in the Port Augusta Bus Service for 54 years and they sponsored Souths, together with Centrals and the SGL. The SGL at the time consisted of Port Augusta, Whyalla and Port Pirie football clubs and many stories can be told about these trips to the matches.

South's arrangement with the Port Augusta Bus Service was that Souths would pay the driver's wages and the bus service would donate the other costs in the travel to Whyalla and Pirie, and the end of year football trips were also donated by the bus service. Darryl obtained his bus license and drove for his parents, then resigned from the Railways and became a permanent bus driver, also training other bus drivers.

In 1972 Darryl and Vicky became part owners of the business and the three girls were involved with cleaning buses on the weekends, ready for the ETSA and town runs. He was a staunch Southy, knocking off work then heading to the old club for a beer or two - he would be happy with the new complex at Central Oval as it was not as far to walk.

On many Friday and Sunday nights Darryl and Vicky would walk Bill Baker home after a session at the club. Darryl enjoyed Sunday morning regular sessions with members, the likes of Don and Gloria Escott, Cynthia and

Bill Dedman, Bert and Marg Skinn, and he had a passion for this football club.

Other members he enjoyed a quiet beer with were close friends Ken Higginson, Les and Sue Kittel, Les Whyte and many more. He enjoyed playing cards, 8-ball and darts; and Darryl and Vicki ran the footy tips, raising finances for the club. They are both Life Members of the Port Augusta Racing club and Darryl served a number of years as Patron and Chairman and Committee person. Vicki was a dedicated and long serving contributor to the Ladies Committee and both Darryl and Vicki were also energetic fundraisers for the Port Augusta Racing Club.

This story is about Darryl Fullerton, a passionate sportsperson and a great family man and a friend to all, good reading.

A historic club moment was captured recently when seven of our Premiership captains were at the club at the same time.
